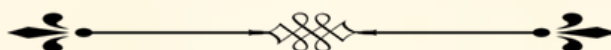

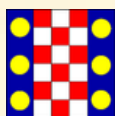

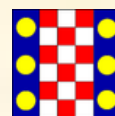




Kingdom Missives



From the Chancellor of the Exchequer



Unto the populace of the Kingdom of Lochac does Master Nicodemus Novello, Chancellor of the Exchequer, send greetings.

As required under Lochac Law, I am writing to provide you with a summary of the finances of your kingdom over the past year, and a comparison with figures for the year before.

As the Kingdom is not a legal entity, and exists in multiple legal jurisdictions, these reports are for the information of the Populace only. They do not constitute legal, financial, or regulatory reporting.

I will also stress that this report only describes the state of the finances of the Kingdom proper, not the finances of its many baronies, cantons, shires or colleges. If you want to know how your own group is faring, speak to your reeve (or attend a group meeting, at which they will be

reporting on a regular basis).

These figures also exclude money held by the corporate entities in each country (the SCA (Australia) Ltd and SCANZ Inc), which hold their own finances for mundane administration.

Figures referring to the Kingdom's finances in Australia are expressed in Australian dollars, and those referring to its finances in New Zealand are expressed in New Zealand dollars.

The Australian financial year runs from January 1st to December 31st, while the New Zealand financial year runs from April 1st to March 31st.

All these figures are inclusive of GST, and reported on a cash basis (i.e., they reflect what was actually paid to and from the kingdom account during each period, not what was potentially earned or payable). *Cont. next page...*

A couple of points worth noting about the Australian figures: the donations shown were actually received in 2016. It was only in 2025 that they were transferred to the Kingdom. The IT expenses refunded were costs incurred over several years by the Kingdom, which should have been paid from the Corporate accounts – for which the SCA Australia has now reimbursed the Kingdom. The amount shown as

a ‘transfer from Corporate’ represents new funding provided from the Corporate account, to serve as a replacement for money previously collected by the Kingdom through profit-sharing on Crown events.

From the Kingdom A&S Officer



Greetings Lochac,

It is my absolute pleasure to announce the first results from the Lochac A&S Championship for this new year...

At May Coronation in Sherwater, the first round for the championship year A.S. LXI was held.

We had a total of thirteen entries. Of these, three were judged in their local groups, and two used the online submission process (which seems to be working). Overall, there were five Experienced entries, six Intermediates, and two Beginners, across all three themes.

There were eight entries for the 'Silk' theme, four entries for 'Following the Crown' and just one 'Clerical Document' (apparently, the scribes were busy elsewhere).

One person entered twice, which means that while their work was fully examined, only the highest-scoring piece counts against the Championship.

The splendid volunteers managing the competitions on the day were a little muddled

about the awarding of prizes, and bells were given for both skill categories and themes. That slight confusion will not alter the progress of the Championship; bells are awarded to recognise achievement in one round only, while scores are in for the long haul, counting towards the year-long Championship. And I have the numbers, safely tucked away...

Regardless, well done to all whose work was deemed worthy of reward!

Results for the May Round are reported below using the traditional layout, based on the scores, although some entrants may well have received bells which are not mentioned here:

In the Experienced Category, the gold bell went to Signora Honesta Euphemia di Niccolo Ziani, for a pair of silk sleeves. In the Experienced Category, second place went to Lord Yda Plant, for their woven silk ribbons.

In the Intermediate Category, the gold bell went to Baroness Eleanor Hall, for a 'Silk' entry. In the Intermediate Category, second place went to Lady Batista de Bardi, for a Purple Silk Gown.

From the Kingdom Regnum Deputy



Greetings and Merry Winter Solstice time,

The seasonal wheel is a'turning once more – and there are many things for the Kingdom to look forward to. We celebrate our new King and Queen, Aonghus II & Ginevra II. May their second reign go well. Undoubtedly, new Officers will be appointed to replace those whose terms are ending. Let me take this opportunity to acknowledge all of those who take on the mantle of responsibility at whatever level.

