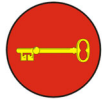

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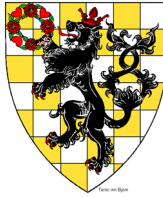

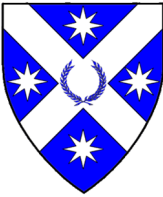

The Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA) Inc. is seeking candidates for the position of Society Exchequer. This position reports to the SCA Inc. Corporate Treasurer.

Duties and responsibilities:

Help Kingdoms balance their Consolidated report with group reports;

Review documents compiled by NMR deputy;

Review quarterly reports on kingdom-level accounts;

Review Kingdom and inter-Kingdom financial policies to make sure they are in compliance with the Society Financial Policy and submit revised financial policies to the SCA Inc. Board of Directors for approval;

Review inter-Kingdom Event Financial Policies and submit to the Corporate Treasurer and the Board for approval;

Report quarterly to the Corporate Treasurer and the Board of Directors and report the meeting results to the Kingdom Exchequers;

Travel as required to support Kingdom Exchequers, including for training, book reviews, and theft investigations;

Conduct supplemental training of Kingdom Exchequers and assist training of local exchequers;

Oversee book reviews of Kingdom books and ensure Kingdoms are reporting;

Maintain the Kingdom Exchequer email list for the SCA Inc. IT manager and notify the IT manager of any changes;

Notify Kingdom Exchequers of any changes in policy or procedure, including consulting with them to develop any necessary new policies;

Maintain the various exchequer handbooks/manuals and republish them at least every three years;

Maintain the various exchequer reporting forms and update them as needed;

Serve as subject matter expert for questions

from the Kingdom Exchequers as well as the general populace;

Warrant Kingdom Exchequers and special deputies;

Communicate with banks where necessary;

Monitor use of PayPal and the training by PayPal Specialist;

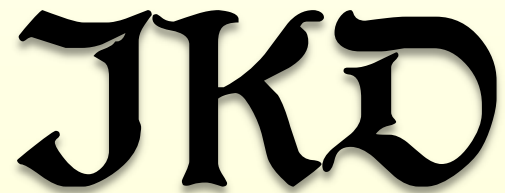

Jstruggled with including “The Sensible Cook: Dutch Foodways in the Old and New World” by Peter G. Rose Syracuse University Press, 1989 as a part of *Eat This Book*. Most of the books included in this column are centered in a pre-1600 time-period. Occasionally I will include a book slightly out of the time period, but usually only if they have a direct and specific link to pre-1600. “The Sensible Cook” was originally published in 1667, however it owes much to the more than 10 Dutch cookbooks published between 1510 and 1598 such as “Een Notabel Boecxke van Cokerije” (A Notable Book of Cookery) by Tomas vander Noot (1510) and “Eenen Seer Schonen ende Excellentent Coc-boeck” (A beautiful and excellent cookbook) by Carolus Battus (1589). Neither these two books or any of the other eight have been translated or studied in English or are readily available to the general public in case you read old Dutch. Fortunately, Ms. Rose’s book includes in her introduction, as well as scattered throughout the book, abundant material relevant to a pre-1600 Dutch kitchen. She has also included information from modern Dutch sources not accessible to us such as Lambertus Burema’s “De Voeding in Nederland van de Middeleeuwen tot de Twintigste Eeuw” (Food in the Netherlands from the Middle Ages to the Twentieth Century) published in 1953. Burema’s book gives us much information, including menus, ingredients, recipes, and cooking methods from the time period we study, all of which Ms. Rose uses in “The Sensible Cook”. Also, in the introduction are many interesting tidbits about flour and bread in the Dutch world. Dutch ships were especially important in transporting Baltic grain into the European markets. Rose calculates the Dutch transport of the yearly exports of “68,500 last” to be about 70%. When we think about Dutch food pancakes, waffles and wafers come immediately to mind. The imported Baltic grain was used to produce these staple Dutch products which can be found among the recipes included in “The Sensible Cook”. You will also find 24 period paintings, photographs of dishes used in period, woodcuts of manuscript pages, etc. Many of these are pre-1600 and illustrate the rich and flavor-filled tables of the Dutch people.

After the 36-page, information packed, “Introduction” the book continues with the translation and editorial comments of “The Sensible Cook” which is sub-titled “or Careful Housekeeper”. The title page goes on to tell us you will find instructions “to cook, stew, roast,

fry, bake and prepare all sorts of Dishes . . . with the appropriate Sauces”. “The Sensible Cook also shows us how “to prepare many kinds of CAKES and PASTRIES” and this version of the book is “Enlarged, with the DUTCH BUTCHERING TIME” and “the SENSIBLE CONFECTIONER, instructing how to prepare and preserve good and useful confections from many kinds of Fruits, Roots, Flowers, and Leaves, etc.” Interestingly the book is written “To all cooks, male and female”, which we see more and more of after the turn of the century and the rise and cementing of the middle classes. The first 16 recipes in the cookbook are all vegetable preparation. Artichokes, radishes, salads, sugar peas, turnips, and others are detailed in their preparation with herbs, spices, butter and other tasty additions. After the vegetable recipes the book continues with a huge variety of recipes for meat. Mutton, Veal Knuckles, Hens, one served with Cauliflower, pigeons, ducks, and the new import from the Americas, turkey all have recipes on how to prepare them in delicate and delicious ways. There are also many recipes for hare and rabbit. Many earlier cookbooks have one or two recipes for rabbit, hare or coney, but not nearly as many as included in “The Sensible Cook”.

