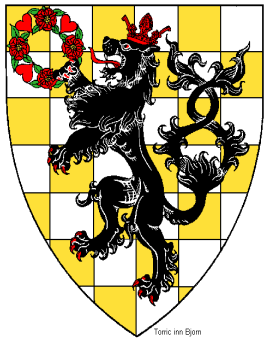

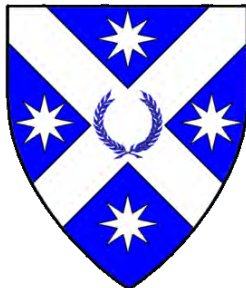

Kingdom Law Changes:

Change to Article IV.C . 2: Awards and Orders of An Tir, Awards within Principalities.
Entire section shown for consistency.

Previous Law:

2) Awards within Principalities:

- a) The Principality Coronets may bestow the following awards, on behalf of the Crown, to subjects of Their Principality. Award of Arms, Sanguine Thorn, Griffe et du Lion, L'Esperon et du Lion and Sable Pheon.
- b) The names of the Coronets shall be incorporated into the text of the scroll or charter given.
- c) he Principality Coronet shall create such awards as are needed for the recognition of the subjects of Their Principality.
- d)The Crown of An Tir grants the Principality Coronets the privilege of offering a Patent of Arms by recognizing the attainment of Viscounty rank by those who have met the requirements as outlined in Corpora.

Changed Law:

2) Awards within Principalities:

- a)The Principality Coronets, with the written permission of the Crown, may bestow Awards of Arms, on behalf of the Crown, to subjects of Their Principality.
- b) The Principality Coronets shall request permission from the Crown at the commencement of the Crown's reign.
- c) he names of the Crown shall be incorporated into the text of the scroll or charter given by the Principality Coronets.
- d) The Principality Coronet shall create such awards as are needed for the recognition of the subjects of Their Principality.
- e) The Crown of An Tir grants the Principality Coronets the privilege of offering a Patent of Arms by recognizing the attainment of Viscounty rank by those who have met the requirements as outlined in Corpora.

Walking in the Weeds

Please Pass the Mustard!

White mustard (which actually has yellow flowers), black mustard, charlock, field mustard, and leaf mustard are all in the cruciferae/brassicaceae family. Others in this group are bittercress, wintercress, scurvy grass, pepperwort, watercress, shepherds purse, pennycress, yellow and purple rocket- all for their similar peppery kick.

With a long history, it was also cultivated by the Sumerians and Egyptians. Mustards were introduced into Europe from Asia and the Mediterranean. European settlers brought it to America.

Description

Most of the plant can be consumed. This includes seeds (having the most flavor), tender new leaves, flowers and ground-up roots. *Barbarea Vulgaris*, (Native to the Pacific Northwest) plants are annual and perennial; rise to a height of 2-4 feet tall and have coarse, large leaves. It has an upright main stem with smaller, branching stems. All of the leaves clasp the stem and are hairy with irregular, sawtooth-like edges. Leaves going up the stem are gradually smaller and less lobed than the 6 inch basal leaves. This varietal's flowers are about 1/2 inch in diameter and range in color from purple, white, and more commonly bright yellow. There are many flowers growing up the stem. Each flower has 4 petals,

4 sepals, and 6 stamens on them. The round, tiny, seeds form in elongated capsules appearing after the flowers have died. When foraging for this plant, one way to tell you have the right thing is to rub the leaves in your hands. They will smell like mustard. Ground up seeds have been in use for centuries all over the world. It was cultivated in the French monasteries for use as food and medicine.

Dijon, France eventually became a major center for mustard by the 11th century. Other regions like Meaux, Norwich, Tewkesbury, Dusseldorf, Bautzen and Bavaria had become renowned for mustard production by the middle ages. The Native Americans ground up the roots of *brassica rapa*, in the mustard family, for use like horseradish sauce. Young, raw greens can add a kick of flavor to salads, while older leaves can be cooked like kale by boiling or steaming and served with butter and garlic. Because EVERYTHING is better with butter and garlic!

