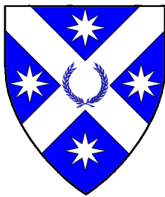

Barony of Stromgard's Baronial Polling

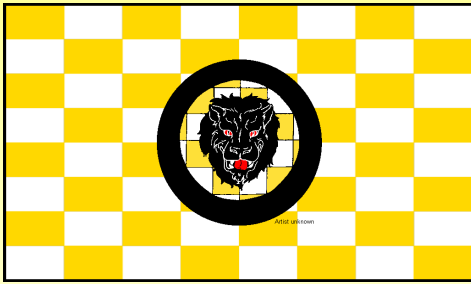

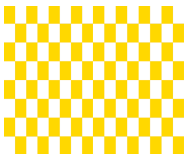

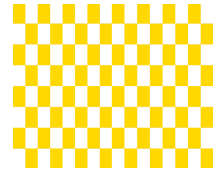

Notice About Submitting Event Copy

Why events must be published – Kingdom Law: *"for an event to be considered official, event copy needs to be published in the Crier at minimum once in the issue of the month in which the event occurs."* An event must be official if Royals are present (this includes branch Coronets) so that any business conducted in Court can be recorded and published. All Branches in An Tir must have at least one official event per year in the Crier to maintain their status. All event copy should be sent to CrierEditor@antir.org and needs to follow a specific format, please ask for a copy of the format if you do not already have one. In order for copy to be published you must email the Crier Editor. No other method ie: calendar links, forms, etc should be used - *they will NOT work*. Remember: The deadline is the first of the month PRIOR to your event! **Nothing will get you in the Crier except an email to the Crier Editor.**



Announcement from the Royal Largesse Coordinator



We have exciting news! The role of Royal Largesse Coordinator has officially been transitioned from a Retinue Position to a Kingdom level Lesser Officer under the Chancellery of the Exchequer (this branch handles financial matters, and Kingdom inventory and assets) and has been officially renamed the Kingdom Largesse Coordinator.

What does this change mean? More continuity with each term lasting 2 years instead of changing out every 6 months with each reign, more room to grow over time, set procedures, consistent and up to date guidance for the populace on a website devoted solely to largesse information and resources (in the works - launch date undetermined), and hopefully a more streamlined process for largesse creation, donation, and exchange around An Tir at all levels of our Kingdom.

With these goals in mind, we want your input! Please email Kingdom.Largesse@antir.org in regards to any of the following queries, all responses will be kept confidential when requested.

- If you have HANDLED or are currently handling largesse at the Baronial, Principality, or Kingdom level, we'd love to have your feedback on what would have made/would make your job easier. What challenges did/do you face? What has worked really well or received a positive response? What would you like to see changed? How can the Kingdom help you do your job easier? We want to support you!

- If you have RECEIVED largesse in the past as either an individual, an Event Steward, or a sitting/landed personage, what were your favorite things? What was most useful? What was least useful? What do you wish you received more of? What do you wish you received less of even if it was technically a good item?

Moving forward - The largesse deputies currently in place will be staying on provisionally to help ease the transition while we figure out the new structure and work on the changes outlined above/developed off populace response. We want the creating, donating, and receiving of largesse to be a pleasurable and easy process for all.

Description of Deputy Roles

The Storage Deputy assists the Coordinator with the receiving, sorting, inventorying, donor tracking, and prepping for Royal gifting of largesse donated to the Crown. They can work independently or in person with the Coordinator to achieve these tasks.

Regional Deputies assist the Coordinator by serving as the point person for their area. They collect donations from those who don't travel and bring them to events attended by the Crown for handoff (or collect everything and arrange for another local member to courier), and relay needs/requests from the Crown to members in their region who may not use social media. Additionally, they may encourage local groups in the creation of largesse to donate to the Kingdom by running small contests or issuing challenges, arranging largesse making parties, etc.

CURRENT DONATION NEEDS:

- Toys for Kids & Teens (Period items are great but not required, stuffies are particularly popular!)
- Scribal Items and/or Kits
- Blank Books (we love handbound but any blank book that is period-esque is great)
- Useful Items and/or Kits (ex: First Aid, Hygiene, Jewelry Repair, Water Bottle Bags/Covers, etc)
- Veils (Linen or Silk, w/wo Fillet)
- Combat Related Items
- Sewing Items and/or Kits
- Activity Kits (Pieces & instructions to make "x", etc)
- Caps (Simple Linen Coifs in particular but any type is appreciated)
- Woven Trim (No specifics - Anything is great)

Additionally, we have plenty of the following at the moment so please HOLD OFF on donating these items just for now:

- Jewelry
- Feast Gear (Plates, trays, pitchers, cutlery, etc)

BASIC GUIDELINES FOR DONATION:

- Handmade is fantastic but not required, just that it's as period as possible (exceptions are in place for children's items – period preferred but NOT required, period adjacent or 'thematic' is great [examples: magical creatures, a modern puzzle with jousting scene, etc.]).

- PLEASE label each of your items with your SCA Name, SCA Branch, and what the item is/can be used for. If you wish to remain anonymous, that's fine! Just include your branch and the item description. There is a basic label template available for home printing on the Largesse page on the Kingdom Website.

- ANYONE can donate largesse, in ANY quantity (Yes, even just one thing)!

- NO scented items please!

- NO perishable items please!

- NO items that can melt please! (If you are unsure, leave it in your car on a 90 degree day and see if it melts)

- If you are unsure what to donate, please reach out!

