



Continue exemplifying the virtues of inclusivity, courtesy, and kindness, virtues which have long been the cornerstone of our noble realm, and which we hold in the highest esteem. In brief; to enter spring crown either the fighter or consort must -

- ◆ Service have held an SCA office, run an event, run a regular SCA event (eg local A&S) or other like service within the last two years.
- ◆ Arts and Science run a class, entered a competition, performed (i.e. performed a song at an event) or another similar activity within the last two years.
- ◆ The consort and fighter are both required honour the rules of fair play and the sanctity of the tournament.
- Format A round robin with a best of three final, should numbers preclude a round robin, the rounds will be decided in a triple elimination.

Apdate Re Crown Tournament

Greetings Lochac,

The important bit, **Letters of Intent** for the upcoming Crown Tournament are due by **August 31st.**

As the upcoming crown tournament approaches we, your ever so humble King and Queen, invite you to participate in this grand event. The Official invite as follows with much less wildebeests and more official stuff.

To enter you must:

- Be a current SCA member and maintain your membership throughout your reign.
- Include your membership number and expiry date with your letter of intent.
- Supply your mundane name and SCA name along with how you wish to be announced by the heralds at the tournament, including preferred pro-nouns.
- Be willing/able to obtain/maintain a passport throughout the reign.
- Be 18 years or older on Sept 7th 2024.
- Swear to attend the subsequent three Crown events (Spring Coronation, March Crown and May Coronation).
- Be willing to swear fealty to Lochac for the duration of the reign.
- Both be deemed acceptable to the Crown.
- Send a Letter of Intent to the Crown by August 31st (see Crown Requirements below).

Who may enter the tournament:

 Any currently authorised heavy fighter, whatever their status or experience, partnered with a consort.

Tournament Format:

- All weapon forms acceptable to armoured combat on a tournament field.
- If the number of combatants is less than 12: round robin format.
- If there are more than 12 combatants: single kill, triple elimination.

How to enter:

- Letter of Intent may be sent via email to crown@lochac.sca.org, or presented to the Crown at a Royal event.
- Please append contact details for both participants: SCA/mundane names; email/phone number; preferred titles and pronouns; membership and authorisation periods.

Crown Requirements:

- Appropriate heraldic display upon the field and for Invocation Court: e.g. banners/ standards/merki, painted shields, tabards/livery, covered mundanities, etc.
- Letters of Intent: simple emails are acceptable, but feel free to get creative.
- One of the partnership must have participated in a suitable A&S activity in the last 2 years.
 (run a class, hosted on-line A&S based event, been a A&S officer or deputy, performed at an event etc).
- One of the partnership must have contributed service back to the society in the last 2
 years. (held a local or kingdom office, run an event, marshalled, been herald or otherwise
 supported an event, etc).

Strong recommendations:

- Read Kingdom Law
 (https://seneschal.lochac.sca.org/files/2021/10/LochacLaws-October-2021.pdf, especially "Section III. The Crown").
- Talk to former Crowns or Landed baronages.
- Have a draft plan in case you win.



As always, there is a lot happening in Lochac. We have a new Kingdom Hospitaller (Lady Madelaine le Mercer). We have a new Seneschal for Politarchopolis (Master Crispin Sexi). We are advertising or in commentary for Mordenvale, Stormhold, and Aneala. We are also in commentary for a new Provost of Scribes. We have Radburne War and the Guilded Symposium both at the end of August, followed by Spring Crown in Torlyon, and Spring War in early October. These are just a few of the events offered in the coming months.

I would also like to congratulate the East Kingdom for achieving something extraordinary, receiving permission to hold an experimental rapier Crown in 2025-26. It will be interesting to see the results.

In Lochac the Alternate Crown working group is currently drafting the final poll. Each choice needs to be described in enough detail to ensure people are comfortable with making an informed choice. This should be out in a month or so.

We also have some changes to groups in Lochac. The household of Radburne has now become the Hamlet of Radburne, in western NSW. Also the Hamlet of Sherwater, near Wellington in New Zealand, has now become the Incipient Shire of Sherwater.

- * Addison de Parre. Device. Per chevron argent and purpure, three flax flowers slipped and leaved azure and a distaff inverted argent.
- * Mathias von Sachsen. Device. Azure, a chevron sable fimbriated and cotised between two wolves combattant and an open book argent.
- * Matthijs Tjepke van der Horst. Badge. Azure, on a pale sable fimbriated a mullet of sixteen points Or and a lighthouse issuant from base argent.
- * Muirghein ni Ghrainne and Alexandra Hartshorne. Joint badge. (Fieldless) A bull's massacre sable enflamed proper.
- * Ollivier Le Floch. Badge. Per pale argent and gules. Nice badge!

Lochac Chancellor to the Exchequer

Greetings good gentles of Lochac,

Her Excellency, Baroness Helouys, is nearing the end of her term as Lochac Chancellor of the Exchequer. As such the time has come to find a successor.

The Exchequer is a Greater Kingdom Officer and the senior Reeve of Lochac, and primarily has responsibilities in the following areas:

- * Training, guiding, and assisting the Reeves of the Kingdom in managing the finances of their branches and reporting on the same.
- * Managing and reporting on the Kingdom bank accounts, including approval of expenditure and Crown Events as a member of the Lochac Council of the Purse.
- * Maintaining the electronic systems used by the Kingdom's Reeves, including Xero, Dropbox, the Reeves Webpage and Reeves email list.
- * Developing and maintaining financial procedures, and assisting the SCA Ltd and SCA NZ Inc Treasurers with developing financial policies.

Prior financial experience - either as a branch Reeve or in the mundane world - could be considered a must-have, as would being a people-person. Experience with Xero in particular would also be very beneficial.

Other useful attributes include:

- * A desire and capacity to assist the amazing Reeves of Lochac, comfort using computers and the numerous electronic tools at our disposal (a love of Excel would be a strong bonus).
- * A good head for numbers (although in all honesty, Xero and Excel do most of the hard work for you).
- * Able to devote several hours a week to the

task. And if you saw the words "threequarters" above and think that 75% would have been a better way to put it, you get extra marks.

As a bonus, you will be fortunate enough to have support through Mistress Elizabeth Severn, once Aneala Reeve, and now my Xero (and hard questions Deputy);)

A successful applicant will be appointed as my deputy for a six-month training period before stepping up. If you are interested in serving the Crown and Kingdom in this critical role, please email an application to both the Kingdom Seneschal at seneschal@lochac.sca.org and the Kingdom Exchequer at exchequer@lochac.sca.org

Please include your membership number, mundane and SCA names, any relevant financial experience, and your general experience in the SCA - as well as outlining why you think you'd be suitable for the role.

Appointment to the role will be made at the pleasure of the Crown.




ensure the meeting runs to a reasonable time.
