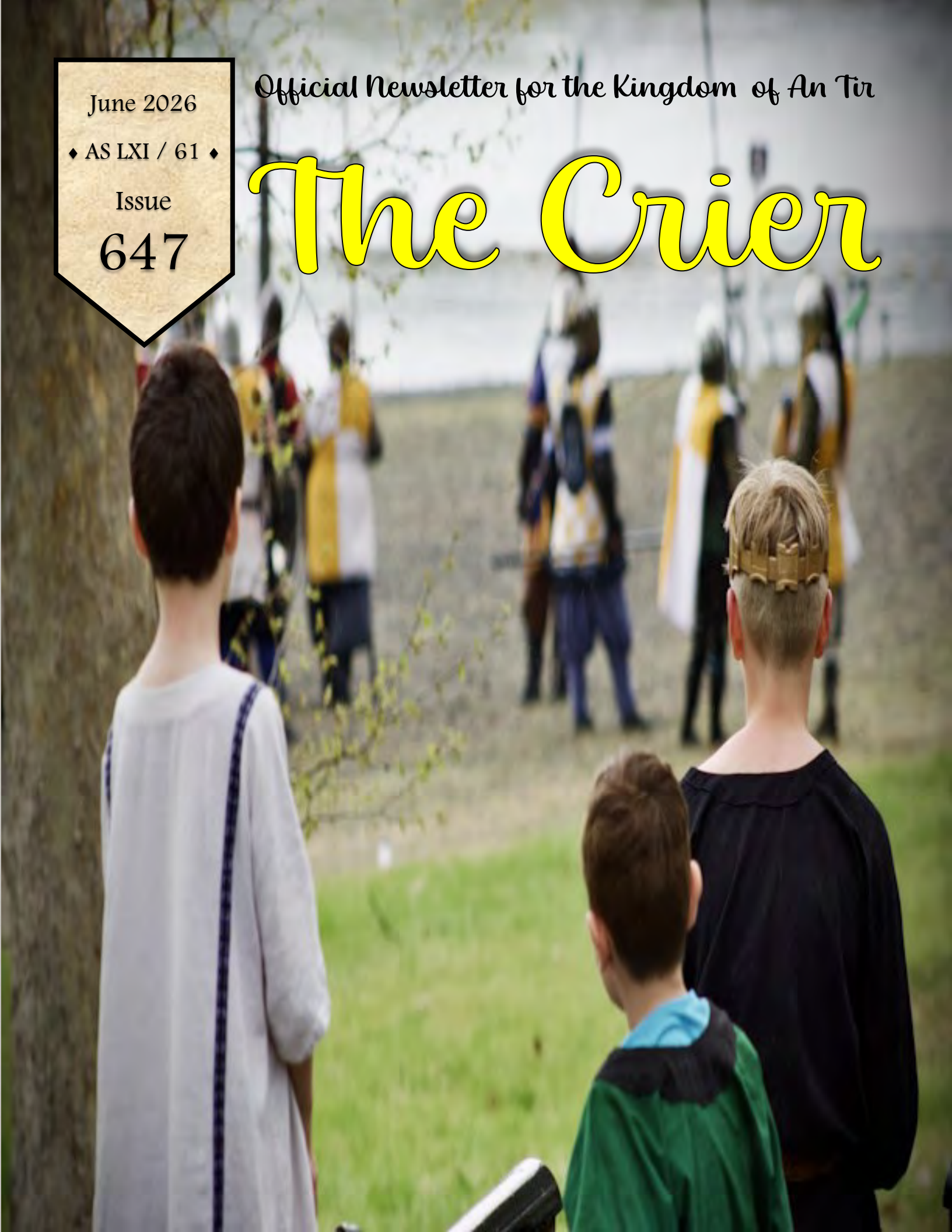

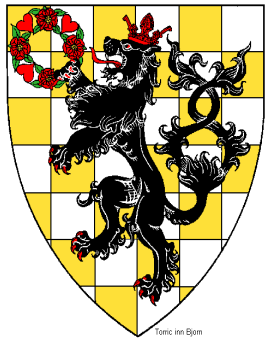

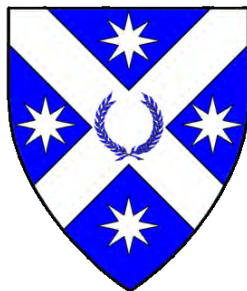

Kingdom Earl Marshal Position Opening

Interested parties should submit their SCA resume and a letter of intent by July 1, 2026 to the Kingdom Earl Marshal, Their Royal Majesties, and the Kingdom Seneschal. This position will start at July Coronation 2026 and last for two years.

The role of the Earl Marshal is an administrative and advising position currently overseeing all martial activities within the Kingdom of An Tir, plus the work of lists and authorization data entry volunteers. The Earl Marshal works with those subject matter experts to ensure a consistent approach to safe and enjoyable martial arts participation by approximately 1000 residents of our Kingdom. General responsibilities for the Earl Marshal as a Greater Officer of State, are explained in Kingdom Law, Article III.C, (items 1-4). The specific duties are in item (5c) stated below, and the direct deputies of the Earl

Marshal are in item (5d).

1. An Tir's martial manuals state that if you are warranted as the Earl Marshal:
- 2.
3. "You must be an authorized senior marshal in one or more combat disciplines for a minimum of three years, and agree to serve as Earl Marshal. (The Crown may waive the time limit.)
- 4.
5. Per Article III.C (item 5c) of Kingdom Law the KEM's duties include:
- 6.
7. Representing the Crown in the Crown's absence in order to supervise fighting on a field of honor.
- 8.
9. Interpreting and maintaining the martial standards and regulations of the Kingdom.
- 10.
11. Facilitating the education of the populace with the aim of encouraging authentic, safe, fair, and chivalric combat activities to the greatest extent possible.
- 12.
13. It is strongly recommended that the KEM not simultaneously hold any of the other Kingdom marshal officer roles, including that of Kingdom Armored Marshal. This will allow the KEM to devote more equitable attention to all of An Tir's martial activities.
