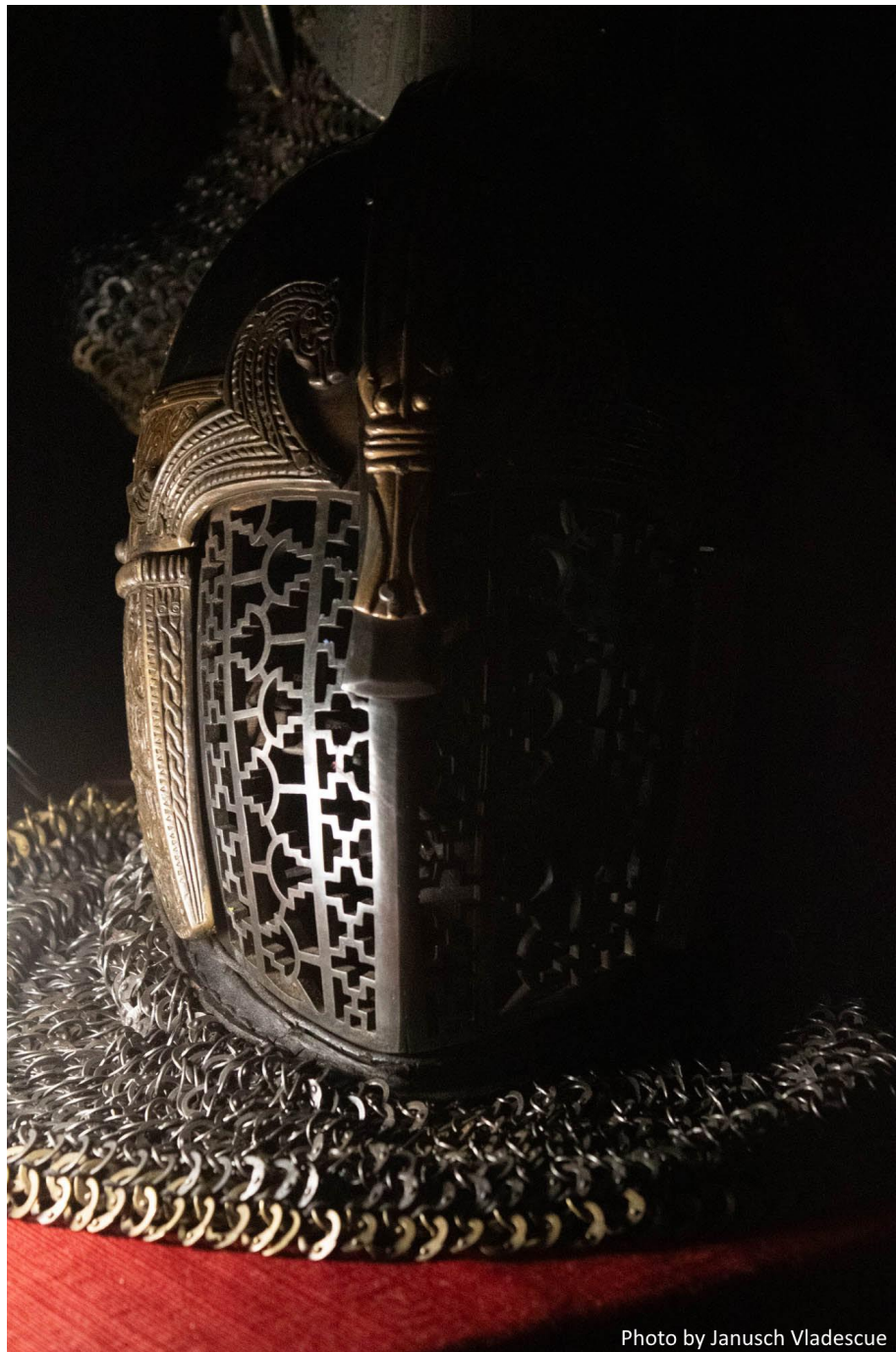

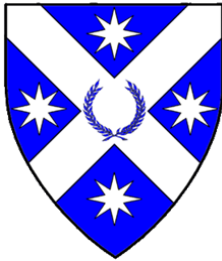

Kingdom Calendar Deputy Position is Now Open for Applications

The office of the Kingdom Seneschal is now accepting applications for the position of Calendar deputy position.

