- * Ailbhe éccnaid. Device. Per chevron inverted azure and gules, a demi-sun issuant from the line of division and two pens crossed in chevron inverted Or.
- * Bermund Wandelber. Name and device. Or, a chevron azure between a bear statant gules and a tower issuant from base sable.
- * **Brúsi of Dragonvale**. Reblazon of device. Sable, an annulet of three dragons tergiant wings displayed in annulo Or.
- * Elisif Hjáræna. Name and device. Per pale sable and argent, a light-skinned frauenadler proper crined and feathered per pale argent and gules, on a chief gules three sexfoils argent.
- * Luijt Bove. Name and device. Per bend argent and papellony sable and argent, a dragon in annulo vorant of its own tail sable.
- *Ulfviðr náttfari Felixsson frá Hrafnseyri. Name change from Ulfviðr náttfari Hrafnsson.

After a round table discussion with many of the heralds present, it was noted that several items



Greetings Lochac,

My warrant has been extended and I will be stepping down in May.

Wanted: Someone to care for the various Arts and Sciences beloved by the artisans of our great Kingdom! Be amazed at and humbled by the skill and enthusiasm of our Kingdom, and play a role in supporting and developing a myriad of programs and events.

The Kingdom Minister of Arts and Sciences is one of the Greater Kingdom Officer roles ultimately responsible for the administration of all A&S in Lochac. You will be in fealty to the Crown, and typically have a two-year term.

Key requirements:

- You will need to be a current SCA member, 18 years or older.
- Reliable and responsive access to email
 Ability to keep on top of a variety of A&S-related administrative tasks.

Key elements of the job:

- Taking care of the Kingdom's A&S website and Facebook group (directly or through deputies).
- Administration of the KMoAS email account and A&S Officer email list.
- Managing Kingdom-level competitions, and encouraging their uptake across the Kingdom.
- Oversight of the Guilds and Cockatrice.
- Reporting quarterly to the Kingdom Seneschal and Society Minister for A&S, as well as reading and replying to reports from the Kingdom's local groups.
- Caring for and administering local A&S officers.
- Being available to the populace to answer their questions on A&S, and listen to ideas on how we could be better.

Promoting the amazing artisans we have in this Kingdom, so more people can hear of their skills.

Some of these can be shared to deputies if they are not your interest or skill set - except reporting and officer administration. You will be supported by useful resources on competition guidance and procedures and notes on how to do the tasks listed above, as well as reports and A&S group Officers spread across the Kingdom.

Powder Horn Herald

Role description:

Records management for the College, which primarily involves keeping Canon Lore data "clean" and accurate. This involves liaising with Canon, Rocket and Quarrel Heralds.

Currently, all "Fix Me" requests from Canon Lore go to the Powder Horn's email address.

The Criteria for holding this office are:

- * Internet access.
- * Able and willing to promptly response to queries.
- * Able to investigate and cross-check multiple sources to find information.
- * (Desirable) a knowledge of database designs and SQL.

Daily Tasks:

* Check the Powder Horn email account (see below) for any "Fix Me" request or other correspondence and action as appropriate.

Monthly Tasks:

* Add name registrations from the latest LoAR into Canon Lore, if they do not already exist. This often involves checking against mundane names on the submission forms held in OSCAR to avoid creating duplicate person entries.

As Required:

- * Update Canon Lore to match new devices added to the Lochac Roll of Arms.
- * Advise Crux Australis on records management issues as requested.
- * Report twice a year to Crux Australis, with cc to Canon Herald.

- * Produce a Record Management Policies and Procedure manual for the College (very little done so far) specifying what information gets recorded, for what purpose, where and how it is stored, and how and when it is destroyed.
- * Identify and fix errors and omission in Canon Lore.
