This month We attended a Royal Archery Event in Okewaite and Rowany Festival. We are now preparing for our step down in Southron Gaard and the Coronation of Our Heirs, Princess Igelsia and Prince Bain.

At Rowany Festival we were very busy with all that the event has to offer. Our festival this year involved many meetings, tournaments, courts, war and many more meetings. We raised five new members to the Order of the Pelican, recognised a new Laurel and asked Dietrich Lehrer to join the Order of Defence. We thank Rowany and the Festival Stewarding team for such a fabulous effort and event.

We recognised many nobles over the course of Festival, for their efforts within the Kingdom to help others and to grow and

support the Kingdom, its Baronies and its groups. A full list can be seen on Canon Lore.

During Our reign we created new awards for the Youth of the SCA, the Azure Lily (Arts and Sciences), Azure Tear (Service) and Azure Sword (Combat). These awards for youth between the ages of 10-18 will provide recognition for the work that many youths do that goes beyond the Mouse Guard.

We worked with Maestra Ceara Shionnach and the Worshipful Company of Broiderers to create the Hand and Needle to recognise our artisans who consistently provide and blend service and the Arts and Sciences to sew wonderful garments and banners, gifts and cloaks to support their local groups, Baronies, Kingdom and Crown, and the Camera Obscura to recognise those who record our history through photography and live streaming for those unable to attend events. Further information on all these awards and the ceremonies for them will be found on canon lore and the Lochac

Heraldry website. We thank Mistress Isabella de Bordeaux, The Honourable Lady Amanda Martel, The Honourable Lady Gabrielle Hamilton, The Honourable Lady Gwen verch David and Maestra Ceara Shionnach for all their assistance and work behind the scenes in helping us write the scripts and submitting the paperwork.

We thanked Our Royal Household with cyphers and several other gentles who assisted us greatly over this Reign. Reigning involves daily hours of administration, weekly meetings, monthly missives and reflections, not to mention the organization of several courts at events, and liaising with people daily, something which is heavily increased when events occur. Staying sane mundanely and at events would not be possible without the hard work of those in the Royal Household, good gentles who have also chosen to give up many, many, many hours of their own time to assist. We would particularly thank our Head of Wardrobe Mistress Mathilde Adycote, Head of Household Baroness Philippa and her deputy Baron Roman, Our Herald THL Gwen verch David, Captain of the Guard Count Stephen,

Chamberlain Duchess Liadan and her Deputy Jarlskona Halla.

Once per Reign the Queen can choose to award the Lochac Order of Grace. For Our reign it was given to Our Herald, THL Gwen Ferch David, whose constant courtesy to all and grace under pressure were a joy to behold and helped Us in so many ways.

We both witnessed many displays of chivalry and courtesy across the War and Tourney Fields and saw equestrian feats, volunteers working hard, wonderous works of Arts and Sciences, from our amazing artisans from across the Kingdom at the Laurel Prize Tourney. The Heraldic Melee was well supported this year. The Barony of Mordenvale won the Chivalry and Pageantry portion of the tournament, with The Barony of Rowany taking the prowess. The Boar's head was a delight with great performances from the populace to brighten and warm the night.

Her Majesty fenced, fought in armoured combat wars as an archer, and taught a class which is a wonderful way of connecting with the populace. The rapier war was of high

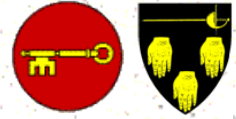

* **Angharad Rheged.** Badge change. (Fieldless) A rabbit sejant regardant contourny argent.

* **Bersi ørrabein.** Name and device. Sable, a boar's head erased argent, in chief three mullets Or.

Nice 9th-11th century Old Norse name from Iceland!

* **Gaylord of Saint Monica.** Device. Argent, a chaplet of thorns gules and overall a cross of Santiago sable.

* **Gráinne Uaine.** Device change. Per chevron sable and vert, in pale a crescent argent and an eye Or irised vert charged on the iris with a triquetra argent.

* **Guy le Bastard.** Device. Or, a saltire sable between four lozenges azure.

* **Julia of the Ravens.** Name and device. Argent, a raven striking sable and in base a triquetra braced with an annulet, a bordure wavy purple.

* **Lore Lei Martins.** Name and device. Per chevron rayonny argent and gules, two hearts enflamed to chief and a fox's mask counterchanged.

* **Lucia Markwardt.** Reblazon of device. Per chevron sable and argent, on a chevron gules between two triangles inverted argent, each charged with a triangle throughout, and a great helm affronty sable, two swords argent.

Greetings Lochac,

The AGM for **SCANZ** will be held postally in the middle of July. If you have any business for this SGM please contact the committee at committee@sca.org.nz by Saturday 22nd June.

A key part of the AGM is finding a new SCANZ Inc Committee member.

The current committee consists of Jacqui MacGregor-Pahl (Lady Yolande), Richard Goodwin (Master Richard d'Allier), and Josie Welch (THL Joana de Bairros).

The new committee member will be replacing Richard Goodwin.

Committee members typically serve for 3 years, with the first year as Secretary, then a year as Chair, then the final year as vice-chair. The committee is responsible for the overall governance of the SCA in NZ, including:

- Ensuring our policies and procedures comply with New Zealand legislation and regulations.
- Providing the required administrative infrastructure underpinning the SCA branches in NZ is in place and functioning.
- Providing support and systems to the SCA branches in NZ as required.
- Liaising with Kingdom Officers, primarily the Kingdom Seneschal, on matters that require Committee-level input, such as ratifying changes to officer handbooks and combat rules.
- Being the point of final appeal for sanctions
- Liaising with SCA Australia Ltd Board of Directors and SCA Inc (US) Board of Directors as needed on items of mutual interest.

The actual workload varies from month to month, however an average month would involve between 1 - 2 hours for the monthly committee meeting, and 2 - 4 hours of other time

working individually or jointly on committee tasks and projects.

To be eligible to be nominated as a committee member you must:

- Be qualified to be an officer of an incorporated society in New Zealand, which includes:
 - Being at least 16 years of age.
 - Not an undischarged bankrupt or disqualified from being an officer in various Acts.
 - Not convicted of various offences typically involving dishonesty.
- Be a current member of SCANZ Inc.

If you have any questions about the role, please feel free to contact any of the current committee members individually, or collectively at committee@sca.org.nz

If there is only one nomination, that nominee will be automatically appointed and notification will be made at the AGM. If there are multiple nominees then a vote will be called as part of the AGM and the nominee with the most votes shall be appointed.

If you would like to nominate yourself for the committee, please send your nomination to committee@sca.org.nz. Please include some information about yourself and any information you would like to have published as part of the AGM agenda should a vote be required.