The calendar deputy is responsible for maintaining the Kingdom Events Calendar. The office receives and processes all of the event submissions for Central An Tir and supports the calendar deputies in The Principalities of the Summits and Tir Righ. This position requires approximately 2-5 hours of work per week, does not require previous knowledge of the calendar, and is an excellent way to support the Kingdom and its branches.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Check calendar@antir.org email regularly, action tasks and respond to inquiries
- Troubleshoot calendar issues with event stewards and branch seneschals
- Check incoming event submissions for information and calendar conflicts
- Input information for events in the Kingdom events calendar and inform seneschal/stewards of updates. This includes creating events, checking and confirming information, creating and updating locations and publishing events to the Kingdom Calendar
- Check for EIF form submissions before due dates and update the Kingdom Calendar as needed
- Report quarterly to the Kingdom Seneschal and provide update reports for Curia
- Attend quarterly Curia meetings (online) and give synopsis of reports

If deputy is unable to check in on email for a given time, they must inform the contingency deputy if there is one OR the Kingdom seneschal to arrange coverage

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

IMPORTANT PROCESS UPDATE from the Office of the Kingdom Largesse Coordinator:

We are pleased to announce that in discussion with the Crown we will be relaxing the moratorium on official transport of Kingdom Largesse across the Canadian border. This means that the Crown, Kingdom Officials, and designated couriers will once again be able to bring donations back and forth! We deeply thank the populace of Tir Righ for your understanding and patience as we felt out mundane law changes and how they impact our game. Many things have been in flux, but at this time our next Crown feels

comfortable returning to normal procedures (for the time being). Travel south has understandably decreased, which may limit opportunities for transport but an official collection of largesse donations is planned at September Crown. Walking in the Weeds

Sheep's Sorrel

This arrow-shaped leafy green is yummy in salads to give it a lemony, tart taste to it. It gets that flavor from the oxalic acid present in all sorrels. The entire plant can be used raw or cooked. It is rich in vitamins A and C. It also has calcium, iron, magnesium and potassium. In cheesemaking, it has been used as a curdling agent for milk. I use it as a flavoring in muffins. Here's my recipe, adapted from a muffin recipe written by Eleanor Makinster, This Day columnist for The Longview Daily News, Longview, Washington 1967.

Ingredients:

2 cups flour
¼ cup sugar
1 tablespoon baking powder
½ teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon fresh lime zest
½ cup shredded zucchini
½ cup chopped fresh sheep's sorrel leaves
¼ cup butter, softened
¼ cup olive oil
1 egg

Infused turbinado sugar {lime zest, vanilla, and thyme aged overnight}

Combine dry ingredients. Add zucchini, sorrel, butter, oil and egg. Mix just to combine. Do not over mix. Spoon into muffin cups. Top with 1 tablespoon infused sugar per muffin. Bake in 400* oven for 20-25 minutes. Let cool. Enjoy with your favorite beverage.

Sheep's sorrel has been used for urinary dysfunction and edema in folk medicine. It is a powerful antioxidant. Nicholas Culpeper said in his complete Herbal and English Physician, 1653 "Both roots and seeds, as well as the herb, are held powerful to resist the poison of the scorpion. The decoction of the roots is taken to help the jaundice, and to expel the gravel and the stones in the reins (gallstones) or kidneys" He used the sheep's sorrel juice to cure ringworm and as a gargle for sore throat. Sheep's sorrel has been used to treat scurvy. The scientific name is *Rumex acetosella* and is a member of the buckwheat family. Sheep's sorrel grows about 12-18 inches tall and spreads by a quick growing rhizome. It is perennial. The tiny flowers arise from upright stems. The male flowers are greenish-yellow and the female plants have maroon flowers. The stems are red. It has been called sour dock, sour weed, red sorrel or field sorrel and is native to Eurasia and the British Isles. It likes disturbed soil and full sun, but will tolerate some dappled shade where it tends to be more leafy and blooms less.



