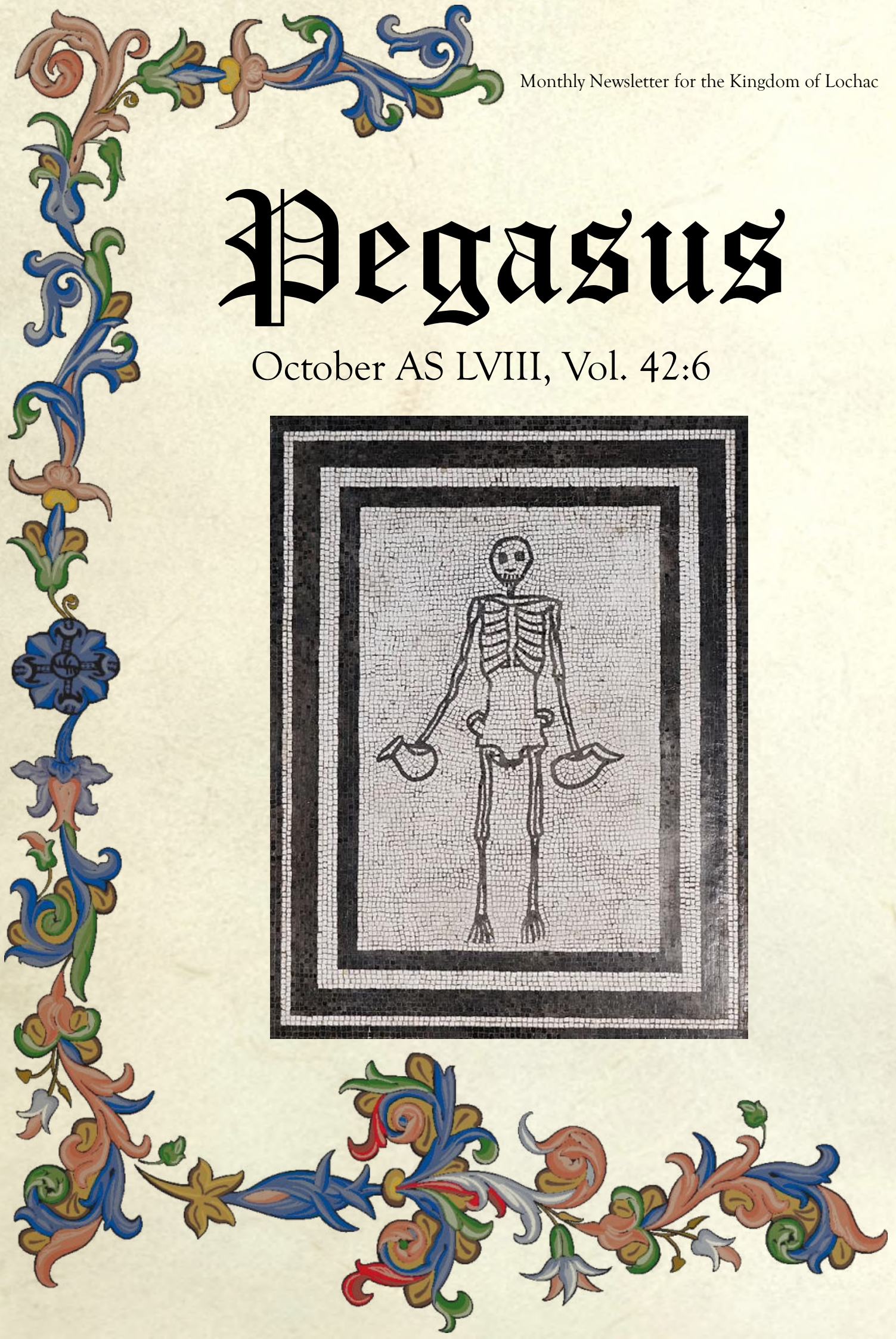
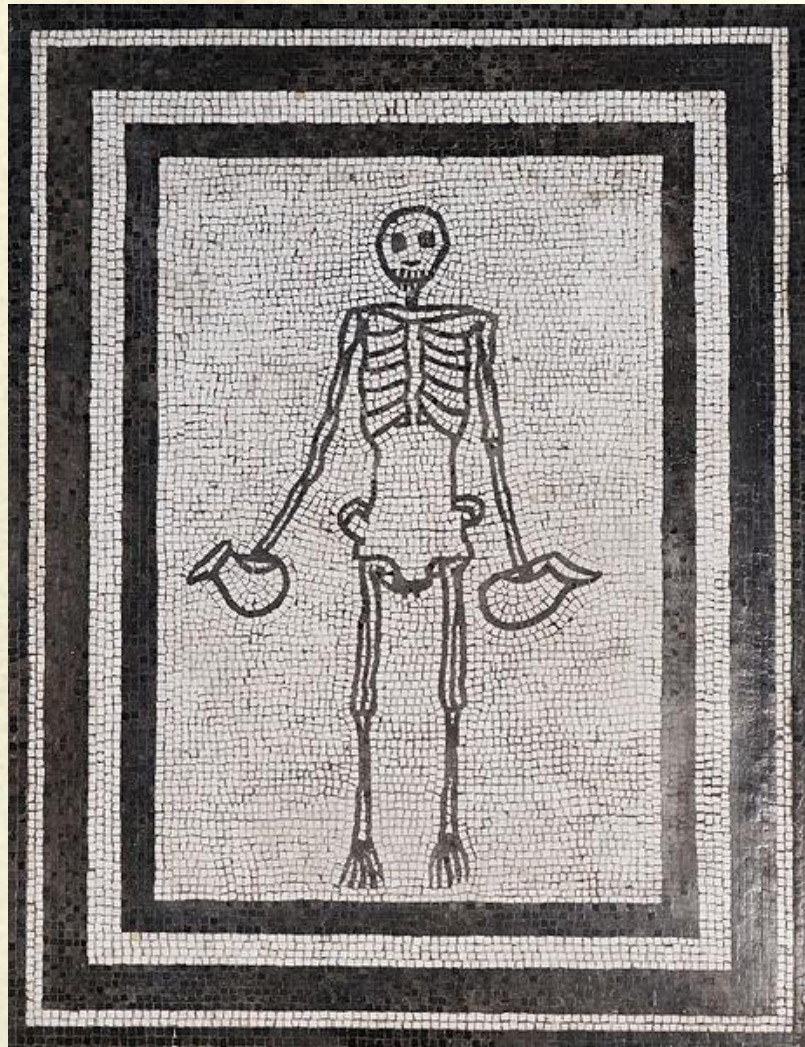

