



We will march south to the debatable lands, aligned with the Dragon of the Midrealm, along with Trimaris, Meridies, Avacal, Artemisia, Northshield, and Black Talon. We will pit Our forces against the Tiger of the East and their Allies in a bid for all the glory to be won at Pennsic War.



We will be travelling down to land grab and can be found for the duration of Peace Week in Our home in N30 No House Nein Haus, off of Aiben's Alley. We always appreciate visitors, so please do drop by. Our Chamberlain, Head of Entourage and Herald will also be found at No House. Please note that We will not be on electronics at Pennsic.

Plans are beginning to come together:

We will rally with Our people at Ealdormere Camp before the march to Opening Ceremonies. We wish to have many bards to lead us in song and banners to fly as We make Our way up to the second rendezvous point on the road outside the Midrealm's Gate before continuing onto the battlefield. With this, we need to shift Our focus to securing the line of the North. We are proud to announce the conditions of our Crown tournament below. All applications will be due on or before September 20th, 2024. Combatants and Consorts will be announced at Coronation in our evening court.

Requirements: In addition to the requirements outlined in Kingdom and Society law. All combatants and consorts have five additional requirements they must meet:

1. All combatants and consorts must display at least three items of heraldry in the procession and throughout the day.

2. All combatants and consorts must each produce, by their own hand, an arts and science entry to be displayed in the combatants' and consorts' arts and science display. In-process projects are acceptable. A card featuring a description of the project is required, however, formal documentation is encouraged but not required. If the entry is a performance, you will be expected to perform it during the procession.

In the combatant's letter of intent and procession speech, they must declare their primary/preferred weapon form. These weapons forms are limited to those listed on the Ealdormere authorization card: weapon and shield, two-weapon, and great weapon. Combat archery and siege engines are excluded.
 All combatants must be authorized in all permitted weapon forms (Weapon & Shield, Two Weapon and Great Weapon). Ideally, these authorizations will be done before the day of Crown tournament. However, a small window will be made available before the procession to allow any last-minute authorizations.

5. Both combatant and consort must be present on the day of the tournament.

6. Applications must be submitted to both TRM and the Kingdom Seneschal by September 20th, 2024 at 11:59 pm.

*Deviations from crown requirements will be considered upon request. They will be handled on a case-bycase basis.



From Their Highnesses con't

Formats:

Format 1 – If there are 12 or fewer combatants on the day of the tournament:

- The format will be a round-robin style tournament with each fight being the best two out of three.
- Each combatant will be required to fight at least one full round of three against a single opponent with a weapon form other than their declared primary/preferred form.
- Combatants are not required to match specific weapons, only the weapon form. EG Pole Arm Vs. Great Sword would be matched because they both fall under the great weapon authorization. Matching specific weapons is at the combatant's discretion.

• The Finals:

• The top two combatants from the round-robin will compete in a best three-out-of-five final each round of which will be comprised of a best two-out-of-three match.

• In the event of a tied score to determine the finalists, those tied will complete a semi-final bou of 2/3 to determine who will advance to the finals.

• The weapon forms for the finals will be matched and take place in the following order: lower rank combatant's primary/preferred, higher rank combatant's primary/preferred, and by mutual combatant agreement. The final two fights, if necessary will be by mutual combatant agreement.

• If an agreement cannot be reached, the weapon format will be decided by random draw by Her Majesty.

Format 2 – If there are more than 12 combatants on the day of the tournament:

- The format will be a double-elimination tournament.
- The tournament will be fought on the 16-man double elimination list tree.
- If there are more than 16 combatants, combatants will fight for a position on the tree using the sudden death victory tree. Conversely, if there are fewer than 16 combatants, by-fights will round out the list to 16. If you are unfamiliar with the sudden death victory tree, read pages 26 and 27 of <u>Double Elimination</u> <u>Trees "The Gold Standard of Tournaments"</u>.

• Combatants will be placed on the tree by random draw. Names will be drawn by Her Majesty, immediately following the processional.

• Each round of the tournament will be best two-out-of-three fights.

• The semi-finals will be best two-out-of-three, the combatant from the undefeated side of the tree will need to win one round of three to advance. The combatant from the one-loss side of the tree will need to win two rounds of three to advance.

