- * Gerard de la Croix. Device. Azure, on a cross cotised Or a hart between four hearts gules.
- * Gwenhwyfar ferch Elena. Badge. Per chevron ployé flory at the point vert and argent, three mullets counterchanged.
- * Jacquelyna de la Court. Device. Chevronelly argent and azure, an open book gules and in chief three roses proper.
- * Janek the Innocent Varsoviensis. Name and device. Per chevron gules and azure, two crows volant and a bear rampant Or.
- * Li Li-Hua. Name and device. Per fess gules and argent, a sea-lion argent and four mullets in cross gules.
- * Malleta Beanston. Name and device. Barry wavy azure and argent, three fish fretted in triangle vert.
- * Nascia Sanoczka. Name and device. Per pale purpure and gules, a badger rampant between a viol and a sabre, a chief triangular argent.
- * Quinn Endicott. Name and device. Argent, in fess a sea-horse per fess azure and purpure and a sea-horse contourny per fess purpure and azure.
- * Razin al-Basir ibn Ja'far ibn Ma'bad. Household name Castrum Corvi and badge. Argent, a crow volant sable maintaining in its beak an ivy leaf vert.
- * Síthech of Cluain. Name and device. Azure, on a saltire cotised argent a brown wolf rampant proper between four feathers quills to center azure.
- * Wahriia of Saint Christina the Astonishing. Device. Vert, a thylacine rampant to sinister Or marked sable.
- * Wahriia of Saint Christina the Astonishing. Badge. (Fieldless) A platypus azure. Nice badge!

The Exchequer is a Greater Kingdom Officer and the senior Reeve of Lochac, and primarily has responsibilities in the following areas:

- * Training, guiding, and assisting the Reeves of the Kingdom in managing the finances of their branches and reporting on the same.
- * Managing and reporting on the Kingdom bank accounts, including approval of expenditure and Crown Events as a member of the Lochac Council of the Purse.
- * Maintaining the electronic systems used by the Kingdom's Reeves, including Xero, Dropbox, the Reeves Webpage and Reeves email list.
- * Developing and maintaining financial procedures, and assisting the SCA Ltd and SCA NZ Inc Treasurers with developing financial policies.
- * Prior financial experience - either as a branch Reeve or in the mundane world - could be considered a must-have, as would being a people-person.
- * Experience with Xero in particular would also be very beneficial.

Other useful attributes include:

- * A desire and capacity to assist the amazing Reeves of Lochac, comfort using computers and the numerous electronic tools at our disposal (a love of Excel would be a strong bonus).
- * A good head for numbers (although in all honesty, Xero and Excel do most of the hard work for you).

* Able to devote several hours a week to the task. And if you saw the words "three-quarters" above and think that 75% would have been a better way to put it, you get extra marks.

As a bonus, you will be fortunate enough to have support through Mistress Elizabeth Severn, once Aneala Reeve, and now my Xero (and hard questions Deputy) ;)

A successful applicant will be appointed as my deputy for a six-month training period before stepping up. 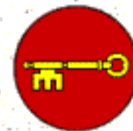

Seeking new Kingdom Webwright

Greetings good gentles of Lochac,

Are you an avid internet user? Do you enjoy perusing websites and referencing online materials? Are you good at communicating via online methods? Do you have an interest in content management and information sharing?

If so, then we have a role for you!!!

The Kingdom Webwright (also know as Webscribe) is in charge of creating and updating Kingdom Web pages and overseeing and supporting those maintained by all the Kingdom's officers and groups.

This role requires:

- ~ Current SCA membership and be at least 18 years of age.
- ~ Excellent communication skills.
- ~ A desire to poke around and understand how things work.
- ~ A strong emphasis on keeping current, maintaining and preserving and expanding existing content, rather than radical redesign or retirement of existing resources.
- ~ Very reliable email and internet access.

You do not need many technical skills, the most important thing is having a curiosity for how things work.

The workload includes such elements as:

- ~ Typically weekly updating of websites, especially calendar, events notices and other timely material, removing outdated material while preserving important resources and historical information.
- ~ Notifications to mailing lists, checking lists for notices or comments and adding to online calendars or to special pages.
- ~ Attending Kingdom Officer meetings online.
- ~ Mailing list moderation: Lochac-Announce and the Shambles - mostly deleting spam and occasionally assisting subscribers.
- ~ Advising and assisting other Webwrights in the Kingdom to help them do their jobs more effectively and easily.
- ~ Collecting quarterly reports from group

Webwrights and reports on the Kingdom Seneschal and Society Webminister.

The sites you will manage yourself are the Kingdom website, the Kingdom Webwright website and the Royal website (in consultation with the Crown). All other website work is upon request from the site maintainer, and dependent your availability.

The Lochac Webwright does not do this job alone. The Masonry team includes WordPress administrators to manage the 'back-end' of our websites, so you can focus on content, if that's where your strengths lay.

The time commitment is quite variable, but averages 5-10 hours a week.

The successful applicant will be given a comprehensive handover by the outgoing Kingdom Webwright.

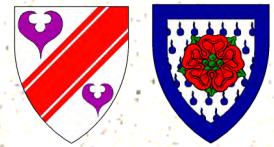

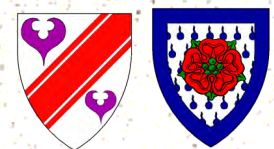
