

From The Sponsor of War College 2025


Greetings to Ealdormere,

Viscount Mordain's Class : The Column


The Ealdormere Column:

This is a formation we often used in field battles before we fell away from the practice. It consists of a column four fighters wide with each row being made up of two pairs of fighters. The leader is in front of the column and it is their job to choose the pace of the column, and the direction.

The purpose is to maneuver the column into the best position to attack the enemy, ideally hitting a flank. Once contact is made each pair of fighters heads to expand the line from the point of impact until the whole column is engaged.

Ideally the enemy is crushed and we reform on the banner and a new target is chosen. Indeed that occasionally happened. However if a good target was chosen we have at least mangled an enemy unit and we often caused an outsized impact compared to our numbers.


Duchess Kaylah's Battlefield Pictionary

The majority of attendees at this War College had extensive battlefield experience and command experience. But there's still a few folks who are newer. These are ones we'd love to teach!

Rather than try the patience of those who are already familiar with Ealdormerian battle commands by providing lengthy didactic explanations, I thought it would be more fun to present the concepts in Pictionary form, then encourage those who are unfamiliar with the answers to find a buddy to ask for more detailed information. This is a teaching technique called "jigsawing".

Interestingly, it worked. Several newer fighters sought out trusted older fighters and had illuminating conversations.

Topic: Combatants Choice of Action **Ironman**: Combatants who participate in both armoured and fencing combat. Clearly, a group with FOMO. At Pennsic: to earn Battlefield Ironman status one must "fight 'em all and fence 'em all". Topic: Combatants Choice of Action **Running with Scissors**: **Only join this team if you run fast!** A suicide charge at the start of an objective type battle (flag or majority ground). The fastest runners will over-shoot the objective, slowing the opponents advance. The next fastest runners will set up the first line of defense, the next will reinforce, etc.





Topic: Combatants Choice of Action **Rest at the Banner**: Banners always need to be defended. Go rest there. It's a useful thing to do. Topic: Combatants Choice of Action **Rez if You're Injured**: Unless you are defending an essential objective at a critical time, don't hang around with one arm or leg. Go get resurrected. Be healed. Fight with all your limbs. You're more useful this way.

Topic: Battle Plans Horns of the Bull: Double Envelopment Both flanks advance quickly, while the center advances slower, forming a U-Shaped battlefield, hopefully enveloping the opposing armies. **Topic: Field Commands**

Killing Pocket:

In a limited front scenario, set up a concave skirmish line. Do not advance this line, allow the opponents to come to us.

Topic: Field Commands Stay the Line: Do not advance the skirmish line. Used when your army has sufficient control of the objective such as a flag or center real estate on a bridge. Never yell "Hold the line". You know why. **Topic: Battle Plans**

wirl of Death

Swirl of Death: One hard fast flank, usually countered by a hard fast flank by the opposing team, resulting in a swirling of the battlefield.

Sir Varenko's Bridge Battles

On the Bridge:

1.Understand the ranges, leverage them for advantage if no range weapons, close to where you can get parity

2. Moving people can be as important as killing them



Fencing Class Title: Compare & Contrast Melee Life Scenarios : Life Choices

Instructor Duchess Kaylah

Class Description: You're gonna die. And that's ok.

This is a live melee exercise in comparative melees. How do you feel, existentially, about your existence with one life, 3 lives or unlimited resurrection. How do the life conditions impact strategy?

The Action: After dividing into teams, we will fight 3 sets of melees.

First set will be single life. We'll do this 3x, because it's so fast.

Second set will be 2 resurrections, which is 3 lives. We'll do this twice.

Final set will be unlimited resurrections for a time limit to be determined by the number of participants.

After the fighting, there will be a very brief existential discussion. All participants are encouraged to continue to meditate upon the various life scenarios at their own pace. Talk with your carpool buddies on the way home, enjoy a beverage in the evening and think about it.

Master Rigel's "How to Watch a Fight"



The class was a workshop in how to watch a fight, focused on fencing. Hopefully this type of workshop is helpful not only to fencers, to help figure out their opponents, but also to spectators, who want to understand what's going on in a fight.

We started with some thought experiments and discussion of theory, about a single fencer. For example, the first question when you line up against a fencer should be "what do I see"... what weapons do they have? Are they left handed or right handed? Are they standing dominant foot forward?

The answers to these questions begin to tell you a little bit about what you will need to defend against. For example, a fencer with sword and dagger standing with the sword side forward has a very dangerous weapon quite close to you, but the dagger isn't as much of a danger for a primary attack.





These sorts of things are also interesting and useful for a spectator to note. They tell you a little bit ahead of time of what is *likely* to happen. Sometimes the answers aren't very obvious, such as with someone who brings out a case of rapiers.

We also discussed watching your opponent to see if they give you an evident sense of timing. For example, bobbing their sword to a beat. They will be more ready to attack a specific points in that cadence. You can use this to your advantage and attack them in syncopation to their beat, thus gaining yourself a few milliseconds of advantage.

From there, the workshop moved on to practicing the lessons learned, and everyone took turns fencing against other people while the rest of the crowd watched. Both the observers and the combatants were asked about what happened, because in this way we can start to build up our skills in watching a fight, and in being aware of what is happening in a fight that we're a part of.
