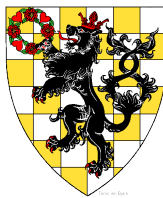

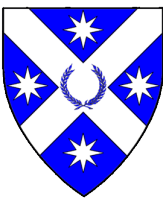

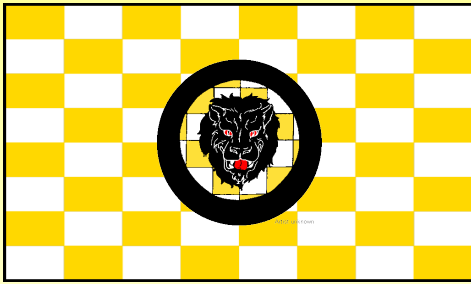

### **Notice About Submitting Event Copy**

Why events must be published – Kingdom Law: *"for an event to be considered official, event copy needs to be published in the Crier at minimum once in the issue of the month in which the event occurs."* An event must be official if Royals are present (this includes branch Coronets) so that any business conducted in Court can be recorded and published. All Branches in An Tir must have at least one official event per year in the Crier to maintain their status. All event copy should be sent to [CrierEditor@antir.org](mailto:CrierEditor@antir.org) and needs to follow a specific format, please ask for a copy of the format if you do not already have one. In order for copy to be published you must email the Crier Editor. No other method ie: calendar links, forms, etc should be used - *they will NOT work*. Remember: The deadline is the first of the month PRIOR to your event! **Nothing will get you in the Crier except an email to the Crier Editor.**

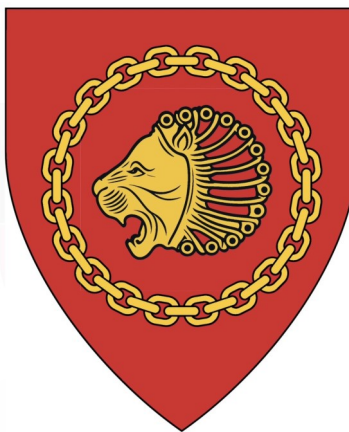

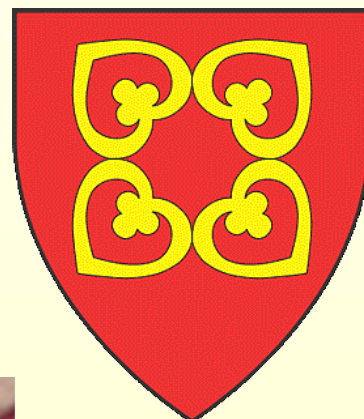

### Description of Deputy Roles

The Storage Deputy assists the Coordinator with the receiving, sorting, inventorying, donor tracking, and prepping for Royal gifting of largesse donated to the Crown. They can work independently or in person with the Coordinator to achieve these tasks.

Regional Deputies assist the Coordinator by serving as the point person for their area. They collect donations from those who don't travel and bring them to events attended by the Crown for handoff (or collect everything and arrange for another local member to courier), and relay needs/requests from the Crown to members in their region who may not use social media. Additionally, they may encourage local groups in the creation of largesse to donate to the Kingdom by running small contests or issuing challenges, arranging largesse making parties, etc.

### BASIC GUIDELINES FOR DONATION:

- Handmade is fantastic but not required, just that it's as period as possible (exceptions are in place for children's items – period preferred but NOT required, period adjacent or 'thematic' is great [examples: magical creatures, a modern puzzle with jousting scene, etc.]).

- PLEASE label each of your items with your SCA Name, SCA Branch, and what the item is/can be used for. If you wish to remain anonymous, that's fine! Just include your branch and the item description. **UPDATE: There is now a basic label template available for home printing on the new Largesse page on the Kingdom Website.**

- ANYONE can donate largesse, in ANY quantity (Yes, even just one thing)!

- NO scented items please!

- NO perishable items please!

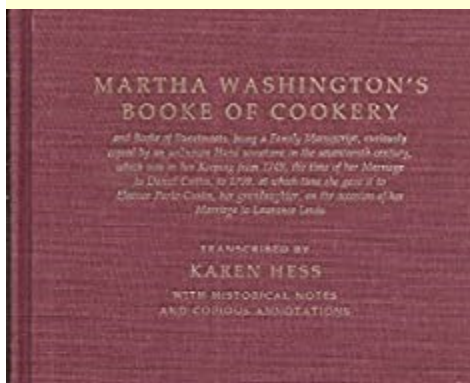
- NO items that can melt please! (If you are unsure, leave it in your car on a 90 degree day and see if it melts)

# Eat This Book!

When you read the title of this month's cookbook you might think, "Wow, Eat This Book has gone colonial! What is he thinking?" And in part you are correct, but "Martha Washington's Booke of Cookery Transcribed with historical notes and copious annotations" by Karen Hess Columbia University Press, New York 1981, is not a colonial cookbook. It has become known as Martha Washington's Cookbook because it was in her collection of surviving books. But it is much older than Martha, and the colonial period.