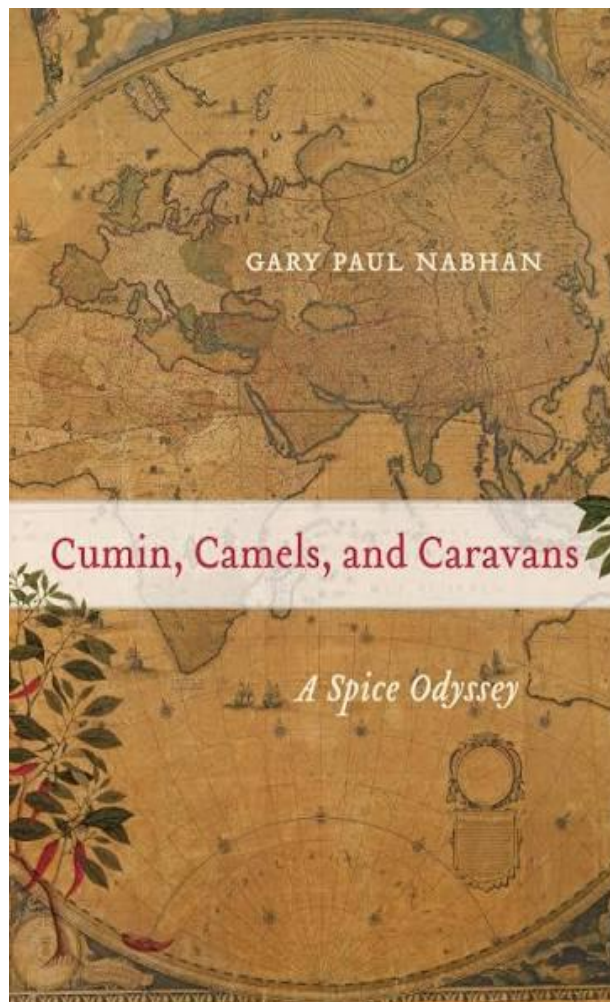

She thinks that plants that were originally foraged, eventually were cultivated and have become the garden staples we rely upon today.

Eat This Book!

“Cumin, Camels, and Caravans: A Spice Odyssey” by Gary Paul Nabhan 2014, University of California Press takes you on a delicious and aromatic journey. It documents the growing, picking, packaging and distribution of 26 different spices; Mastic, Frankincense, Turmeric, Cardamom, Saffron, Cassia Cinnamon, Capers, Sesame, Cloves, Damascus Rose, Grains of Paradise, Musk, Ginger, Pomegranate, Sumac, Anise, Coriander, Star Anise, Sichuan Pepper, Camel’s Breath Tea, Cumin, Chile Peppers, Annatto, Allspice, Vanilla and Chocolate. As you can see by the list of spices some of them are new world and outside our area of study, but most are not. “Cumin, Camels, and Caravans” is a more of a culinary travel log as our author, Dr. Nabhan who received his PhD. from the University of Arizona in Arid Land resource sciences, is a major part of this journey. He is a character in the voyage each of these spices takes. He looks at each of them through his own senses. Dr. Nabhan describes the book as “reflective journey” The book is a mix of historic information and modern information and stories with some truly delightful insights. It is however, a very different book than is usually reviewed here. That being said it is well worth the read. I took so many notes in the first chapter alone that it could be two or three columns. Maybe even 26 columns, one for each spice! Although this is more

travelogue and spice history Dr. Nabhan does include 13 recipes. Some of them are modern recipes, others are modern interpretations of Medieval or Renaissance recipes. He even uses a recipe from “Soup for the Quan”. The second category of recipes, while a nice inclusion, should be taken with a grain of salt as tend to not be exactly true to the originals. It should be noted that salt is not included in the 26 spices. All of the included recipes sound delicious and a few are discussed below.

