Welcome!



What does the creation of the Order of the Mark mean to you?



Why did you receive this award?


What does the creation of the Order of the Mark mean to you?


What does the creation of the Order of the Mark mean to you?

The Creation of the Order of the Mark

When Jason and I won the Crown Tournament, we thought the Order of the Mark would be created by our predecessors, and we were excited to see what was going to happen. We speculated about how it should be done, who the Premiers would be and how everything would be done. After it was delayed, we realized that we would be the ones who would have the honor of creating the Order of the Mark. Our speculations and discussions of how things might be done and who would be in it were no longer idle musing. We had to develop a plan!

Creating this new Order was not just an honor; it was a major responsibility. What we did would affect the Order and the Missile Community for many years. We put a lot of thought into what should be done and who the Premiers should be. We received many recommendations and had many discussions with people from across the Kingdom and in all communities, not just the Missile Community. We looked to the creation of the Order of Defense to see what worked well and what did not.

Ansteorra has a strong Missile Community and awards that have been used for years. The King's Archer, which is a non-armigerous award, the award of the Sable Talon which is our AOA level award and can be given multiple times for different areas, and the Arc d'Or, which is a Grant Level award for the Missile Community. A wrinkle that was being added to the new Peerage was the Missile activities within the Equestrian Community.

We put a lot of thought into the selection of the Premiers and of how the initial elevations would be done and the holding of the first circle. There were certain restrictions placed on us by the Board of Directors, which included how many could be made on the first day, what the first eligible date was, and what had to be done before a Circle could be held. We could only make 3 Premiers; once all 3 had been elevated, we could hold a circle, but no more could be made that day.

Based on those restrictions, discussions, and the history of Ansteorra, we made our decisions. Each Premier had to be someone that had been an active member in the missile community for a number of years, be a member of the Order of the Arc d'Or, and have made a positive impact on the community. We struggle with the first 3, we wanted to make sure we included all missile activities, not just one area. As we worked on selecting our final 3 Premiers we knew that there were more than just people worthy of this Peerage.

We did things a little differently in Ansteorra. Even though we could "announce" the premiere on May 1st and elevate beginning on June 7th, we chose to wait until June 7th to make the announcement / elevation of our premiers. We then held the first Mark circle that same afternoon and announced 4 more candidates in evening court. Jason and I wanted to make sure that the Order was established during our Reign. We planned to announce and make 10 members to get it started. We accomplished that and were able to elevate 11 people to the Order of the Mark during our time as Crown.

It was a great honor to be able to be the crown who was able to start the Order of the Mark and look forward to seeing how it grows and expands in the future.


What does the missile peerage mean to you? How do you intend to guide the missile community as one of the first peers?


I plan to continue to be myself.


What activities in the missile community do you participate in and do any of them stand out as your favorite?

What does the missile peerage mean to you? How do you intend to guide the missile community as one of the first peers?

It is a great honor. I have spent 15 years writing letters, having discussions, debates, and pushing for this to become a peerage. I am happy that it has finally come to pass. I am also a little sad as I feel that there were others that are no longer with us or no longer playing that were instrumental in keeping missie going for many years that are not here to see this.

Now that it is here, I want to help it grow from "that thing that happens way over there somewhere" to something that is more recognized and is seen as ONE COMMUNITY. Archery will dominate this order for some time because there are more archers.

One of the things that I think will need to be done is to have A Champion for the Kingdom. This will not be easy as the community has worked for years to get recognition and build all of the areas. I believe that we now need to consolidate and show a united front. There is A Rapier Champion, A Chivalric Champion - they do not have a spear champion, a 2 weapon champion, a dagger champion . . . they have ONE. Laurels are the same way - ONE champion! We need to be seen the same way.

The Mark Circle is getting established very quickly, other Kingdoms are envious of what we have done already. We have been talking about what to call our students, what to use as regalia, what we feel candidates should be like - Offices held, leadership in the community, teaching, running ranges, travel, marshal status, and skill. This is not just skill (which is important), everything needs to be considered.


Fun mundane facts



What brought you to the missile community?

I was in the missile community while I lived in the Kingdom of Meridies. It only consisted of archery and combat archery at the time. When I moved to Ansteorra, the first event I came to had thrown weapons knife, ax, spear, and I participated in that. That would have been in 96.

What activities in the missile community do you participate in and do any of them stand out as your favorite?

What would you like to try next? What is your first memory in the missile community?

So I do combat archery, throwing weapons, and regular archery. I need to work more on my target archery. My favorite is going to be throwing weapons properly.

What does the missile community mean to you?

It means an awful lot to me. When newcomers come to a demo or an event, they are going to watch all of the things. When seeing the rapier fighting or chiv fighting, many will think they need to try it out but there is so much gear they have to get. But with archery and thrown weapons having such a low barrier of entry, you can always borrow knives, axes, or bows and arrows. It's not the same thing to putt on somebody's sweaty, stinky helmet.

When I first became really involved it was an insular community back in say 2004. When I first started, there were the same five people at every event. They would always be off of the corner by themselves, and I sort of had to force my way into that group by beating them. When I was acknowledged as being part of thrown weapons group, I leveraged my position as a knight and became the spokesman to get more people involved.

I won Crown in 2007. As part of our reign, I made spreading thrown weapons one of my main goals which got even more people involved after I stepped down. I eventually became Kingdom from weapons Marshall. At the time that I took over, it was myself and one other person authorized to marshal thrown weapons for the entire Kingdom. I made 37 Authorizing Marshals during the period of time with every region having at least five. And so it then blew up after that.

What does the missile community mean to you? (cont...)

So the thrown weapons community means an awful lot to me because I was able to help guide this community from something that was basically just a few people doing a thing to what it is today. I cannot take full credit because our community is the culmination of years of work and effort from an awful lot of people, but I was able to kind of move it that direction so that people would be able to enjoy it as much as I do.

What does the missile peerage mean to you? How do you intend to guide the missile community as one of the first peers?

When I first started back in 1990, two areas of the society felt marginalized- archery and thrown weapons. The creation of the Missile Peerage means that these communities (throne weapons and archery) are finally getting the recognition that they deserve for all the time, effort, energy, and skill shown over the years. To me, the archery and throwing weapons are just as valid martial activities as Rapier or chiv fighting. To me, it shows that the society has expanded its boundaries as to what is important to the people playing in it.

I'm a licensed Auctioneer and at Gulf wars I am the only person to have thrown perfect scores on the CW range 3 years in a row.




What activities in the missile community do you participate in and do any of them stand out as your favorite?

Definitely combat archery is my love. I have had fun with the new slings and enjoy playing with atlatl. Would like to get more atlatl activities going in the Kingdom, although my follow-through with that has been poor.

What does the missile community mean to you?

My involvement in combat archery makes the community a lot larger than just the missile community. I have my fellow knights, squires, unbelted, fresh faces, royal peers, marshals, water bearers...The biggest connection I get with others in the missile community is during initial inspection at inspection point or the random chit chat during ammo inspection after the battle. It is a good community and lots of smartassery all around :P






What activities in the missile community do you participate in and do any of them stand out as your favorite?








What does the missile community mean to you?


What does the missile peerage mean to you? How do you intend to guide the missile community as one of the first peers? (continued..)


This recognition is not the end of a path for me, but a call to keep going—to serve even more deeply, to support those around me with greater intention, and to lift up others the way I have been lifted.


What activities in the missile community do you participate in and do any of them stand out as your favorite?


Fun mundane facts

What would you like to try next? What is your first memory in the missile community?





What does the missile peerage mean to you? How do you intend to guide the missile community as one of the first peers?
