Eat This Book!

Time for something from the past. The SCA past, not the historical past! This, and next month's column, are two books from the SCA olden days. When those of us who love to cook and feed people first started cooking medieval feasts we had very little in primary source information. Even the secondary sources were few and far between. We did however have a few books to pull from. "To The King's Taste Richard II's book of feasts and recipes adapted for modern cooking" by Lorna J. Sass, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, 1975. While we have come a long way in terms of food history research this book is still one you will want to have in your collection, especially if you are like me and need all the books! "To The King's Taste", as the subtitle says are recipes that Richard II would have enjoyed at his table. All the recipes are from "The Forme of Curye" or as Sass translates it "the Manner of Cookery". In the Introduction of the book she says it was "one of the earliest extant collections of manuscript recipes in Middle English". Eat This Book has reviewed other books based on this manuscript that "was written about 1390 at the request of King Richard II".

Forme of Curye includes over 190 recipes. "To the King's Taste" takes 40 of these recipes and redacts them for a "modern", circa 1975, kitchen and table. These 40 recipes give a really good overview of those included in "The Forme of Curye". "To The King's Taste" is divided into several sections. The preface and introduction are filled with lots of historical food information from the time period. Sass speaks of the preparation techniques used to create these fabulous feasts and the ingredients used in them. She illustrated the splendor and enormity of the feasts by using menus and provision lists. "For the great feast on September 23rd, 1387, given by the Duke of Lancaster" the list includes 14 salted oxen, 120 sheep, 140 pigs, 210 geese and many, other just as numerous items. The introduction also has sections which speaks to the use of "Herbs, Flowers, and Vegetables", "Spices" and "Wines and Other Drinks". The


recipe section makes up the bulk of the book and is divided into six sections with a total of 40 recipes. The sections are sorted into the courses of a modern meal, which is not the way they are arranged in the original manuscript. The "Appetizers" section has 7 redacted recipes including Tarts, mussels in broth and soup. In "Entrees" you will find 10 recipes such as fish in sweet and sour sauce, stuffed goose, and venison stew. Within the 6 dishes in the section titled "Side Dishes" we are treated to meatballs, mushrooms and leeks, and a salad. The five recipes for "Sauces" are meant to be served with roast meat. The sauces include a black sauce with chicken livers, a spicy, vinegar-based sauce called "Galyntyne", the ubiquitous "Camalyn" sauce. A rose hip, wine and almond "Sarzyne" sauce, and a piquant "pepper sauce for veal and venison". Fruits and flowers are upfront in the 7 "Dessert" recipes in the next section. Finally, the 5 recipes in the "Miscellaneous" section include bread, almond milk, a "pickled relish of fruits and vegetables" called "Compost", a "spiced gruel" and "Ypocras" which is a spiced with cinnamon, ginger, spikenard, galingale, cloves, long pepper, nutmeg, and cardamom. Besides the delicious feast recipes included in "The Forme of Curye" there are also many substiles included in the text. These recipes are often called illusion food, foods that look like something that they are not. Sass describes a castle made of biscuits and sweet treats, a snow scape from whipped cream with Rosemary trees, and "colored marzipan to depict guests being honored at the feast."

While Sass' recipes are early redactions and we have learned so much since it was published in 1975, they are pretty close to what we would redact today. The spices could be a bit

stronger, but this is easily rectified and the original recipes do not have amounts so perhaps they were used as sparingly as these redactions direct. I think the 1975 palate was just not ready for these flavor combinations so she went easy on the spicing. The most important part of the recipe section is that each of the 40 include the original Middle English, Sass' "translation", plus the redaction so you can go back and check the redaction with the original recipe. Each section of the book includes a small section of notes for your reference.

Below you will find my own redaction for a Pork and Chicken Tart below. Lorna Sass' redaction can be found on page 54 and 55. It is a solid redaction, but I have added more spices, more eggs and encased it in pastry, as most recipes from this time period call for, instead of just a bottom crust. Enjoy!

Walking in the Weeds

Little stars, so cute!

Often overlooked and stepped on, popping up around the edges of the intentionally planted garden specimens. Chickweed got its name because it was fed to poultry as fodder. They love it. It forms a dense mat of fleshy, weak stems that creep along the ground.