“Cumin, Camels, and Caravans” is comprised of an Introduction titled “The Origin of “Species – Trading Spices to the Ends of the Earth” which is sets up for our detailed and interesting journey of the world of spices. This introduction is followed by 12 chapters starting with Chapter one “Aromas Emanating for the Driest of Places”, continuing with chapters on migration, spice routes, cross cultural collaboration, the Silk Roads from China to Africa and ending with the chapter “Crossing the Drawbridge over the Eastern Ocean” which is dedicated to the spices coming out of the Americas. The book continues with an Epilogue titled “Culinary Imperialism and Its Alternatives”, “Acknowledgements”, a “Notes” section and a detailed index. “Cumin, Camels, and Caravans” is part of the California Studies in Food and Culture which “seeks to broaden the audience of serious scholarship as well as to celebrate food as a means of understanding the world. Other books in this series have been reviewed or mentioned in previous columns of Eat This Book most notably “The Art of Cooking: The First Modern Cookery Book” by Maestro Martino of Como (Author) and Luigi Ballerini (Editor), 2005 and “Eating Right in the Renaissance” by Ken Albala, 2002. If I had to tease out a theme to this book, besides it’s about spices, I would say, globalization, or at least the part of the globe that Europeans were aware of, has always been



with us. The trade routes and “silk road” exchange bought and sold items between and among cultures for hundreds, if not thousands of years. The author reminds us at the very beginning of the book that spice “use is never politically, economically, or even

culturally neutral. It is impossible to reflect on the significance of aromatics, and their history, without acknowledging that imperialism, cultural competition and collaboration, religious belief and social status are embedded in very milligram of cardamom, cinnamon and cumin.” Dr. Nabhan also reminds us in the introduction to the book that spices are not just for culinary use, but throughout history and so many cultures they are used for medical use as well. Nabhan describes the use of camel’s milk for “microbial infections of the eye”, frankincense used as an antiseptic, and “was valued as a cardiac cure for pulmonary diseases”.

The 33 Illustrations in the book are a mix of colour plates, figures and maps. The nine colour plates include photos of Persian manuscripts, beautiful close-ups of 10 spices, spice markets, and other manuscripts. There are four maps included; Spice Trails of the Arabian Peninsula and Arabian Sea, Spice trails of the Sahara, Spice trails of the Desert Silk Roads and Maritime Silk Roads, Spice trails of the New World. Each are packed with visual and written information that enhance the rest of the book. The 20 other illustrations are black and white photographs of more spices, spice

transportation methods, spice merchants and more.

This is a reference book, but as mentioned above, does include 13 recipes (see page xi). The recipes are inspired by traditional and historic recipes, but many are not cooked or sourced in a period way with the addition of new world foods etc. The first recipe included is called “Carne de Cordero en la Olla” it is Lamb with garbanzo beans. Included on page 7 it can easily be made in a more period way by removing the tomatoes that the recipe included. There is also mastic included in this recipe and it might be hard to source. Very little is needed and it will bring a deeper and interesting flavor to the dish but if you can’t find it leaving it out will not impact the dish significantly. Another one to try out is included on page 135 “Oshi Plov” or “Persian-Tajik Rice Pilaf with Quince”. It looks delicious and I will be making it as soon as the quinces come into season. Scattered throughout the book are highlighted sections on specific herbs and spices. These highlights go into depth and detail. If you read nothing else from this book these “Spice Boxes” are what you should read.
