





Speaking of hot Spring weather, do you know when your local group last ran a Crown event? We



Greetings Lochac!

I look forward to continuing to support heraldry in our good Kingdom as Crux Australis Lochac Principal Herald.

We have a wonderful, enthusiastic, incredibly knowledgeable community of Heralds in this Kingdom: we have many gracious and articulate Voice heralds; expert and tenacious Name and Device consulting heralds; research heralds increasing our understanding and access to information; and last but absolutely not least, heralds who keep everything going, including the Crux Deputies and group Heralds. I am very glad to have met many of you and hope to meet many more.

Congratulations to the following gentles on their successful registrations:

- * *Adeline de Montfort.* Device change. Per chevron argent and ermine, on a chevron azure three fleurs-de-lys palewise argent.
- * Ambroso Angelo da Prato. Name. Nice 16th century Florentine name
- * Angus de Sommerville. Device.
 Azure, a saltire between in pale two crosses crosslet fitchy and in fess two mullets, a bordure Or.
- * *Edith Penrose*. Device change. Azure, a raven rising maintaining in both feet a pen and on a mount argent a rose azure. Nice cant!
- * *Elßlin Krummen*. Name change and device change. Per pale purpure and argent, two calygreyhounds combattant counterchanged maintaining between them a water bouget counterchanged Or and azure.
- * Leo of Achaia. Name.

The locative of Achaia is the lingua Societatis form of the Greek locative Achaios.

- * Leylan de la Haye. Name.
- * *Lucrezia di Speranza Cafferelli*. Name change. Nice 15th-16th century Florentine name!

- * *Mary Catesby*. Name and device.
 Or, a pair of scissors sable. Nice device!
- * **Robin Goblin**. Name and device.
 Or, a tower fracted palewise gules, on a chief embattled sable a rose fesswise slipped and leaved Or.

Submitted as Hob Gob-Lin, this name cannot be registered under SENA PN4C - Claim of Powers. A hobgoblin is a creature in English folklore with supernatural powers that can be mischievous or helpful, depending on one's source.

- * Rowany, Barony of. Reblazon of device. Argent, in fess two rowan trees fructed and eradicated proper, on a point pointed dovetailed vert a laurel wreath argent. Blazoned when registered in December of 1984 as Per chevron dovetailed argent and vert, two rowan trees fructed and eradicated proper and a laurel wreath argent, the green section doesn't reach the midpoint of the field, so is better described as a point pointed.
- * *Saulo Fortunato.* Name change. Nice 16th century Italian name!
- * Ulrich de Porthau. Name change.
- * Willow Wren. Name and device.

 Per fess sable and vert, on a fess between a wolf statant and a sheaf of arrows argent a pellet between an increscent and a decrescent sable.

 Nice late 16th century English name!

In the *Beginner Category*, a silver bell went to Lady Rose le Taillor, for a paper on The Treatment of Mental Health in the middle ages. Three cheers for all the amazing artisans!

My thanks and appreciation go out to all the judges, who graciously dedicated many hours of time and effort to examining the entries and providing thoughtful feedback. A little birdie even told me the judges actually enjoyed the process, which is absolutely wonderful.

I would especially like to thank Maestra Gabriella Borromei, of Stegby, who coordinated A&S for this event and did an excellent job of it.



LIVE STREAM TEAM UPDATE

The Kingdom Livestream Team continues to support major events across Lochac, helping to make courts and tournaments accessible for those who cannot attend in person. Recent broadcasts included the September Crown Tournament in Stormhold and the November Coronation in Riverhaven, both delivered with strong signal quality and supported by stable on-site data.

Viewership Snapshot

While enthusiasm for the idea of livestreaming remains high, actual viewership numbers continue to sit on the modest end of expectations when compared to the size of the Kingdom:

- Crown Tournament (Stormhold): 728 views
- Elevation of Don Everard: 140 views
- Elevation of Orlock Handball: 180 views
- Last Court of Ariston & Jochen (November Coronation): 141 views
- Coronation Court: 111 views
- First Court of Porvaldr inn Suðreyski and Amabilia Thexton: 82 views
- Second Court ofÞorvaldr inn Suðreyski and Amabilia Thexton: 45 views
- Coronation Closing Court: 30 views

These figures show that livestreams are appreciated but still reach a relatively small portion of Lochac.


Period Presentation & Camera Visibility

The team is also actively exploring ways to integrate modern equipment more gracefully into a period environment, including:

- Tactics for discreet placement or dressing of camera gear
- Banner and pennant-based methods to show where microphones and cameras are positioned

A heraldic Livestream Badge has been passed for use, currently owned by Steffen Glaube. Although the registration sits with him, he has offered free use of the badge to the entire Kingdom. Groups may use it on banners, pennants, or markers to indicate camera zones or fields of view in a more period-appropriate fashion.

This system is in its early stages but represents a promising way to maintain both transparency and ambience at events.



At the most recent Board meeting, the directors agreed to review the <u>Companion Card Policy</u>. https://sca.org.au/wp-content/uploads/2022/05/Companion-Card-Policy.pdf

The Board is interested in how this policy is currently utilised and the thoughts of Seneschals, Constables, Event Stewards, cardholders and anyone else this policy may apply too. The Board wants to gauge if the policy is working as intended, and has thus created a short.