The Nutritional Info: Mustards are high in vitamin C and detoxifying. Ancient healers used this to expel worms and

intestinal parasites. Antibacterial and anti-inflammatory, diuretic and digestive properties are some of its benefits.



Recipe:

Roman preparation for Roasted Boar served with mustard. Adapted from *The Mustard Book* by Rosamond Man and Robin Weir. 2010, Grubstreet publishers.

5 ounces dried mustard seeds
1/2 cup red wine vinegar
3/4 cup unsweetened red grape juice
1 1/2 teaspoons coarse salt
1/4 cup flaked almonds
1 1/2 ounces pine nuts
1 teaspoon cumin seeds, finely ground

Place mustard seeds, vinegar, grape juice, salt and cumin in a ceramic

(cont. from pg 7) bowl. Mix and cover for 36 to 48 hours. Place mixture in a food processor for 1 to 2 minutes until the seeds are coarsely ground. Add almonds and pine nuts and pulse until the nuts are completely broken up, careful not to over-process. Makes 2 ½ cups. Serve with spit roast boar.

Medicinal uses:

In 1653, Nicholas Culpeper mentioned mustard in his book, *Complete Herbal & English Physician*, “outward application of a poultice for lungs and chest, joint pains and cricks in the neck, for weak stomach and toothache being chewed in the mouth.”

In traditional Chinese medicine, seeds

were used for coughs, colds, chest pains, joint numbness and abscesses.

The ancient mariners ate mustard greens to combat scurvy, a lack of vitamin C.

Hippocrates, the ancient Greek physician, used mustard in poultices to relieve muscle pain. In addition to muscle relief, poultices can be applied to the chest and left in place only until the skin reddens to help as a decongestant. It will need to be removed promptly as prolonged use can cause blisters. The steeped leaves made into tea have been used for sore throats.

Mustard seed appears in the Bible in Matthew 13:31-32 where Jesus talks about how the Kingdom of Heaven starts as the smallest seed, yet grows into a large shrub where birds nest in its branches. In the Middle East, one species (species name) of mustard grows into a shrub about 6 feet in height.

Again in Mark 9:23, He talks about the power of faith as small as a mustard seed being able to move mountains.

Eat This Book!

Over the last few years I have hesitated to recommend this book because it has not been easily available and when it was available it was very expensive, but recently it has become more available at a much better price. Check out www.AddAll.com for used copies.

“The Book of Sent Sovi Medieval recipes from Catalonia” Edited by Joan Santanach, Translated by Robin Vogelzang, 2008 Barcino-Tamesis is filled with many great recipes. I have been fascinated with this book since it was first published and have cooked many recipes from it.

“This edition is based on University of Valencia Biblioteca Historica MS 216”. It is originally thought to have contained up to 100 recipes, but the surviving manuscript from the 15th century has only 72 recipes remaining. This edition of “Sent Sovi” also includes 16 recipes from “Llibre d’aparellar de menjar” which has been “(t)aken from Biblioteca de Catalunya MS 2112”.

The editor, in Appendix II, “shows the links between the versions of recipes from the Sent Sovi tradition contained in all three compilations and (the) list of the dishes that figure in the Valencia manuscript index.” Besides “Sent Sovi the only other Catalonian cookbook from the middle ages we currently have access to is “Libre del coc (The cook’s book) of Mestre Robert”. “The

text circulated widely throughout the Middle Ages, and probably until well into the sixteenth century, yet only one manuscript has survived”. The surviving manuscript “seems to indicate that it was written in the first half of the fourteenth century” and was copied into the current form in the 15th century. There is no indication in the text of who the cook, or the scribe, who recorded the recipes might be, but the included recipes are delicious and show that whoever compiled the recipes understood food.

The introduction to the book is not an easy read, but it is worth the time and attention because of the many details about the history of the book and the connection of “Sent Sovi” to the medieval recipe corpus. Santanach tells us that Sent Sovi is “a practical text, a working tool at the service of cooks”.