Try the “Pepper-sauce for roasted Hare” with toasted rye bread, sweet wine, pepper and cloves. On page 62 you will find two of the first recipes for stuffing made with bread. The first one is made with white bread crumbs, prunes, currants, cloves, nutmeg, cinnamon and is stuffed into a suckling pig. The second has grated white bread, hard boiled egg yolks, bacon, smoked meat, mace, pepper, ginger and saffron and is stuffed into a young hen then stewed with butter wine and water. The broth is then finished with verjuice and saffron. There is also a whole section on preparing fish and seafood. The roasted sturgeon basted with butter and then stewed with “Rhenish wine” vinegar, cinnamon and nutmeg sounds delightful. “The Sensible Cook” itself also has some sweet treats such as a “Kandeel (drink)”, which we know as a caudle, made with Rhenish wine” sugar, mace, nutmeg, cinnamon and cloves. There are many custards including plain milk custard, apple custards, and lemon custard. The final recipes in “The Sensible Cook” portion of the translation are for all sorts of tarts, sweet and savory, meat and fruit, vegetables and herbs. There are also two reci-

pes for tart crusts. One with wheat-flour, butter, rosewater, sugar and eggs and the other that is enriched with cream. Pastry recipes are not unusual in post-1600 cookbooks, but are extremely rare pre-1600.

Eat This Book

The next two sections are “enlarged” or included as extras in “The Sensible Cook”. “The Dutch Butchering Time” is an excellent resource on how to prepare your space, salt and smoke your meat, and how to prepare all parts and pieces of the animal. “The Sensible Confectioner” goes into details on preserving with honey, how to make candied walnuts, apples, pears, and quinces, and all sorts of other sweet treats. It also includes four marmalade recipes, and several recipes for syrups and fruit sauces. Ms. Rose also includes 24 “Recipes for Modern Kitchens”. Twelve of these are from “The Sensible Cook” and twelve are “Recipes from the Dutch Colonial Past”. A short glossary, a fairly extensive bibliography and an index are also included.

What is your SCA name?

MeiLan Hua

How long have you been a scribe?

I started my scribal journey around October of 2000. I came to my first SCA fight practice in Borealis, and saw that people were doing some pretty cool stuff.

How did you become a scribe?

I started my scribal journey in An Tir because there was a lack of scribes in the area. I further honed my techniques and skills by studying in

What do you enjoy most about being a scribe?

I enjoy helping others become recognized for their skills and contributions to this wonderful game that we play. I enjoy pushing my artistic boundaries to create a piece of art that someone would appreciate and love.

Have you ever held an office/ position as a Scribe?

I am the Scrivener Royal of Atlantia to Ragnarr Blackhammer V and Mary Isabel I. It's a position unique to Atlantia it is a kingdom notable position for someone to serve the Crown for their reign as their personal scribe. The new scrivener royal is selected at a competition

held at Coronation.

What is your scribal pet peeve?

My scribal pet peeve is someone dictating what sort of writing surface I should use.

Was there anyone what helped you along your scribal journey that you would like to acknowledge?

I would love to thank the librarians, archivists, historians and hobbyists who painstakingly digitized and translated illuminated manuscripts. Without them, we wouldn't have as many extant samples to study. Their work has helped further scribal arts more than any one person in my scribal journey. Because of their work, we now have more information on what period techniques and materials were used to create these manuscripts. We owe a lot to the progression of our field to their hard work.

Do you have any special tips, tricks, or techniques that you use or have learned through your scribal journey?

During the planning phase of the scroll, figure out if you're either working to create an art piece with period elements or making a copy of an extant. It'll save you a lot of frustration down the line.

Have you ever done an original award? If so, what did you learn though the process? Do you have any advice you would pass on to someone new to original work?