• Combatants are not required to match specific weapons, only the weapon form. EG Pole Arm Vs. Great Sword would count as matched because they both fall under the great weapon authorization. Matching specific weapons is at the combatant's discretion.


• The Finals:

• Will be fought in matched-weapons forms to a best three-out-of-five forms. Each weapon form will be a best-two-out-of-three round.

• The weapon formats for the finals will take place in the following order: lower rank combatant's primary/preferred, higher rank combatant's primary/preferred, by mutual combatant agreement. The final two fights, if necessary will be by mutual combatant agreement.

• If an agreement cannot be reached, the weapon format will be decided by random draw by Her Majesty.






From the Kingdom Senschal

Hello Sunshines!

Pennsic is coming! And it is not the only event to look forward to this summer. Stay as cool as you can, hydrate early and often and remember to play safely. It's often hot and humid in ways that so many of us no longer tolerate as well as we once did. Spend some time in the shade, enjoying a cool beverage and embrace the slower pace of the summer season.



Their Highnesses have published their requirements for entry into their Crown Tournament in this newsletter. Please review those requirements carefully, as well as the relevant laws included below. Crown Tournament documentation must be submitted electronically (pdf preferred) to both the Kingdom Seneschal as well as their Highnesses. You will need to include a copy of your authorization card, the membership cards of both the entrant and the consort, a completed Crown Declaration form (as found in the library on the kingdom website), proof of residency for both the combatant and the consort, as well as all requirements set out by their Highnesses. Those documents are required to be submitted complete and on time.

Crown Tournament submissions will be accepted until 11:59 PM EDT on September 20th, 2024. That deadline is firm, 12:01 AM is too late. Save yourself the stress and get your submissions in early.

Please review the current laws of Ealdormere as they apply to Crown Tournaments and ensure you follow them in your applications.

III-400 All prospective combatants and consorts must be paid members of the SCA and must maintain that membership through to the end of Their reign. Proof of membership must accompany the request to participate in the Crown Tournament.

III-500 All prospective combatants and consorts in the Crown Tournament must meet the following requirements:

III-501 They must be subjects of Ealdormere as defined by Corpora and must remain subjects of the Kingdom through to the end of Their reign.

III-502 They must be at least 18 years old.

III-503 They must have been subjects of Ealdormere and have demonstrated a clear level of involvement in the Kingdom over the year prior to the Crown Tournament.

III-504 They must be armigerous.

III-505 All prospective combatants must be authorized to fight as an armored combatant in the Kingdom of Ealdormere and must present proof of authorization when submitting their letter of intent. III-600 Any person who does not meet the requirements of Section III-503 or 504 may make an application to the Heirs under the "Rule of 12" as outlined below:

The Prospective combatant and consort shall submit a request to participate in the Crown Tournament pursuant to Section III-200. Their request must be accompanied by a letter addressing why they seek dispensation from Section III-503 or III-504. This letter must bear the signatures of 12 subjects of Ealdormere, all of whom are armigerous. By signing the dispensation request, the signatories vouch for the worthiness of the candidates. Due weight will be given to this request.

Note: This dispensation request must accompany the request to participate in the Crown Tournament and is not a method of recourse after a combatant or consort has been disallowed from the Crown Tournament.

III-700 Neither the Sovereign or the Consort of Ealdormere, nor any person who has served as Sovereign or Consort of Ealdormere within three months prior to the Crown Tournament, may participate as a combatant or consort in that Crown Tournament.

III-800 No prospective combatant may have more than one declared consort. No prospective consort may be fought for by more than one combatant.

As Youth Fencing Marshal you'll report 4 times a year to both the Society Youth Marshal and the Earl Marshal, generally using a form provided by the Society. You'll keep up to date on the rules concerning youth, and ensure our rules stay current.

Your main goal is to encourage and enable youth to participate in fencing in the SCA. We currently have few youth participating, and they're scattered about, so the focus is on having fun and learning. There's an authorization procedure for those who want to compete out of kingdom.

All Things List Field by Duchess Kaylah the Cheerful MSCA, OP, OP

The List Field, with it's myriad variety of tournaments is a passion of mine. Who doesn't love a well run tournament?

