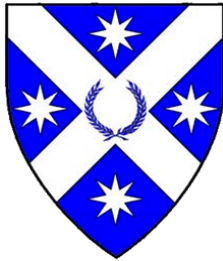

Kingdom Calendar Deputy Position is Now Open for Applications

The office of the Kingdom Seneschal is now accepting applications for the position of Calendar deputy position.

The calendar deputy is responsible for maintaining the Kingdom Events Calendar. The office receives and processes all of the event submissions for Central An Tir and supports the calendar deputies in The Principalities of the Summits and Tir Righ. This position requires approximately 2-5 hours of work per week, does not require previous knowledge of the calendar, and is an excellent way to support the Kingdom and its branches.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Check calendar@antir.org email regularly, action tasks and respond to inquiries
- Troubleshoot calendar issues with event stewards and branch seneschals
- Check incoming event submissions for information and calendar conflicts
- Input information for events in the Kingdom events calendar and inform seneschal/stewards of updates. This includes creating events, checking and confirming information, creating and updating locations and publishing events to the Kingdom Calendar
- Check for EIF form submissions before due dates and update the Kingdom Calendar as needed
- Report quarterly to the Kingdom Seneschal and provide update reports for Curia
- Attend quarterly Curia meetings (online) and give synopsis of reports

If deputy is unable to check in on email for a given time, they must inform the contingency deputy if there is one OR the Kingdom seneschal to arrange coverage

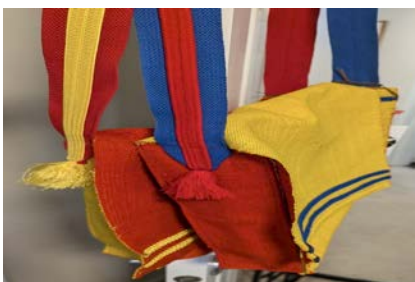

IMPORTANT PROCESS UPDATE
from the Office of the Kingdom
Largesse Coordinator:

We are pleased to announce that in discussion with the Crown we will be relaxing the moratorium on official transport of Kingdom Largesse across the Canadian border. This means that the Crown, Kingdom Officials, and designated couriers will once again be able to bring donations back and forth! We deeply thank the populace of Tir Righ for your understanding and patience as we felt out mundane law changes and how they impact our game. Many things have been in flux, but at this time our next Crown feels

comfortable returning to normal procedures (for the time being). Travel south has understandably decreased, which may limit opportunities for transport but an official collection of largesse donations is planned at September Crown. If you have any questions, please reach out through the Kingdom Largesse Coordinator email.

The DELIGHTFUL DUO LARGESSE CONTEST is coming to September Crown 2026!

Overview: Each entrant is asked to contribute two nearly identical handmade items which would not normally be donated as largesse due to cost, complexity, or time commitment. One of the two items will be kept by the Crown for gifting to fellow royals or to be used as prizes for other kingdom level contests, the second of the two items will be taken home by one of the other entrants as a prize. This means everyone who enters will go home with something fabulous! Each duo will be put on display Saturday and voted on by the populace during the day, granting the winner first choice of one of the other entries to take home. The order by which the rest of the entrants choose their prize item will be based on a blind drawing of names.

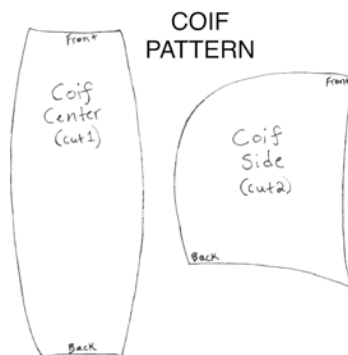

BASIC GUIDELINES FOR DONATION:

- Handmade is fantastic but not required, just that it's as period as possible (exceptions are in place for children's items – period preferred but NOT required, period adjacent or 'thematic' is great [examples: magical creatures, a modern puzzle with jousting scene, etc.]).

- PLEASE label each of your items with your SCA Name, SCA Branch, and what the item is/can be used for. If you wish to remain anonymous, that's fine! Just include your branch and the item description. There is a basic label template available for home printing on the Largesse page on the Kingdom Website.

- ANYONE can donate largesse, in ANY quantity (Yes, even just one thing)!

- NO SCENTED items please!

- NO PERISHABLE items please!