Almost all of my scrolls are original works. I'm usually directly contacted by the kingdom Signet for an original in a particular style. If I know I'm working on a specific style or technique. I also send out several messages throughout the year to different Signets to see anyone in their queue needs a scroll. My advice to someone new is to under that over time a scribe develops their own eye and their own gut feelings about a design. Trust your eye to recognize the medieval style and your gut so you don't make a piece you're not proud of. I

would want a knew scribe to know that they don't need to break the budget in order to make a beautiful scroll. To date, I've made numerous high merit awards and peerage scrolls at different price points ranging from materials I bought at Michaels to as-close-as-period-as-possible with vellum and hand ground pigments. Some have won major kingdom-level or inter-kingdom competitions. Cost should not deter you from pursuing your passion. Getting to know the surface that you're working on and the medium that will work best with that surface will take you a long way. Knowing that most Pergamenata paper is a laminate surface and can be prepped with sanding and pounce before working on it can achieve different results. Knowing that there are still Italian paper factories started in the 13th century are still in operation and producing paper in the same manner with the same techniques is important. Also knowing that the closest relative to this paper is Arches hot press is good to know. For the budget-conscious, Artist Loft Mixed Media heavy weight paper sold at commercial retailers in North America is rated as an excellent surface for watercolor, gouache and India ink will take you far. Knowing that visually, 18 kt gold and 24 kt

gold on a manuscript is difficult to discern when seen at standard viewing range. But applying a tint to 10 kt gold appear to have a slight patina commonly seen with early period manuscript will be the difference of spending hundreds of dollars versus a few dollars.

What is your favorite Kingdom Award that you have painted, calligraphed, or designed? Why is that your favorite?

I have done scrolls for multiple kingdoms. Since almost all of my scrolls are original, my favorites to work on are based on the names of the awards. I love awards that feature nature, and specifically maple trees. I go out of my way to track down these awards because I love how delicate the leaves look. My favorite awards to work on include the Golden Maple Leaf of Artemesia, and the Order of the Sycamore of Aethelmearc. I'm still waiting to do an Order of the Evergreen for the Midrealm, but I'm sure an assignment will appear on the horizon. I also love creating the Nautical-themed Atlantian awards. There's something tranquil about the combinations of blues and

silvers to recreate the look of waves crashing on the beach.

What is the best or most impactful piece of advice you have ever received through your scribal journey?

At the scribal journey, I received a compliment about my potential as a scribe, but I struggled to find opportunities to contribute to and create as many scrolls as I wanted to in order to further develop and prove my skill. I was given the excellent advice that you should never be afraid to create work for baronies, principalities and kingdoms beyond your own. Doing so will often open doors to opportunities and expose you to more knowledge, skills and experience. This will give you many more chances to create beautiful art for others, and will also give you an appreciation for the many different ways that the scribal arts are practiced across the Known World

Is there anything that you would say to your younger scribal self just starting out on this path?

Ask for more original scroll options. At the kingdom level or baronial level.

Is there anything else that you would like to say or add as an An Tir Spotlight Scribe?

My advice is to work on art that you will love, even if it's not mainstream. Make something that you will be proud of and enjoy doing. The caveat to this is that it may not be everyone's cup of tea, if you focus on one particular area then you may not get much work. But know that somewhere out there, someone could have been waiting a very long time for someone who genuinely loves that particular art style to create art in the style of their persona.

From the Youth Rapier Deputy

KIDS PLAYING WITH SWORDS, SAFELY

Do you have offspring who loves swords? Are they between the ages of 6 to 14? If so, you're about to make some kids very happy!

In 2019 the Kingdom of An Tir introduced Youth Rapier as an authorized martial sport. While there was some initial gain in members, COVID was a brutal blow and the program needs rejuvenation.

WHAT CAN WE DO TO HELP KIDS WHO WANT TO PLAY WITH SWORDS?

An Tir currently has 6 authorized marshals and 4 youth combatants and we definitely need more support, and you could be the key to putting swords in small hands. You don't even need to have children to become a Youth Rapier Martial, just the dream of children and youth playing with swords.

1. TO BECOME A YOUTH RAPIER MARSHAL, FOLLOW THESE SURPRISINGLY SIMPLE STEPS: Read the [Youth Rapier Book of Combat](https://antir.sca.sharepoint.com/sites/library/Documents/Forms/AllItems.aspx?id=%2Fsites%2Flibrary%2FDocuments%2FMarshallate%20%20Public%20Web%20Documents%2FYouth%2FAnTir%5FBook%5Fof%5FYouth%5FRapier%5FCombat%2Epdf&parent=%2Fsites%2Flibrary%2FDocuments%2FMarshallate%20%20Public%20Web%20Documents%2FYouth&p=true&ga=1) (<https://antir.sca.sharepoint.com/sites/library/Documents/Forms/AllItems.aspx?id=%2Fsites%2Flibrary%2FDocuments%2FMarshallate%20%20Public%20Web%20Documents%2FYouth%2FAnTir%5FBook%5Fof%5FYouth%5FRapier%5FCombat%2Epdf&parent=%2Fsites%2Flibrary%2FDocuments%2FMarshallate%20%20Public%20Web%20Documents%2FYouth&p=true&ga=1>)
2. Speak with your branch's Seneschal to obtain a criminal background check, this process takes anywhere from a week to 2 months to complete.
3. Once that is completed, reach out to me, the An Tir Youth Rapier Deputy, at YouthCombatRapierDeputy@antir.org and we can continue the process.

You can then start running practices in your local branch as soon as you are a Junior Martial and work towards your Senior Martial.