Most of you should be aware that the Kingdom's Kingdom Chronicler is Lady Elizabeth Haworth from the Hamlet of Sherwater in the Crescent Isles. She has asked me to maintain the role of Deputy – Regnum – to support her in this role. My role will be to keep an eye any changes to the

Kingdom's Regnum listings found in Pegasus. This includes Royalty and Baronages.

Luckily for me, updating Lochac's Regnum list for Pegasus is a fairly easy process as we now have an automated system called "Regnumator" where the following information can be checked or updated:

- Officer warrants - including preferences for what is shown in Regnum (and subsequently Pegasus), such as preferred pronoun (optional) and title, local office name, and forwarding email.
- Membership status and contact information of those you need to know.

In addition, officers can:



- Mark themselves as retired or request an extension of their term from their upline officer. In this case the relevant group Seneschal automatically gets a copy of any email the Regnumator sends to an upline.
- Change the password of their office to a Lochac-hosted mailbox without needing to contact Masonry.

All Seneschals and any officer with a downline can manage the warrants of those officers and their local group changes, including Baronages. There are links on their office and mundane name, allowing you to quickly email them at either their public (strongly preferred) or personal email address. My role will primarily be to ensure that formalised positions are current.

This is where you come in – if you have recently taken on a warranted role or have become Royalty or Baronage – either the Kingdom Seneschal, Group Seneschal or your immediate upline Officer should be able to update your warrant.

If you are a warranted Officer with a downline – you can go in update your downline's warrant.

For example, as the Constable for the Barony of Politarchopolis – I can check and update the warrants for the groups within the Barony that report to me – currently the Cantons of Okewaite and Torlyon, as well as the Hamlet of Strathcorbie.

Greetings!

Are you keen on seeing archery flourish in the Kingdom? Then your Kingdom needs you to hit the target of Kingdom Archery Marshal! Want to know more?

Key requirements:

- You will need to be a current SCA member, 18 years or older
- Have knowledge and understanding of the Society and Kingdom rules as they pertain to combat archery, target archery and thrown weapons
- Reliable and responsive access to email and internet connection
- Ability to keep on top of a variety of related administrative tasks, including updating the Archers' website (Masonry can help with

that if need be).

Key elements of the job:

- encouraging the development of combat standards and chivalry on the field in all actions involving archery and other projectile weapons, in co-operation with the Marshallate
- maintaining and enforcing the Kingdom standards for construction and use of projectile weapons and armour for plumed combatants
- setting, maintaining and enforcing safety standards
- making regulations and information concerning target and combat archery available
- warranting the Captain of Archers for each group, and reporting and required

From the Kingdom Chronicler



Greetings Lochac!

Just some housekeeping from me this month.

Firstly, an issue has arisen around the use of personal emails and safety issues in mundane life. As such I am asking the populace to refrain from using personal information, such as mundane email addresses, as the point of contact for anything published for the SCA such as event and website contact details.

I have been advised by the Kingdom Webright Baron Sorle Maknicoll that there are ways to resolve the email issue. At a minimum an option would be to create a persona-specific email address (provided your persona has not adopted your mundane name) via a webmail account. A second, and our preferred option, is for people to use the Kingdom issued generic email addresses such as bookings@politarhropolis.lochac.sca.org or bandb@ildhafn.lochac.sca.org.

Baron Sorle has said the generic Kingdom emails should be used for mailing lists as well. As an addendum, the only people who may need to provide mundane contact details are seneschals, board members and reeves, and only then in specific contexts.

In regard to social media safety, the Kingdom Social Media Officer Lady Isabella Semeonova has asked me to remind people that once things are published online, such as personal contact details, they cannot be removed completely. While I am sure most if not all are aware of this,

I know the ubiquitousness of social media has left me at times complacent in this area, so being considerate about the details I or anyone wishes to share with complete strangers on places like Facebook and Discord is something to be mindful about.

