
The Passing of the Crown

From the AUSBoD:

You may have heard about the Lochac Pennsic Trailer recently and contributed to the fund, but we would like to let you know what was agreed upon:

"The Council of the Purse has approved an exceptional Stronger Kingdom Fund grant towards a trailer to be used by Lochac at Pennsic. The fund will match, dollar for dollar, funds raised externally up to a maximum contribution by the Stronger Kingdom Fund of \$4000 AUD. SCA Ltd will remain an interested party in the property in the event of major repair, sale, or disposal. We require that the item be suitably stored and maintained in a satisfactory condition by those who attend Pennsic. We also require that all site and extraneous fees for the trailer be covered by those who attend Pennsic. The board of SCA Ltd approved this decision.

This \$4,000 expenditure is a one off exception and not to be deemed as setting a new CoP approval limit."

From the SCANZ Committee:

The committee would like to thank Master William de Cameron for his long service maintaining the SCANZ web and IT services and providing the infrastructure on which it all runs. Master William has always been responsive, friendly, gracious and generous of his time and his contributions have been valued and appreciated. He has recently expressed a desire to step back from this role and the SCANZ Committee are working with him on a process to transition the services and responsibilities over the coming months.

We would also like to thank Lady Jasmine, THL Lowrens and the New Zealand group reeves for their efforts transitioning our financial systems and reporting to Xero. We understand that such changes in process can require significant effort and

investment of time for training. The process seems to have gone well with the first quarter of reporting looking good. Lady Jasmine and THL Lowrens were also instrumental in ensuring that the end of year accounts were complete for the postal AGM.

Our work on updating the SCANZ constitution to be ready for re-incorporation under the NZ Incorporated Societies Act 2022 proceeds at good pace. We would like to acknowledge the work of Count Gilbert Purchase in updating the policies related to disputes resolution and sanctions. The new Act requires that these policies be codified into the rules of the society, ie they will become part of the SCANZ constitution, so Count Gilbert's diligence and expertise are very much appreciated in this matter.

It's great to see so many events happening around New Zealand again, especially when we have a local Crown to share them with. Congratulations to Ildhafn on their 20th Anniverary, attended by Quene katherine. May the winds of time ever keep your sails full.


