Sundial Activity for All

An Easy Sundial Activity for Smalls and Their Families

Sundials are both medieval and functional. The only problem is how long it takes to design and assemble an accurate one. So, this article describes a sundial design that can be completed in under an hour and results in an accurate time piece. It's quick to complete because it's a paper folding and gluing activity. It's accurate because its design documents the two paper folds needed for the sundial's latitude of use.

Why do sundials work? Sundials can accurately track the passage of time because Earth rotates uniformly on its axis once every day. Since there are 360 degrees in one full rotation and 24 hours (relative to the sun) in a day, the sun appears to travel 15 degrees per hour. So, any device showing the movement of shadows cast by the sun can track time. It's just a matter of marking off 15-degree changes in the sun's shadow and tilting the sundial's face to the correct angle. A sundial is easier to make when it points north and is tilted at an angle equal to its latitude. The sundial in this activity does that and is called a Polar Dial. By the way, a sundial that isn't tilted at its latitude can still be accurate. But this takes more time to design properly.

Making the Sundial

Following this article you'll find a PDF of the sundial. At the top of the PDF is the sundial. At the bottom right is the gnomon, or shadow caster. At the bottom left is the Equation of Time, or a table of corrections needed for all sundials. Copy the PDF onto a sheet card stock, rather than paper. On paper, the sundial will be too flimsy to be durable.

In addition to card stock, you'll need foam core or corrugated cardboard for the sundial's base. Also, some heavy poster board or even better yet, picture mat for the gnomon. Cut the base into a six inch by six inch square. The mat board will become the sundial's gnomon and is cut out using the gnomon pattern on the card stock.

Carefully cut out the three pieces of the sundial out of the card stock. You'll notice that the bottom of the gnomon has angles labeled on it for the latitudes of 30, 35, 40, and 45 degrees. Trim the gnomon for the latitude of its use using these guide lines. Then transfer the cut-out gnomon pattern onto the heavy card board or mat board. Cut the final gnomon out of the heavy car board.

Now comes the bending of the sundial into its final shape. The dashed lines indicate where the sundial is folded. The dashed lines at the bottom and outer left and right sides are for the dial's foot. The bottom foot has a single dashed line, but the out side left and right feet have multiple dashed lines for the sundial's latitude of use. Pick the best angle from the ones shown and bent the card stock there. It's best to crease or score the dashed lines prior to folding. I found that the sharp narrow edge of a metal ruler works well for this. Then you can lay the ruler flat against the line and make a sharp bend along the creased line. These three edges are bent up.

There are three more dashed lines at the top of the dial and two more on the left and right side of the sundial's face. These lines are bent down and not up like the last three dashed lines. Since the sundial pattern is printed on only one side of the card stock, you'll need to carefully mark the location of these dashed lines on the underside of the sundial. Then crease and bend them.

If you've bent the dashed lines correctly, you'll be able to fold the sundial into a 3D shape looking like the one pictured in this article. The sundial's feet create a good foundation for gluing the sundial to its base. Note that the hatched marks in the top of the sundial are tabs and are glued to the inside of the sundial, where they won't show up. If the tabs are glued to the outside of the dial, it's no problem. The sundial will just look a little funny.

Start assembling the sundial by gluing its side tabs down and to the sundial's sides using a thin and even layer of glue (remember, the tabs go inside the sundial's body). It doesn't take much glue, so go easy here. Too much glue makes the card stock soft and soggy. And the result will be a sundial that doesn't have sharp and accurate corners. Hold the glued overlaps together while the glue sets up. Since only a little glue is used, it will dry fast.

Now the sundial is ready to be glued to its base. Make sure the three bottom edges are folded outward with crisp edges. Apply a light coating of glue to the bottom of the feet and place the sundial on its base. Quickly position

the sundial so that its sides are vertical. Center the sundial on the base as best you can. Remember, the glue will set up fast.

Next, glue the Equation of Time table to the sundial base and inside the sundial's opened back. Use a thin and even layer of white glue. Alternatively, you can use a glue stick, which also does a fine job of this.

Finally for the gnomon. Begin by dry fitting the gnomon. Its long edge lies over the 12 o'clock mark (between XI and I on the sundial's face) and its bottom sits on the center line drawn on the sundial's bottom foot. The gnomon's bottom is the end that was cut for the dial's latitude. If the dial is put together well, the gnomon's foot will sit flat on the base of the sundial. If not, try flipping the gnomon over, just in case you got it upside down. Now apply a thin coat of glue to the two edges of the gnomon that contact the sundial. Hold the gnomon perpendicular to the sundial while the glue dries.