- Items we always need: Caps/Hats/Coifs; Veils; Cups; Toys/ Games/Crafts/Stuffies for Children and Teens.

Eat This Book!

Occasionally a cookbook, written and published by someone in the Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA), needs wider visibility. "Cooking Renaissance Italian Food 51 Redacted Recipes from the 1549 Banchetti by Christoforo Messisbugo" Translated and Redacted by Master Basilius Phocas (Charles A Potter) CuMhara Publishing, Kentucky, 2023 is one of those books. Messisbugo is an important cookbook from the early 1500's.

First printed in Ferrara, Italy after his death, it outlines the banquets, menus and recipes from the Este court. Christoforo Messisbugo worked in the Este court from the time he was 24, in 1524, to his death in 1548. "Banchetti" is dedicated to Ippolito II d'Este, the second son of Alphonso I d'Este and Lucrezia Borgia. The original book includes 323 recipes. Mr. Potter tells us that the book is "div(id)ed into three sections, a list of food and equipment and personnel needed to run the kitchen, a list of 13 menus, and the recipe section." Potter says in the "About the Author" section that he, "wrote this book to help people in the SCA recreate these period recipes for feasts or entries for A&S competitions".

This book is divided into several sections.

It includes an Introduction, 12 chapters of recipes, a very short Bibliography with only 5 entries. It does not include an index, but the table of contents does a good job of outlining the recipes included. It should also be noted that this book doesn't just include the redactions of the recipes, but also included with each redaction is the translation, a photograph of the original recipe from the 1549 book, a commentary on the entry, and the modern recipe. Having all these pieces for each recipe is culinary gold! Along with the photographs of each recipe also included are illustrations from the time period. Mr. Potter's redactions are true to the original source, but the original source is right there in both the original Tuscan and in translation so you can work out your own redactions. Charles says, "Redaction is nothing more than opinion."

I discussed the book, the writing and pub-

lishing of it, along with his favorite recipes with Charles Potter. Since he was an apprentice Basilius was interested in Italian food. His Laurel encouraged him to explore the cuisine and cookbooks from this important time period and food region. When asked about how he choose the recipes to include in his edition, Potter told me, "originally, I went for the easiest section. I started with the sauces because they seemed the easiest to work with. The first recipe I redacted is sweet and sour green sauce." This recipe is #45a and is included on page 133 of the book and includes parsley, mint, tarragon (or basil), crumbs of white bread, strong vinegar, salt, pepper and honey or sugar. He then "moved on to pies". He went on to say, "by far the greatest challenge was the first chapter" which is titled, "Compositone Della Piu Importanti Viande (Composition of the Most Important Foods)".

All in all, it took Mr. Potter "about 10 years to do the translation". I then asked the hard, perhaps unfair, question, "What is your favorite recipe included in your book?" After some discussion the above sauce recipe emerged as number one. He also likes recipe #37c on page 119 "French Custard Sauce for filling fleur-de-lis, sacred cowls of St. Jacob's Fritters and cases for pies, for soup and others" the first part of which is a sweet custard "very similar to one Julia Child makes".

Also included in his favorites is recipe 54c on page 152 "Sausages on the Spit" which are made from veal, sheep and pork flavored with "herbs", grated cheese, mixed spices, then stewed in sugar, cinnamon and sour orange juice. I will be making these very soon! Mr. Potter discussed the composition of the book reveling in the wonderful Italian Renaissance recipes but also told me, "there are some throwback recipes to the previous century and even to the 1300's." It should be noted there are several that are similar to those in the Martino Corpus. To Mr. Potter the most important part of his project was accessibility, "I wanted to make it easy for beginner cooks." He has done a good job of this while still staying true to the original manuscript. For translation he made great use of Giovanni Florio's, known as John Florio in England, book "Worlde of Wordes, or Dictionarie of the Italian and English tongues" (London, 1598).

This Italian to English Dictionary is a must have for anyone researching this time period and can now be found online. Florio lists his sources in the beginning of the book and Messisbugo is one of the sources he credits. Potter also used Ronald Edward Zupko "Italian Weights and Measures from the Middle Ages to the Nineteenth Century", also an indispensable research book on the different weights and measures from

all the countries, principalities and regions that became modern Italy. It should be noted, as Charles says, "there is a connection between Ferrara and France from a cultural and war-fare machine." This connection can be found in the recipes included in "Banchetti". There is an early recipe for the French classic Pate Choix. Mr. Potter tells us "it is not used as in modern times, it is actually deep fried. There is a similar recipe in Julia Child's cookbook."

After much discussion on "Cooking Renaissance Italian Food" I asked, "What is your next project?" He told me, "My ambition is 37 more recipes for a possible second book. I am thinking about putting them together as volume one and two." For the first book, "I picked recipes that I liked and the section are not as well represented as they could be. The reason I want to do the second volume is because I want people to have a good understanding of each chapter."

"Mr. Potter has been cooking for over 50 years". He is a Laurel in the Society for Creative Anachronism with a focus in cooking. He has been in the SCA since 1987 and resides in the Middle Kingdom. He brought his love of modern cooking into the SCA where he explored period recipes and cooking methods.

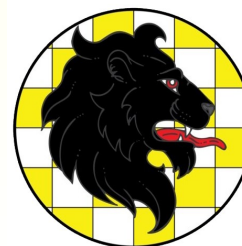