Lady Isabella also asked me to remind people not to telegraph or share their location via social media while at events as this can put people at risk also. *Cont. next page...*

Moving now to plagiarism and copyright. For anything found online, such as but not inclusive to designs, images and videos - it is generally protected under mundane copyright law across the Kingdom, therefore written permission must be sought to publish it.

In regards to 2D renderings (photographs or scans) of public domain works (such as 14th century illuminations), while the USA allows for their use without permission, due to the automatic nature of our copyright laws there is some legal debate over whether the same laws apply here as the reproduction can generate a copyright claim of its own.

To avoid infringement risks many institutions enforce such copyright claims citing the effort, technical skill, and judgment required to light, photograph, or process the image. So, erring on the side of caution and seeking permission to use a facsimile of a public domain image is always a prudent course of action.

Also under our mundane laws, original creators are afforded inalienable moral rights which cannot be sold or transferred and as such no matter who holds the copyright, they must be properly attributed if they are different from the copyright holder.

This latter law is in line with the SCAs ideal of chivalry which holds respect for others' property, including intellectual property.

So, moving forward:

- **Written permission to be sought** when publishing text, photographs, drawings, poetry, artwork, videos or photographs in local newsletters, websites, social media or in advertising material, in full or in part.
- **Attribution is always required** even when permission is granted. This means the creator's name (when known) must be clearly acknowledged alongside the material, even if they are not the copyright holder. Note, attribution does not cancel out permission - both apply.
- **The "Middle Ages" misconception.** Just because we play in the past does not mean modern mundane laws do not apply to us - often research and articles about pre-1600 times are protected by law.

- **When sourcing from the public domain** you can reproduce actual pre-1600 illuminations, manuscripts, or text if the source material has expired into the public domain. However, be careful with modern digital facsimiles of those items, as the photographer or institution may hold a copyright on the image itself. If this is the case - refer back to permission and attribution.

For the populace's information, certain public institutions such as the Biblioteca Nacional de España, the British Library, and the Det Kongelige Bibliotek all have extensive image collections that are free for us to use, which means you do not have to seek written permission. We may do so as long as we follow their attribution processes, which usually includes where the image was obtained from and crediting the images creator. Note: You must, however, seek their written permission if you intend to alter or crop the image.

Also be aware that just because images are stored at these institutions, does not mean they hold the copyright, as such permission must be sought from the copyright holder. Commons sites will often link you to who owns the copyright to the image be it a museum or library or individual.

While there are always exceptions to the rule, if in doubt seek copyright permission and always give attribution to the work.

The role exists to ensure that youth activities within the Society comply with

both SCA policy and relevant state and territory child protection laws. This is an administrative and advisory role. It does not involve direct supervision of youth at events.

Key Responsibilities:

Youth Authorisation Administration Process and maintain Youth Authorisation Cards for members in accordance with Kingdom Youth and Child Protection policies. Review submitted documentation for completeness, accuracy, and compliance. Maintain secure and confidential records relating to youth authorisations. Provide guidance to local officers and members on the Youth Authorisation process when required.

*Working With Children Check*

(WWCC) Compliance Monitor Working With Children Check (WWCC) requirements across Australian states and territories. Maintain records of WWCC numbers, expiry dates, and applicable jurisdictions for relevant officers and volunteers. Ensure WWCCs are registered or verified with the appropriate state or territory government departments, where required. Provide reminders and guidance regarding renewals and ongoing compliance obligations.

Legislative and Regulatory Monitoring

Monitor changes to state and territory child protection legislation relevant to SCA activities in Australian (Terra Rosa). Advise the Kingdom Seneschal, Kingdom Youth Officer, and/or Kingdom Officers of any changes that may impact policy or practice. Assist in interpreting how legislative changes intersect with SCA policies and procedures.

Advisory and Reporting Functions:

Provide compliance advice to Kingdom and Baronial officers on youth-related matters.

Escalate any compliance concerns or identified risks promptly to the appropriate Kingdom officer. Assist with periodic reporting as required by Kingdom Youth or Seneschalate

structures.

Skills and Attributes:

From the Cook's Guild Administrator



Greetings Lochac,

The time has come (it's actually way overdue) for me to step down as the Guild Administrator for the Cook's Guild and call for expressions of interest in being the new Guild administrator.