Eight is a magical number for double elimination tournaments. Unfortunately, participation does not always occur in multiples of 8. If there are too few participants, it is easy

enough to add in some BYE fights. But what happens when you have **One Too Many**! This overabundance of participants is a real puzzler. If you slot 9 fighters onto a 16-man double-elim tree, there will be a ridiculous

number of BYES, such that at some point BYE

One option for 9 fighters is to use the 12-man double-elimination tree. Or if you have 17 fighters, use the 24-man tree.

But there will still be a lot of BYEs and those trees end in a round-robin on the winner's side (basic math: three groups of 8).

Sometimes it is your job to get those 9 fighters onto an 8-tree, or those 17 fighters onto an 16-tree.

Sudden Victory will give everyone a chance to play with lots of opportunities to get to the tree.

Help! I Have One Too Many Participants! : Sudden Victory Round

Give everyone a more than fair chance to enter the tree with a single-elim sudden victory!

1. Randomly draw and pair all participants.

fights BYE.

- 2. The winners move into the random draw pile for the list tree.
- 3. Repeat until there is only a single fighter left.

This final fighter is eliminated. They had at 4 fighting attempts to gain entrance onto the tree, which is quite satisfying for fighters who entered a double-elim and had the prospect of only two fights.

The Smith and the Valkyrie by Valdr jarnsmiðr

Long ago there lived a young girl and her name was Thyra, which in the old tongue meant "like thunder" and this girl was very well named. Loud. Brash. Boisterous. She was a disaster at both the spindle and sewing needle and preferred to spar at swords with the boys than bake bread. Her mother often despaired whether she would ever be able to marry her off. But Thyra had a friend, Halvar, who loved her deeply, though she did not love him in the same way. In her dreams, Thyra did not see his face but rather a soft face, with smooth skin framed in hair of reddish gold, with eyes the colour of the sea. Thyra saw this face in her dreams every night.

Time passed and Halvar grew in strength and skill to take his father's place as the Jarl's blacksmith. Halvar was expected to marry due to his station, so he went to Thyra, the woman and life-long friend he had always loved and asked her to be his wife. Thyra knew that she could not love Halvar as he wished her to – but Halvar also knew this, and loved her still, so he asked her again and Thyra, much to her mother's shock and delight, said yes, because that was what was expected of them. Thyra never bore Halvar any children and Halvar never pressed her or grudged her about this because above all Halvar loved her even though Thyra could not love him in kind. Without children to teach and pass on the trade, Thyra worked at the forge by Halvar's side for she had always been more comfortable with a hammer or axe in her hand than a spindle or distaff. So, Thyra's skill at the forge grew to match that of Halvar's and they would work side by side every day, and they were happy.

Then, one fateful summer's end, the Jarl's ships returned from the season's trading and raiding, but Halvar was not with them. He had gone that year with his Jarl for a share of the season's spoils, but he had fallen at Miklegard.

Thyra mourned for her husband and friend and in the years to come, never married again. She stopped wearing the long dresses and aprons expected of a wife, and dressed instead in Halvar's old clothes. She worked at the forge alone and soon her skill became renowned – no one could shoe a horse faster or craft a finer axe. At night, alone in her bed, while nursing a tired back and sore arms, Thyra would dream - not of her husband's face, but rather of eyes, the colour of the sea.

Ten years passed and once again in the spring, the Jarl called for his banner-men to go raiding. As warriors and horses gathered on the jetty to board the ships, the Jarl looked up to see Thyra gathering among them. She had with her Halvar's shield and his armor bundled

One day, as Thyra gathered her armor, she felt the lightest touch on her shoulder and turned expecting to see one of her shield-brothers, but instead, just for an instant, Thyra saw a face framed in reddish gold hair, with eyes the colour of the sea ... and then it was gone leaving her with a feeling of peace and resolve.

The battle with the Angles was joined and fiercely contested. The Angles managed to strike down the centre of the Jarl's shield wall and were poised to break through, when Thyra leapt over the bodies of the slain and plugged the breach with her shield. Thyra fought with such ferocity and bravery that a foe fell with every swing of her hammer, even though she had been pierced through twice by spears when her sword had shattered. Thyra and her hammer held the breach while her Jarl rallied his reserves. Thyra never saw the axe that took her life, but her shield brothers did and made the wielder pay dearly for it, as the four parts of his body would attest if they could speak.




