

CRIER EDITOR POSITION OPEN:

The Crier Editor is a deputy to the Kingdom Chroniclers office and is responsible for publishing the Kingdom newsletter, the Crier. It is important that there be a deputy in this role - the Crier being late to Society is not an option! So if the Editor cannot publish, the Chronicler can cover for them, but only if there is two-deep.

The skills needed for this job are:

Ability to meet a deadline. The Crier is published monthly by the Society and this must be done on time, every time without fail.

Ability to use word processing equipment the Crier is currently formatted in MS Publisher, however we need to establish a new program as MS is discontinuing MSPub support.

Access to email, Facebook and Discord. Especially near the end of the month checking email every day - and multiple times a day - is very important as the Crown and Kingdom officers may have last minute additions that must be published.

Skill at layout and design - some things must be in the Crier, and some things are at the editors discretion. You have a bit of leeway for creative content that showcases the brilliance of An Tir.

This job has NO travel requirements. The Kingdom Chronicler must attend Kingdom events, but the Crier Editor is a deputy and does not have to. There is also no equipment to manage, this office is 100% online with it's own Kingdom account. You will need a computer.

The Crier Editors job is one of the most important and visible in the Kingdom - publishing the Kingdom newsletter is a big responsibility with great satisfaction in having your work in front of the entire known world. Sound like something you'd like to do? Email chronicler@antir.org and lets chat.

ANNOUNCEMENT!



We have exciting news! The role of Royal Largesse Coordinator has officially been transitioned from a Retinue Position to a Kingdom level Lesser Officer under the Chancellery of the Exchequer (this branch handles financial matters, and Kingdom inventory and assets) and has been officially renamed the Kingdom Largesse Coordinator.

What does this change mean? More continuity with each term lasting 2 years instead of changing out every 6 months with each reign, more room to grow over time, set procedures, consistent and up to date guidance for the populace on a website devoted solely to largesse information and resources (in the works - launch date undetermined), and hopefully a more streamlined process for largesse creation, donation, and exchange around An Tir at all levels of our Kingdom.

With these goals in mind, we want your input! Please email Kingdom.Largesse@antir.org in regards to any of the following queries, all responses will be kept confidential when requested.

- If you have HANDLED or are currently handling largesse at the Baronial, Principality, or Kingdom level, we'd love to have your feedback on what would have made/would make your job easier. What challenges did/do you face? What has worked really well or received a positive response? What would you like to see changed? How can the Kingdom help you do your job easier? We want to support you!
- If you have RECEIVED largesse in the past as either an individual, an Event Steward, or a sitting/landed personage, what were your favorite things? What was most useful? What was least useful? What do you wish you received more of? What do you wish you received less of even if it was technically a good item?

Moving forward - The largesse deputies currently in place will be staying on provisionally to help ease the transition while we figure out the new structure and work on the changes outlined above/developed off populace response. Description of Deputy Roles

The Storage Deputy assists the Coordinator with the receiving, sorting, inventorying, donor tracking, and prepping for Royal gifting of largesse donated to the Crown. They can work independently or in person with the Coordinator to achieve these tasks.

Regional Deputies assist the Coordinator by serving as the point person for their area. They collect donations from those who don't travel and bring them to events attended by the Crown for handoff (or collect everything and arrange for another local member to courier), and relay needs/requests from the Crown to members in their region who may not use social media. Additionally, they may encourage local groups in the creation of largesse to donate to the Kingdom by running small contests or issuing challenges, arranging largesse making parties, etc.

- Toys for Kids & Teens (Period items are great but not required, stuffies are particularly popular!)
- Scribal Item's and/or Kits
- Blank Books (we love handbound but any blank book that is period-esque is great)
- Useful Items and/or Kits (ex: First Aid, Hygiene, Jewelry Repair, Water Bottle Bags/Covers, etc)
- Veils (Linen or Silk, w/wo Fillet)
- Combat Related Items
- Sewing Items and/or Kits
- Activity Kits (Pieces & instructions to make "x", etc)
- Caps (Simple Linen Coifs in particular but any type is appreciated)
- Woven Trim (No specifics Anything is great)

