

Rohais de Ravenscroft returned home to Atlanta after a brief stint in Trimaris, while in college, and re-discovered the SCA in the Barony of South Downs. It wasn't long before she was spending every Sunday in armor, at the local fighter practice. Known at that time as Margritte of Ravenscroft, she had the good fortune to be squired to Sir Robert Greenheart.

Although heavy fighting was her first love in the SCA, she found time to dabble in many of the arts and sciences as well. South Downs at that time had an amazing array of artisans, all willing to teach and share their skills. It was during this time that she discovered the deep satisfaction of creating an item from scratch, in whatever medium, based simply on the spark of an idea, and some research and elbow grease.

Nor were these the only outlets for her creativity. Margritte served as the Chronicler of South Downs and as Demo Officer. She also built a thriving business as a merchant in the SCA, selling jewelry, garb, and sundry other items at events.

Marriage, the birth of her son, and a move to a new home put SCA activities on hold for a number of years. Eventually, though, once life was on a more even keel, she was able to return. Now residing in the Shire of Beau Fort, with the new name of Rohais de Ravenscroft, her creative outlets include embroidery, wood turning, sewing, and especially, making music with voice, guitar, ukulele, and harp.

Although she no longer attends face-to-face events, she has been extremely active in the online bardic community since the start of the pandemic over three years ago. She currently co-hosts a virtual bardic for the Kingdom of Meridies every Friday, as well as attending several other virtual bardics on a regular basis. Additionally, Rohais maintains a calendar of online bardic events, and organizes twice-monthly online classes on a variety of bardic topics, which are taught and attended by folks all over the known world.