- 14.
15. You must complete quarterly reports to An Tir's Monarchs, the Royal Heirs (if applicable), the Kingdom Seneschal, and the Society Earl Marshal, regarding the state of fighting in An Tir. See item (B) for when this report is due.
- 16.
17. If disciplinary action that extends beyond the bounds of a single event is taken against a fighter in your Kingdom (e.g., authorizations suspended or revoked or a Court of Chivalry), you must make a brief account to the Society Earl Marshal of what was done, to whom, and why. (If more information is needed, for example because of an appeal of the action, the Society Earl Marshal will let you know.)
- 18.
19. Either individual warrants must be provided for each member of the marshallate in your kingdom, or a roster must be maintained as explained by the Kingdom Seneschal. This task may be delegated to the Kingdom Martial Authorization Officer.
- 20.
21. Answer correspondence from the marshals of An Tir.

Honor War: The Little War for the Little Island

Basalt columns rise on either side of the narrow river canyon, a pelican (the bird) or two can often be seen circling overhead, and the flowers of Spring are just beginning to make their appearance when one of the first camp-

ing events of the season, Honor War, commences. In the middle of the Snake River, minutes from the border of An Tir and Artemisia, a little battle on a little island is making a big impact.

The College of Lyonsmarche "that can barely boast a couple dozen regular members", says event steward Fausto Filippo da Firenze, "brought over 200 SCAians, from the West Coast to Montana, all to our little local island." When asked what made this event so special to the event steward, he related his experience. "Getting to interact with Artemisians, and see how our Kingdoms interacted was wonderful. There are many cultural differences, but the camaraderie crossed borders", Fausto said.