BASIC GUIDELINES FOR DONATION:

- Handmade is fantastic but not required, just that it's as period as possible (exceptions are in place for children's items period preferred but NOT required, period adjacent or 'thematic' is great [examples: magical creatures, a modern puzzle with jousting scene, etc.]).
- PLEASE label each of your items with your SCA Name, SCA Branch, and what the item is/can be used for. If you wish to remain anonymous, that's fine! Just include your branch and the item description. There is a basic label template available for home printing on the Largesse page on the Kingdom Website.
- ANYONE can donate largesse, in ANY quantity (Yes, even just one thing)!
- NO scented items please!
- NO perishable items please!
- NO items that can melt please! (If you are unsure, leave it in your car on a 90 degree day and see if it melts)
- If you are unsure what to donate, please reach out!
- Items we always need: Caps/Hats/Coifs; Veils; Cups; Toys/Games/Crafts/Stuffies for Children and Teens.

Notice About Submitting Event Copy

Why events must be published – Kingdom Law: "for an event to be considered official, event copy needs to be published in the Crier at minimum once in the issue of the month in which the event occurs." An event must be official if Royals are present (this includes branch Coronets) so that any business conducted in Court can be recorded and published. All Branches in An Tir must have at least one official event per year in the Crier to maintain their status. All event copy should be sent to CrierEditor@antir.org and needs to follow a specific format, please ask for a copy of the format if you do not already have one. In order for copy to be published you must email the Crier Editor. No other method ie: calendar links, forms, etc should be used - they will NOT work. Remember: The deadline is the first of the month PRIOR to your event!

Nothing will get you in the Crier except an email to the Crier Editor.

The Riderless Horse Ceremony

The Riderless Horse Ceremony was conceived and is administered by the Order of the Rose and Valorous Estate of An Tir as a memorial tribute for the Kingdom of An Tir.

The Riderless Horse ceremony is presented each year at September Crown, honoring those among us who have passed on in the previous year. There have been many horses used in this ceremony over the years, all patiently standing in court as the tassles are added to their caparison.

The caparison has been fashioned from retired pieces of Kingdom Regalia, and will continue to be added to by members of these Orders.

The first time this ceremony was presented in An Tir was at May Crown Tournament in 2005. The first Riderless Horse was Maximus, a 3-year old black Percheron gelding, owned by Duchess Angharad and Donwenna la Mareschale. Two tassles were added that first year.



In September 2025 Maximus' own tassel was added to the caparison, for he truly served his Kingdom well and faithfully and was much loved by all who knew him - as is true of everyone who is represented by a tassle upon the Riderless Horse.


An important, and until the last 40 years unexplored, part of food history has been household books and manuscripts from the mid to late Elizabethan period. These important records include all sorts of recipes from the hands of the up and coming middle class women. Along with the everyday recipes from this growing important class of people they have many recipes not included in the traditional cookbooks from the past including pickling and preserving, cheese making, distillations, perfumes, candy making, etc. Gervase Markham's "The English Housewife" Edited by Michael R. Best, McGill-Queen's University Press, 1994, softcover edition, first published in 1986 is one of these household books available for the modern reader in a softcover edition. Originally published just slightly out of our period of study in 1615 the title page of "The English Hus-wife" tells us that the book was "Printed in London by John Beale, for Roger Jackson, and are to bee sold at his shop neer the great Cunduit in Fleet-streete". The book also has a sub-title, or description, of the book which tells us it "Containing the inward and outward virtues which out to be in a complete woman; as her skill in physic, cookery, banqueting-stuff, distillation, perfumes, wool, hemp, flax, dairies, brewing, backing, and all other things belonging to a household."

In his preface to the above edition Dr. Michael R. Best lays out the contents and importance of Markham's work. He tells us, "The English Housewife is the most comprehensive, the most practical and the most readable of the many books of instruction written for women in the early seventeenth century." The book is intended for a "Large, rural household" and, as the title page description tells us "is wide-ranging in its record of the multitude of day-to-day household activities." Many of these types of household books were published during this time period Dr. Best

reminds us that "barely one in ten women of the time was literate." Perhaps these books were aspirational or used in households where a literate household manager that would convey the information to those who could not read it.