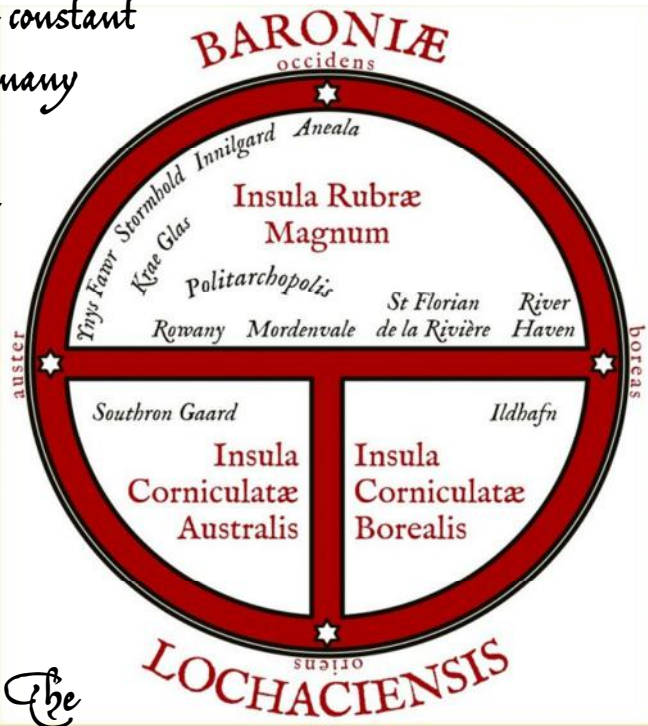

Five baronies in almost as many days: the K in River Haven, the Q in Krae Glas and Stormhold, and both visiting Innilgard and Mordenvale! Such a pace - and such spending - cannot continue. Much might be written about the coming Court, but it would please me more could I see something that might prove helpful towards the payment of debts of the current one. The Q is missing jewellery, possibly gone to pay those who grasp at the baubles of power. From the Exchequer

Financial Report for the 2021 -22 Period

Unto the Populace of Lochac, does Baroness Helouys le Poer, Chancellor of the Exchequer of the Kingdom of Lochac, send warm Greetings!

Firstly, my apologies for this report being late. Since I have taken on this role, I have been learning all the Exchequer business! There has been a lot going on for many Groups, particularly Reeves handing over to new Reeves, new polices and new Handbooks. I would like to use this opportunity to let you know that we are currently finalising the Reeves Handbook and, there is a new Royal Travel Policy, which has been reviewed as planned. This new policy aims to recognise adjustments in mundane financial arrangements and I am hoping will be fairer to Crowns, no matter which country from which they originate. Herewith to the Populace, I now supply the accounts of the Kingdom for the respective financial reporting periods for both Australia and New Zealand.