The introduction is divided into several sections. The first is titled “The Dawn of Catalan Cuisine” and discusses the context in which this book and the Catalan traditional cookery existed. The second section is titled “Recipes and Recipe Books”. The third section of the introduction speaks to the “The content of the Sent Sovi”. And the final section is about “The Present Edition”.

The Book of Sent Sovi Medieval recipes from Catalonia

In the introduction to the work Dr. Santanach tells us that “(t)he influence of The Book of Sent Sovi . . . can be detected throughout the Catalan-speaking territories” both in the middle ages and in later Catalan recipe collections.

The second “chapter” is the “Translator’s note”, included on page 31 and 32. It is an excellent explanation of the how and the why, as well as specific choices Dr. Santanach, made in the translation process. It also speaks to specific culinary terms such as “picada” and “sofregit”. “Picada is a mixture of seasoning and ingredients as wide ranging as herbs, meats, bread, eggs, or nuts, traditionally ground in a mortar”.

It should be noted that usually in a modern context we use a food processor to combine ingredients such as the ones enumerated above, but a mortar and pestle makes a totally different texture. This will impact your redaction. The food processor will cut the pieces very, very small, but the mortar and pestle crushes and pulverizes the food creating a paste that is not as grainy as the food processor. “Sofregit . . . is a slow-cooked sauté of onion and other ingredients (in contemporary Catalan cooking, often pepper and tomato) until they achieve a soft consistency, and is used as the basis for any number of dishes”. Santanach goes on to say that the medieval equivalent is “without pepper or tomato, of course”.

The next part of the current edition is “Sent Sovi” itself. It starts with an index of recipes or as it is called in the manuscript “Taula de rubriques” (Table of Rubrics). Not all the recipes listed in this index are included in the manuscript thus the addition of the recipes from “Libre d’aparellar de menjar”. The index includes 91 recipe titles.

To further confuse the number of recipes in the index and the number of recipes actually included the cookbook the author says in their “Prologue” that “You should know that this book records how eighty-seven dishes are to be prepared.” We are also told in the prologue that these dishes are “made for the squires stationed with great lords and gentlemen”. After the prologue the book gets right into the recipes with the first one being “Peacock Sauce”. This very detailed and complicated sauce is made from chicken broth with the addition of salt pork. Recipe XV, page 73, is for a basic chicken broth.

The Peacock sauce also includes almond milk, diced chicken innards and rabbit hearts fried in “salt pork grease” onions, “verjuice of lemons, oranges bitter pomegranates or good vinegar”, sugar or honey, nutmeg, grains of paradise, cloves, cinnamon, ginger and

saffron. The sauce can be served with “peacocks, pheasants or capons”. The recipe section continues with many more sauces among them traditional sauces from the time period such as “Salsa Blanca” and “Salsa Caimlina” as well as some interesting ones such as “Salsa de Bolets”, a mushroom sauce and “Si Vols Fer Escabetx” a vinegar sauce for fish which continues in a slightly different form in modern Catalan cuisine. I have made the “Salsa de Bolets” several times and if you are a mushroom lover you will enjoy this recipe found on page 77. The recipe collection continues on with meat stews, three recipes for barley cream and two for oat cream which are similar to almond milk which is also included.

I am excited to try the “Aubergines” recipe on page 115. They are par-boiled and then stuffed with onion, parsley, mint marjoram, eggs, cheese, raisins, and “cooked garlic”. The stuffed eggplant is set on top of onions in a “Cassola” (casserole dish), dowsed in a mixture of almond milk, good broth, a little oil and a little grease, and cooked in the oven. The rest of the recipes in the book are equally tantalizing and I can’t wait to hear what you decide to make. After the recipe chapter the rest of this edition continues with Appendix I, the “missing” recipes from the index that are included in a different but related manuscript, Appendix II, a comparison of manuscripts as discussed above, and a detailed bibliography.

Joan Santanach lectures on medieval literature at the University of Barcelona. Robin Vogelzang is completed a doctoral thesis at Indiana University Bloomington.

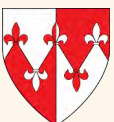