In his introduction to the book Michael Best explores four topics, the author "Gervase Markham", the intended audience, "The Housewife", his transcription and editorial comments, "This Edi-

tion" and a detailed exploration titled "Summary of Sources and Close Parallels". Gervase Markham was born in 1568 to Sir Robert Markham. In his youth he worked as a solider in the Netherlands and Ireland. He was a prolific writer with over 16 works attributed to him. Besides the work being discussed here you might want to review his 1593 book "A discourse of Horsemanship" or his much later, and last book attributed to him, "The Art of Archerie". Dr. Best tells us that,



"Gervace Markham acknowledged his debt to others when writing of his book on husbandry: I am but only a public notary who records the most true and infallible experiences of the best knowing husbands in this land". Chapter one of "The English Housewife" consists "Of the inward virtues which out to be in every housewife. And first of her general knowledges both in physic and surgery, with plain approved medicines for health of the household, als the extraction of excellent oils fit for those purposes." It discusses the Religious temperament a good housewife should have, what dress or garments she should wear her diet, and sicknesses and the cures for those sicknesses. The section on cures is comprehensive and harkens back to the importance



between food, cooking and medicine. Chapter Two is titled "Of the outward and active knowledge of the housewife: and first of her skill in cookery; as sallats of all sorts, with flesh, fish, sauces, pastry, banqueting stuff, and ordering of great feasts." It is a huge chapter with 193 recipes. In this chapter you will find a section with nine recipes for "sallets". Some of these will be recognizable to the modern cook and others not so much. "An excellent boiled sallet" is boiled spinach sautéed with butter, currants and "as much vinegar as will make it reasonable tart". Other "salad" reciptes include how to pickle and preserve vegetables and flowers. Other recipes you might want to explore in this chapter are the "Best collops and eggs", essentially bacon and eggs, "The best pancake" which is an egg-based pancake spiced with cloves,

mace, cinnamon and nutmeg. I am going to make recipe 35 on page 72 "Rice Pudding" that is make with milk, sweet cream, eggs, pepper, cloves, mace, currants, dates sage and salt. It sounds delicious. Chapter Three, "Of distillations and their virtues, and of perfuming" is well worth exploring for those interested in the harder libations of the time period. It is a small chapter with only 38 recipes. If you are interested in wine making the 38 recipes in chapter four "The ordering, preserving, and helping of all sorts of wines, and first of the choice of sweet wines" is for vou. Any good housewife from this, or really any time-period, must also be familiar with the material in Chapter Five, "Of wool, hemp, flax, and dyeing of colours, of each several substance, with all the knowledges belonging thereto." Chapter Six "Of Dairies, butter, cheese, and the necessary things belonging to that office" has 46 entries. For the brewers out there Chapter Seven "The Office of the maltster and the several secrets and knowledges belonging to the making of malt" and Chapter Nine "Of the office of the brewhouse, and the bake-house, and the necessary things belonging to the same" is a treasure trove of information. Those interested in bread should also take a look at Chapter nine with 5 of the 18 recipes specifically focused on this topic. Chapter eight "Of the excellency of oats, and the many singular virtues and uses of them in a family" is oddly inserted between these two chapters on brewing. The first half of the entries in this chapter deal with animals and oats and the second half on the virtues and preparation of oats for the family. The rest of the book consists of an Appendix from Markham's " The English Husbandman" from 1613, a "Collation" outlining differences between editions. A detailed "Notes" section for each of the chapters.

A section titled "Picture Credits" which details the 4 institutions that the almost 40 illustrations included in this edition come from. The bibliography and index are well put together and Dr. Best has included an excellent glossary that will help with references in this and other works from the time period.

Dr. Michael R. Best, taught at the University of Victoria for 37 years where he created the created the Internet Shakespeare Editions (ISE) in 1996. The ISE's "aim is to inspire a love of

Shakespeare's works by delivering open-access, peer-reviewed Shakespeare resources with the highest standards of scholarship, design, and usability." https:// https:// internetshakespeare.uvic.ca/m/ index.html