Martha Washington's cookbook is divided into two parts, along with appendices, a bibliography and an index. Part one is an extensive introduction to the book, a transcription of the original index, with a photograph of one page of the index, and a transcription of "A Booke of Cookery". In the introduction section the book Karen Hess tells us that the book was in Martha's collection from at least "1749, the year of her marriage to Daniel Custis, until 1799, when she presented it to Nelly Custis, her granddaughter." Hess posits that by the time it "came into the hands of Martha Custis . . . it had long since become a family heirloom" and was no longer a working document that the family cooked from. The cuisine represented in the manuscript is not representative of the American Colonial period, but that of a much earlier time. The ingredients and techniques are much more "characteristic of Tudor cookery" and the structure and wording of the recipes is clearly from the tradition of the household books from the mid to late 1500's. There is also little to no mention of New World foods. "Turkey, for instance, is mentioned but once" and "there is no mention of tomatoes . . . nor is there mention of chocolate which became enormously popular towards

the mid-seventh century". Part one is filled with approximately 206 recipes. I have attempted to make a few recipes from this section of the book and want to revisit it to cook some more. The recipes of interest to me are #25 "To make Oxford Kates Sausages" which are pork and veal uncased sausages seasoned with pepper, cloves, mace and sage then fried in butter and served with mustard sauce. If you are looking for something to do with all the skirrets you are growing try recipe #69 "To make a tart of parsnips & scyrrets". The roots are marinated in wine and then flavored with rose water, sugar and lemons. There are also plenty of meat recipes and the fish section, which includes stewed oysters, "sourced Eele", buttered shrimps, carp, trout and much more.

Part two consists of an Introduction to "A Booke of Sweetmeats", a transcription of the original index, but lacking a photograph as in section one, and a transcription of "A Booke of Sweetmeats". This section of the book "takes us through over 200 recipes for the preserving of fruits and flowers, and ends with some 90 distilled medicinal waters and preparations of various kinds". The recipes are varied and delicious from the most important "To know how to clarefye Yr sugar". There are 14 recipes to preserve quince ending with one titled "To make marmaleet that was presented to the queene for A new years gift". Also included in this section are many, many recipes for cakes, "biskets", jellies and candies. This section will keep you in the kitchen making sweet treats for a long time.

The appendix sections are really worth a read. Appendix One consists of 9 pages detailing the history of the manuscript and de-bunks some of the previously attested to details around the author and scribe of the manuscript. Appendix two goes into the dating of the manuscript and Appendix three is titled "Transcription Notes" which details the methods Karen Hess used in her transcribing of the manuscript. Included is an extensive Bibliography that will help with further research and an index. The book does not include a list of photographs and illustrations, but there are only a few photos of the original manuscript pages and only one wood cut so a list seems unnecessary.

The history, and dating, of the manuscript is, as stated above, is detailed in Appendix One details the history, as far as can be untangled. Appendix two, as well as throughout the commentary of the book, speaks to the dating of the manuscript. This is a difficult mystery to put together. The manuscript belongs to a group of household or family recipe books. This tradition of household books started in the mid-1500's. There are recipes in the manuscript that can be traced to "A Proper Newe

Booke of Cokerye" from 1545, but as Hess tells us "there was no wholesale copying as has been suggested." The book also follows "the flow of recipes" in Gervase Markam's, "The English Huswife" published in 1615 (watch for a review of Markam's book in an upcoming column) and other well-known household books. Sweetmeat books are also an important part of the household book tradition. They helped the growing middle class understand how to preserve fruits and vegetables and make special treats for their table in an attempt to mimic the upper or Royal classes. In Appendix three Hess details her transcription methodology. The manuscript now resides with The Historical Society of Pennsylvania.

Karen Hess (1918-2007) was a founding member of The Culinary Historians of New York. Besides her ground-breaking work on Martha Washington's cookbook she also wrote the introduction and historical notes for "American Cookery" published by Applewood Books, 1996. This book, based on a rare second edition published in 1796, is an excellent addition to your library if you are interested in true colonial food. Hess also annotated "What Mrs. Fisher Knows About Old Southern Cooking, Applewood Books, 1995, which is one of the oldest African American cookbooks originally published in 1881.