The battles fought are unique to this event, where the war field is located on a beach along the southern side of Chief Timothy Park. Some years, fighters have made use of a field toward the north side of the island, but this year's activities kept everyone in close proximity to one another. Archery was located just on the other side of a large playground overlooking the beach, where Rapier and Heavy fighters took turns in their kingdom versus kingdom battles, and the merchants row had a view just a few paces behind the

Though the schedule was packed, each activity involved the whole of the populace and one need not worry so much about choosing between a class on one side of a large encampment, or witnessing a squiring on the other end of a war field.

For one Artemisian, Aonghus, Honor War is an opportunity to support and give back within the SCA. When asked what draws him each year to the event he responded, "Obviously I love seeing my friends from the area, but I also really enjoy getting to support a smaller group that are usually the ones having to travel."

And as for folks who haven't played in neighboring Kingdoms, he offers this advice, "Don't be afraid to spend time with people you have never met. The SCA is a smaller place than we often realize." He continues, "You'll be hearing awesome ideas and making life-long friends you'd never have met without stepping out of your comfort zone."



Aonghus also notes that playing outside of one's own Kingdom can provide a break from the necessity of volunteering, and is an opportunity to relax and renew enthusiasm for the game. These small, unique events are an opportunity to slow down and actually talk to friends, or meet new friends, rather than a quick "hi and bye" before rushing off to another task. These events are where the truest relationships are forged.

Walking in the Weeds

Wild Carrot, Queen Anne's Lace—"The queen has hairy legs!"

Daucus carota- Queen Anne's Lace, bishop's lace, rattlesnake weed, birds nest, bees nest.



Description

It is in the umbelliferae (parsley family). Carrot has lacy foliage, and finely divided, lacy leaves. It prefers meadows and fields in full sun. It was naturalized in Europe and elsewhere from Iran. The whole plant is covered in clearly visible hairs. These hairs are very important because the poisonous look-alike (poison hemlock) does not have these hairs.

Just remember the saying, "The Queen has hairy legs". The roots smell like carrots. Poison hemlock doesn't. *Daucus carota* has wiry roots that are reddish-purple due to anthocyanins- these have been bred out of the cultivated varieties of the orange carrots. The orange carrot is believed to have been developed in the 16th century in Holland to commemorate the Royal House of Orange.



"Walking in the weeds" is written by Her Ladyship. Ailynn Catriona Moireabh of Crow's Gate, a canton of the Barony of Glymm Mere. She enjoys foraging, gardening, sewing, inkle weaving, and some scribal arts. She thinks that plants that were originally foraged, eventually were cultivated and have become the garden staples we rely upon today.



Wild carrot is a biennial, laying low the first year and sending up delicate flower umbels in the second year about 1-4 feet tall. They are white florets, flattened on top and compact.

There is also a frill under the upright flower portion. Many times there will be a single purple or maroon floret in the center. In the book by Doug Elliott called *Wild Roots*, Healing Arts Press, 1995, Rochester, Vermont, he says "Sometimes this central floret is called "the queen", as she is surrounded by her 'lace'.

Another story tells that the maroon floret commemorates the drop of blood spilt when Queen Anne pricked her finger as she was sewing lace" As the blossom fades and the seeds begin to ripen, the sides of the head rise and form a cup, hence the name bird's nest.

Ancient Remedies- anti-flatulence, to promote menstruation, urine flow, cystitis, gout, vermicide, rheumatism, arthritis.

Nutrition-vitamins A, C, E, potassium, calcium, magnesium, phosphorus. Acts as an antioxidant. Has beta carotene, lutein, and fiber. If you leave the skins on, it can double the antioxidant power.

The roots from the first year are not as tough and can be used to flavor soups. The flowers can be made into fritters and teas. The seeds can be used as a spice.