The official duties of the Administrator, as set out in the Guild Charter, are as follows:

The Guild Administrator:

The administrative head shall be known as the Guild Administrator and may be of any rank. The Guild Administrator must maintain a current file of members and reply to their correspondence.

Each member's rank and progress must be recorded and filed. It is the duty of the Guild Administrator to notify members of their change in rank as it occurs. He or she should maintain and augment any Guild resources or index. The Guild Administrator reports to the Crown, the Lochac Minister of A&S and the Lochac Seneschal prior to Twelfth Night.

The Guild Administrator may appoint deputies and assistants as necessary (including, but not limited to, a newsletter editor and Web minister) and may appoint a substitute to run the Annual General Meeting if unable to attend).

The Administrative Head of the Guild should hold office for not more than two years (unless no other acceptable candidate is available. If this occurs, the administration position is renewed for a further six months until a replacement can be found).

The Administrator will select their successor based on merit and ability, and shall notify the Guild members in writing of change of administration details. If possible, the Administration position is to be passed to a Guild member from a different geographic area, ensuring Kingdom-wide rotation of position.

In the event of proven incompetence or mismanagement, an Administrator may be removed from the position by a majority vote of all active members.

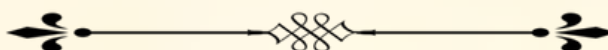
We are in the middle of a large overhaul of the Guild Charter and Rankings system.

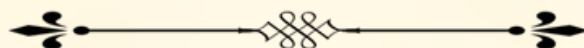

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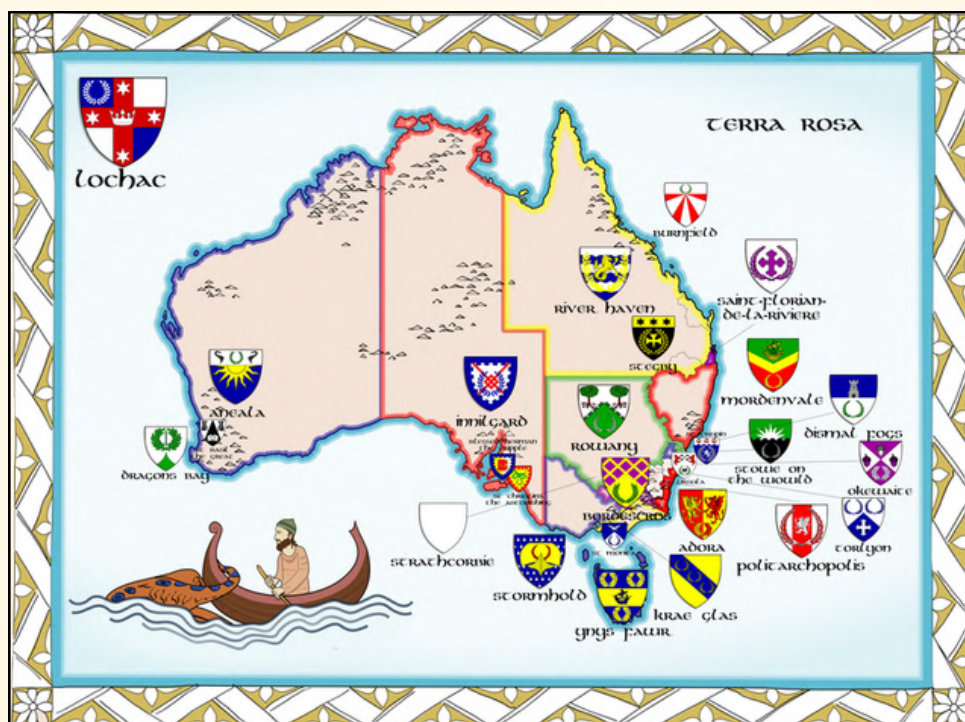

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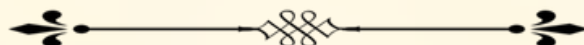