Now you have completed your sundial. You should find that its card stock body makes a very stiff 3D shape.

Using the Sundial

First, place the sundial on a level surface. Turn the sundial so the North arrows on its sides are pointing north. Use true north and not magnetic north for your location. The sundial will tell the time when the shadow cast by the sun begins crossing the sundial's face at 7:30 AM and leaves the sundial's face at 4:30 PM.

But wait, the dial's time doesn't correspond to your cell phone's time. What gives? There are a couple of factors that make reading sundial time slightly more complicated than reading a clock. For one, Earth's orbit around the sun is elliptical. Also, its spin axis is tilted 23.5 degrees. These two factors make the sun appear to speed up and slow down throughout the year. But sundials are designed for the sun's apparent average movement, which is 15 degrees per hour. Fortunately, the variation between the true sun and the average sun is easy to account for with the Equation of Time table that's glued in the back of the sundial. The table indicates how many minutes to add or subtract to the dial's time according to the day of the year. So, if you're using the dial on May 15th, subtract four minutes from the dial's time. You can interpolate for days not listed in the table.

The second factor preventing a sundial from telling clock time is that they're designed to tell local solar time and we live in a world of standard time zones (thank the railroads for that). Local solar time is just that, local. Move one degree east or west (about 60 miles at 40 degrees north latitude) and the local solar time changes by four minutes. Compare this to standard time zones where everyone within the same time zone has the same exact time.

Ideally, time zones begin at the following longitudes.

Eastern: 75 degrees west **Central:** 90 degrees west **Mountain:** 105 degrees west **Pacific:** 120 degrees west **Alaska:** 135 degrees west **Hawaii-Aleutian:** 150 degrees west

To correct for the sundial's location within a time zone, take the difference of your longitude from the longitude of your time zone. Then multiply that difference by four. The result is the number of minutes that need to be added to the sundial's indicated time. As an example, I live on the western edge of the Barony of Arn Hold. My longitude is 116 degrees west. I am a resident of the Mountain Time zone, so my time zone begins at 105 degrees west. The difference between my longitude and the longitude of my time zone is eleven degrees. Four times eleven is 44. So, I must add 44 minutes to my sundial's time.


This final correction is fixed and does not change as long as the sundial is not moved. Of course, add an hour to the sundial's indicated time during Daylight Saving Time.

There you have it, a sundial that's an easy paper folding project and accurate. Feel free to use this project at art and science classes, projects at events, or even share it with the mundanes.

Random Carp that I have learned...

A look at modern practices and their medieval sources

Cha if by land, Tea if by sea. Tea originated in China and it is represented by the letter "荼". This character was called "cha" in the Cantonese pronunciation in central and mainland China and "te" in Min Nan variety of Chinese, spoken in the coastal province of Fujian along the southeast coast of China. The first western mention of the leaves was in Delle navigationi e viaggi by Venetian geographer Giambattista Ramusio, published in 1545. He mentioned chiai in his compilation of first-hand travel accounts to China, starting with Marco Polo.

In the 1590s, the Portuguese brought back cha from Macau, as traded to them by Cantonese. It wasn't until the Dutch and the Dutch East India Company moved a cargo of tea from Macau to Java and then on to Europe in 1607 that the Min Nan pronunciation came west. As the Dutch trading increased, the fashionable drink gained followers in Germany, France, and New Amsterdam.

Russia first brought чай (chai) home to the Tsar in 1567 via the Mongolian Khan, and within 100 years there was a steady exchange of furs from the north for dried leaves via camel caravans. Tea in English did not get mentioned until a visit to Japan in 1615, and it was 1657 before tea was first sold in a coffee house in London. Catherine, wife of Charles II brought tea into the Royal Court, but it remained expensive until expanded trade in the 18th century, shifting from a luxury drink to an everyday beverage at all levels. Elimination of the tea tax in 1785 eliminated smuggling, and within 100 years, boosted by cultivation in Imperial India, it became the caffeine of choice for the Isles.

Nowadays, cha/tea is grown across tropical and subtropical climates in Asia, Africa, South America, and the Caspian region, with special varieties growing in the marine climates of Cornwall, Perthshire, Hobart, Washington, and Vancouver. So enjoy your cha/chai/tea, and now you know more random carp.