We are also reviewing the Social Media Policy, https://sca.org.au/documents/policy/social-media/ as part of this update the Board is considering adding a "Consent to Photography" section to the Event Sign-in/Booking sheets (similar to what is currently implemented in New Zealand). We would particularly like feedback on this from photographers within the SCA, and people with Youth (under 18's) attending events who would need to give permission for each individual minor and each individual photo before it could be posted to official SCA sites.

The wording for the section pertaining to Youth at SCA events to be added to Event sign-in/Booking sheets would be along the lines of:
"The use of photographs and videos of minors on official SCA sites and affiliated social media pages is restricted. Any official SCA site or social media page may not feature any identifiable minor under the age of 14 without explicit consent from the minor's legal guardian for each individual photo and usage. Photographers cannot seek blanket consent for imagery of minors aged 14-18, and consent must be obtained on an individual basis from the minor's legal guardian."

The Board would ask anyone who has experience in this field and wants to give feedback on the

draft update of the Social Media Policy to contact the <u>Kingdom Social Media Officer</u> or the <u>Board</u> <u>Secretary</u>.

The Board also agreed at it's most recent meeting that all new policies will go through a populace commentary period of 1 month, to ensure better communication of policy updates and reviews between the Board and the wider populace of Lochac. Unless significant concerns or feedback are received during this time, the Board will then ratify policies at the first Board meeting after this time period has concluded. The Board hopes that this gives some greater transparency to the operation of the Board and what is currently being worked on.

New Lochac Book of Ceremonies

To the diverse populace and heralds of Lochac do Lady Amanda Martel, Bombarde Herald, and Mistress Gwen verch David send long-awaited greetings!

In A.S. 52, a great Book of Ceremonies for the Kingdom of Lochac was created and presented to all the group heralds of the Kingdom, and this was a mighty work, and worthy of much praise. Yet the ceremonies of Lochac are not stagnant: new awards are created, new customs developed, and new preferences discovered. So it has been that the Book of Ceremonies created in A.S. 52 already needed amendment by A.S. 53, and that need has only grown with time. When it was presented to the College of Heralds and the populace, the A.S. 52 book proudly incorporated the new ceremony for the Order of Defense. Since then, the awards given in this kingdom have grown to include the Catkin, the Ordo Vox Coronae, the Lens, the Azure Lily, the Azure Tear, the Azure Sword, the Hand and Needle, and most recently and significantly, the Order of the Mark.

As such, Crux Australis Herald commissioned a newly revised Book of Ceremonies for Lochac, and we are proud to announce the completion of that work. In addition to the new ceremonies listed above, we have filled in certain gaps where no standard ceremony existed (such as for the Order of the Rose, and the Royal Cypher), and we have also revised all ceremonies for length, errors, changes in practice, and areas where confusion might arise. Where multiple options existed within a ceremony, we have explicit scripts for each one. Where a ceremony might reference someone's gender, we have moved to non-gendered options (such as 'good marshal' rather than 'lord marshal') or made it clear that the specifics must be chosen according to the people concerned (such as 'Long live the [Title]' rather than 'Long live the Queen'). In a few cases, ceremonies have undergone recognisable changes, but most changes have been as subtle as possible, with our concern always to maintain continuity with the traditions of Lochac.

The Book of Ceremonies is not only a set of words. folders with editable versions of the files for the It is a document that is printed, carried, held, and convenience of those ceremony heralds who

read at events of many kinds. We have therefore redone the formatting of ceremonies for both readability in all light conditions and compactness. We are proud to say that almost all the common ceremonies now take up only a single page each, and that many people will find them readable at A5, even in low light. For convenience of those who would print their own copies, we have made available PDFs of each individual ceremony, each section of the book, the total book, and a set we have named the 'Commonplace Book of Ceremonies'. This last set is only 43 pages long, but contains every ceremony except for the Peerage ceremonies, and the ceremonies specific to Coronation, Crown Tourney, and Baronial Investiture Events. While not included in the Book of Ceremonies itself, the website also has a PDF of a 'Combined Ceremony for Any Peerage', which greatly reduces the number of pages a herald might need to carry in order to be prepared for the extraordinary circumstance of an unexpected peerage ceremony.

Finally, as a supplement to the ceremonies themselves, we have provided an appendix of guidance documents, providing advice on such matters as a court herald, a Crown, or indeed a royal household member may find themselves needing to consider when making decisions about ceremonies and courts. This guidance section also includes a document on the options for peerage ceremonies, for the benefit of prospective peers, and a practical guide to setting up thrones, for the benefit of event teams. This guidance section is included at the end of the main Book of Ceremonies, but it is also downloadable as a separate file, as are all of the individual documents within it.

The Lochac Book of Ceremonies is a living thing, and we will not be surprised if we find that this A.S. 60 edition needs amending in A.S. 61. Over the coming months, we will be adding ZIP folders with editable versions of the files for the convenience of those ceremony heralds who

come after us. We will also be working on large print versions of these ceremonies, and the previous edition will be archived on the Lochac College of Heralds website.

As ceremony heralds, it is always a delight to really consider the question of what makes a good ceremony. We are grateful to Mistress Isabella de Bordeaux (the Crux Australis Herald who commissioned the project) for entrusting us with the opportunity to engage with that question so extensively. We hope that you, the populace and heralds of Lochac, will find the product of our

efforts a fitting expression of Lochac's ceremony culture as it stands, and a practical contribution to the life of a working herald.
