The illuminators were particularly amused by fart jokes. They punctuated scripture with enthusiastic emissions, etching their wind into the margins of time.


Warning: Some readers may find the content offensive.

Looking for help in the Love department?


Goody Belle's got you covered! Try some of our home remedies to attract and seduce the love of your life!

Mandrake (*Mandragora*)


Visions of your sugarplum will dance in your head with a little Mandrake extract.

Love is a risk, **Inky**. But then again, so is working in ink.





"See?" Ben said hopefully, apparently back to being stubborn instead of terrified at not being able to breathe an hour earlier.