The 1/8- 1/4 inch, white flowers are deeply clefted. At first glance they look like they have 10 petals, but there are only five. There is another defining characteristic. Chickweed has a little line of hairs running down its stem (like a mohawk). The position of this hairline changes to the opposite side of the stem at the next node juncture.

The leaves are oval shaped with a

point at the end. They appear opposite each other and are bright green. The edible parts are the seedpods, flowers, leaves and stems. Be aware of the Scarlet Pimpernel as it is a poisonous look alike. It has purple and orange flowers, but the leaf shape and look of the plant is very similar. Even though it is naturalized here

in America, it originally was indigenous to Europe and North Africa. It likes sunshine and plenty of moisture. It is often found in disturbed soils.

Let's Eat. This plant is great raw in salads, or as the crunchy layer in a sandwich. It can be dried and used as a tea, but fresh is best. Put in soup as a potherb. The top 8 inches are the most tender. It is one of the very first green plants available in the early spring, often relieving the "hunger gap" when other greens are not available yet. It is valued for its high content of vitamins A, B complex, C, D, and minerals calcium, iron, magnesium, potassium, and zinc.

Medicinal historical uses Nicholas Culpeper (1653), talks about the use of

chickweed as a cooling poultice in his Complete Herbal & English Physician. It is great for hot, itchy rashes such as eczema and hives, and acne. Chickweed tea has been used to treat constipation and inflammation. It has been used as a remedy for arthritis. It is a blood purifier and has been used as a detoxifier.

The ancient Greeks and Romans used it as a treatment for eye and ear infections. The Greek physician Pedanius Dioscorides mentions it in his work De Materia Medica for eye issues and ear aches as documented in the 1st century. The Egyptians used it for skin ailments. The Chippewa and Cherokee used chickweed for eye ailments. The Iroquois made a poultice to apply to wounds. A balm can be made to use on any hot rash such as burns, sunburn or even stings and insect bites.

John Gerard said in his *Generall Historie of Plantes* (1597), "the leaves of chickweed boyled in water very soft, adding thereto some hog's grease, the powder of fenugreeke and linseed, and a few roots of marsh mallows, and stamped to the forme of cataplasme or pultesse, taketh away the swelling of the legs or any other part." In traditional Chinese medicine, chickweed was known as Yin Chai Hu, praised for its anti-inflammatory and anti-viral properties.

Tarte – Pork Pie

1 pound ground pork

1 pound chicken thighs, cut into bite sized pieces

3 eggs, beaten

1/3 cup raisins

1 tablespoon sugar

1 teaspoon fresh ginger, grated

2 tablespoons powder douce, see below

Butter

12 small prunes

Saffron, to taste

Salt, to taste

Pastry, top and bottom crust

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees.

In a large bowl mix all the ingredients, except the pastry, together.

Prepare your pastry bottom in a 9 inch, deep, pie pan. Place the thoroughly mixed ingredients into the pie pan and cover with pastry. Crimp the top and cut slits in the pastry top for venting the steam.

Cook until the internal temperature of the tart reaches 165 degrees Fahrenheit.

Serve warm or cold. Serves 6 to 8 people.

Powder Douce

2 tablespoons ginger

2 tablespoons sugar

1.5 tablespoons cinnamon

1 teaspoon ground cloves

1 tablespoon nutmeg

1 teaspoon gajlangal

Mix together. Store in an airtight container.

She also wrote “Dinner with Tom Jones” and “Christmas Feasts from History”. She has lectured and taught workshops in the history of gastronomy throughout the US. 

Why events must be published – Kingdom Law: “for an event to be considered official, event copy needs to be published in the Crier at minimum once in the issue of the month in which the event occurs.” An event must be official if Royals are present (this includes branch Coronets) so that any business conducted in Court can be recorded and published. All Branches in An Tir must have at least one official event per year in the Crier to maintain their status. All event copy should be sent to CrierEditor@antir.org and needs to follow a specific format, please ask for a copy of the format if you do not already have one.

Remember: The deadline is the first of the month PRIOR to your event!