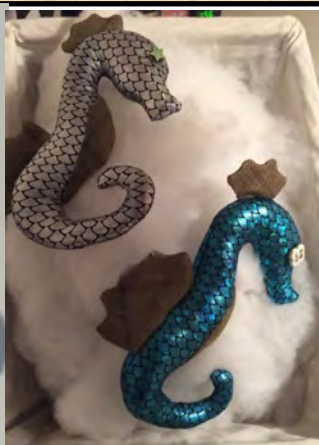
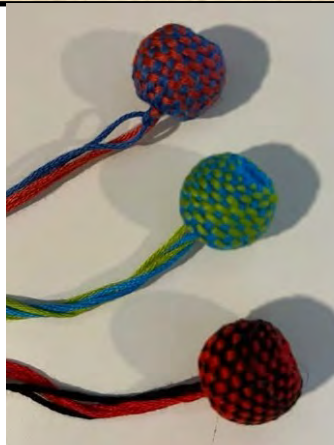

"Greetings, I am Baroness Carith de Cuevas from the Barony of Three Mountains in the Rivers Region of An Tir.

I am protégé to Countess Ana de la Sara of An Tir and courtier to the Baron and Baroness of Three Mountains. My primary interests beyond largesse are teaching dance, painting charters and scrolls as a scribe, making and teaching games, and applique and embroidery. I am a person who likes to do all the things.



On the more administrative side, I keep a Google Doc for my class called "What is Largesse?" and another with a mountain of "Largesse Examples". Additional items I have made for largesse include hand painted thank you cards and bookmarks, haversack bags, smaller bags, sewing kits, needlebooks, jorvic hoods, little handmade books, lots of toys (usually stuffed wee besties), woven buttons and other cloth buttons (buttons are handy when you make bags and needlebooks...but can also be given out on their own)."

CURRENT DONATION NEEDS:

Greatest Need

- Haversacks & Period-adjacent drawstring bags
- Cups (For the Newcomer program, as well as for general largesse)
- Caps (For the Newcomer program - simple Linen Coifs in particular but any type is appreciated)

General Need

- Toys for Kids & Teens (Period items are great but not required, stuffies are particularly popular!)
- Scribal Items and/or Kits
- Blank Books (we love handbound but any blank book that is period-esque is great)
- Useful Items and/or Kits (ex: First Aid, Hygiene, Jewelry Repair, Water Bottle Bags/Covers, Sun Protection, etc)
- Veils (Linen or Silk, w/wo Fillet)
- Combat Related Items
- Sewing Items and/or Kits
- Activity Kits (Pieces & instructions to make "x", etc)
- Woven Trim (No specifics - Anything is great)

BASIC GUIDELINES FOR DONATION:

- Handmade is fantastic but not required, just that it's as period as possible (exceptions are in place for children's items – period preferred but NOT required, period adjacent or 'thematic' is great [examples: magical creatures, a modern puzzle with jousting scene, etc.]).

- PLEASE label each of your items with your SCA Name, SCA Branch, and what the item is/can be used for. If you wish to remain anonymous, that's fine! Just include your branch and the item description. There is a basic label template available for home printing on the Largesse page on the Kingdom Website.

- ANYONE can donate largesse, in ANY quantity (Yes, even just one thing!)

- NO scented items please!

- NO perishable items please!

- NO items that can melt please! (If you are unsure, leave it in your car on a 90 degree day and see if it melts)

- If you are unsure what to donate, please reach out!

- Items we always need: Caps/Hats/Coifs; Veils; Cups; Toys/Games/Crafts/Stuffies for Children and Teens.

Notice About Submitting Event Copy

Why events must be published – Kingdom Law: “for an event to be considered official, event copy needs to be published in the Crier at minimum once in the issue of the month in which the event occurs.” An event must be official if Royals are present (this includes branch Coronets) so that any business conducted in Court can be recorded and published. All Branches in An Tir must have at least one official event per year in the Crier to maintain their status. All event copy should be sent to CrierEditor@antir.org and needs to follow a specific format, please ask for a copy of the format if you do not already have one.

Remember: The deadline is the first of the month PRIOR to your event!

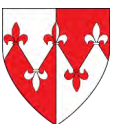