- NO MELTABLE items please! (If you are unsure, leave it in your car on a 90 degree day and see if it melts)

Walking in the Weeds

Wild Violet- *Viola odorata*. Also common violet-*Viola sororia*. These small fragrant beauties have appeared in illuminated manuscripts, materia medica, poetry, and lists of plants by Walafrid Strabo's 9th century monastery garden.

William Shakespeare mentions violets 11 times in his plays. In *Hamlet*, Act IV, scene 5, Ophelia says "I would give you some violets, but they wither'd all when my father died." In *A Midsummer Night's Dream* Act 2, scene 1, Oberon says, "I know a bank where the wild thyme blows, where oxlips and the nodding violet grows"

Pansies, called 'hearts ease' in medieval times, are also in the violaceae (violet) family and are edible. Mmmm flower salad!

Description: Violets like shady, moist soil. They have small heart shaped leaves, are hairless and either light or dark green depending on the variety. This perennial plant grows about 6 inches tall, and forms clusters of serrated leaves with flowers raised slightly above the leaves. Each flower has its own leafless stalk. The sweet scent is unmistakable in the early spring. The edible flowers range in color from blue to purple and white and yellow. Do not eat the yellow ones as they can cause stomach issues. Each ¼-½ inch flower has 5 rounded petals, 2 on each side and one lobed petal facing down often with stripes on it. The seedpods develop with 3 valves that when dried erupt to disperse the tiny seeds. You can eat the flowers, stems and young leaves. The roots cause diarrhea. Don't eat those!

Nutritional info- Good source of vitamin A, C, and K. They contain antioxidants and phytochemicals

Culinary Uses- Flowers can be added to salads, pickled, used to garnish drinks and desserts. To thicken soups,

harvest the leaves anytime. Can be eaten raw, dried, and steeped into teas.

Historical and Medicinal Uses- to boost the immune system by producing antibodies. Skin soothing. The mucilaginous quality of violet helps with respiratory ailments and sore throats. It can help lower cholesterol and balance the intestinal flora.

Nicholas Culpeper has lots to say in *The Complete Herbal and English Physician*, 1653, "Violets, (to wit, the blue ones) cool and moisten, provoke sleep, loosen the belly, resist fevers, help inflammations, correct the heat of choler, ease the pains in the head, help the roughness of the wind-pipe, diseases of the throat, inflammation of the breast and sides, pluries, open stoppings of the liver, and help the yellow jaundice."

"Violet is a little hearbe in substance, and is better fresh and newe, then when it is olde, and the flower thereof smelleth most, and so the smell thereof abateth heate of the braine, and refresheth and comforteth the spirites of feeling, and maketh sleepe, for it cooleth and tempereth and moysteneth the braine; and the more virtuous the flower thereof is the more it bendeth the head thereof downward." Bartholomaeus Anglicus, *De Proprietatibus Rerum*, 1240

John Gerard's *The Herbal or General Historie of Plantes*, 1597, "The floures are good for all inflammations, especially of the sides and lungs; they take away the hoarsenesse of the chest, the ruggednesse of the winde-pipe and jawes, and take away thirst. There is likewise made of Violets and sugar certaine plates called Sugar violet, or Violet tables, or Plate which is most pleasant and wholesome"

From "The Queen-like Closet" or "Rich Cabinet", Hannah Wooley, 1670, 149

To keep flowers all the year

"Take any sort of pretty flowers you can get, and have in readiness some Rosewater made very slippery by laying Gum Arabick therein. Dip your fingers well, and swing it out again, and stick them in a sieve to dry in the Sun, some other of them you may dust over with fine flour, and some searced Sugar, after you have wetted them, and so dry them. Either of them will be very fine, but those with sugar will not keep so well as the other; they are good to set forth Banquets, and to garnish Dishes, and will look very fresh, and have their right smell."

Here is a modern Recipe for Sugared Violets by Kaity Farrell, fareisle.com

4 dozen fresh violet flowers with stems for handling

1 egg white

100 grams superfine sugar

1. Lightly beat egg white in a bowl until frothy. 2. Working with one flower at a time, use a small paintbrush to paint a thin layer of egg on the front and back of each petal. 3. Hold the flower by the stem over the bowl and sprinkle sugar over the flower. Completely cover the front and back of the flower. 4. Place the flower onto a sheet of parchment paper or waxed paper to dry for at least 24 hours in a warm dry spot (or dehydrator). 5. Snip off the stems and place the fully dried flowers in an airtight container to store for up to 6 months
