

Who may enter:

- Any currently authorised armoured fighter, whatever their status or experience, partnered with a consort.
- You must both be 18 years or older on March 16th.
- Soth participants must be acceptable to the Crown.

What:

- All weapon forms acceptable to armoured combat on a tournament field. If combatant numbers are under 12, round robin format; if over 12, single kill, triple elimination.
- The Finals will be fought as a best of 5 using matched weapons including pole arms.
 Please ensure you have a pair of gauntlets for the tournament.

How to enter:

- Send a Letter of Intent to the Crown by February 16th (NB see Crown Requirements below). Email to <u>crown@lochac.sca.org</u>
- Include contact details for both participants: e.g., SCA/mundane names; email/phone number; preferred titles/pronouns; membership and authorisation periods.

Legal requirements:

- ✤ A current SCA membership.
- Be willing/able to obtain/maintain a passport throughout the reign.
- Must swear to attend the subsequent three Crown events (May Coronation, Spring Crown, November Coronation).
- Must be willing to swear fealty to Lochac for the duration of the reign.

Crown Requirements:

- Appropriate heraldic display upon the field and for Invocation Court: e.g., banners/standards/merki, painted shields, tabards/livery, covered mundanities etc.
- Letters of Intent: simple emails are acceptable, but Their Majesties would love to see creative and unique presentations.

Strong recommendations:

- Read Kingdom Law (<u>https://seneschal.lochac.sca.org/files/2021/10/LochacLaws-October-2021.pdf</u> especially Section III. The Crown).
- Talk to former Crowns or Landed baronages.
- ✤ Have a draft plan in case you win.
- NB This event may be live-streamed. Expect social media coverage.

Greetings Lochac

The Alternate Crown poll gives people a voice in deciding what they want in future Crown tourneys. It may be that people want change. It may be that people want the current system. That's why we're asking. The most important thing is to vote so we can hear your voice.

This is the text of the poll email for those who haven't received it. "Over the last several years there has been some discussion about the way we choose a Crown in Lochac. It would seem to be an appropriate time to ask the Kingdom whether they want to investigate other options. The Board of SCA Ltd Australia and the Committee of SCA New Zealand have asked that a survey be taken of adult members of both countries. The survey is to determine if there is enough interest in change to proceed in discussing alternatives. No matter how you answer, no changes will be made without significant further consultation. This is just an initial step to see how much interest there is in considering change within the Kingdom." If you haven't received the poll by email, please email acwg@lochac.sca.org.

On top of that we have a new Chronicler. Please join me in welcoming Lady Magdalena af Husum who has generously agreed to step into the role. I would also like to announce that the Kingdom of Lochac has a new Deputy Chronicler. From Crux Australis



Greetings and welcome to the January edition of the CAMeL with the LoAR for November:

Registrations are:

- Angharad Rheged. Name change from Florie Attewood and device change (see PENDS for badge change). Vert, a chevron and in chief three cinquefoils argent. The submitter's previous name, Florie Attewood, is released. The submitter's previous device, Vert, a winged stag segreant and on a chief argent three thistles vert, is released.
- **Gaylord of Saint Monica**. Name (see PENDS for device). Saint Monica is the registered name of an SCA branch.
- Muireach Mac Gréine. Device. Per chevron azure and sable, three roses argent and a sun Or. This device was pended for redraw on the July 2023 LoAR to draw the roses in their default arrangement. Quarterstaff provided new artwork which the submitter approved.
- **Rúnfríðr Keiliselgr**. Release of alternate name Rachel of Saint Monica.

Pending:

- Angharad Rheged. Badge change. (Fieldless) A rabbit sejant reguardant contourny argent. This badge is pended to redraw the rabbit as clearly sejant. As drawn, commenters were split as to whether it was sejant or statant. If accepted, the submitter's previous badge, Per fess vert and argent, a thistle counterchanged, is to be released.
- Gaylord of Saint Monica. Device. Argent, a chaplet of thorns gules and overall a cross of Santiago sable. This device is pended for redraw to enlarge the cross so its arms extend past the edges of the chaplet. As submitted the cross is barely overall.

Returns:

• Ollivier Le Floch. Badge. Per pale argent and gules. This badge is returned for conflict with the device of Clara Masen, Per pale argent and Or. There is a single DC for changing the tincture of half the field.

Because of this, any personal information, such as legal names, addresses, phone numbers, and email, should not be included in these bids without signed written permission. Such information as is necessary for the entire College of Arms to see should be posted as a comment after the bid is finalized; any identifying information that the Sovereigns might need should be included as a Sovereign Note.

Greetings Lochac,

The SCA Ltd Australian Board of Directors is looking for new members. The requirements are a current Australian SCA membership and you must be over 18 years of age. If you are interested in seeing what happens behind the scenes then this may be for you.

Currently there are 5 members on the AUS Board and we come from all over Australia. We have all played different roles in the Society from Office holders, to Royalty, from Peers to members of the Populace, all are welcome to apply. The AUS Board has a limit of 2 members from the same state/territory (we currently have 1 from NSW, 2 from the ACT, 1 from VIC and 1 from SA). The standard term on the AUS Board is 3 years, with new members generally beginning as a general member and then they may hold an Executive position in their second or third year (Chair, Deputy Chair, Treasurer, Secretary). Our AGM and Executive changeover happens in May.

Food Safety Update

Food Safety Standard 3.2.2A came into effect in December 2023. At this stage, the Board does not believe that the SCA Ltd is captured by these new regulations, and no further action needs to be taken by groups or officers regarding these standards. Groups are actively encouraged to assist group members acquire the relevant training (such as food safety supervisor training) as this, similar to first aid training by group members, can greatly improve safety of all participants.

Additionally, no person operating under the banner of the SCA Ltd may sell food to members of the public or those who are not otherwise ticketed attendees of an SCA event. This is to prevent our accidental capture by these regulations, and covers such activities as selling of medieval food at demos and faires.

Individuals or businesses operating at SCA events but under their own banner (such as businesses selling food at Rowany Festival) are not operating as part of the SCA Ltd, and must determine for themselves how these new regulations apply to them.

NZ BoD Update,

SCANZ has been busy over the past year ensuring that we meet the requirements of the new Incorporated Societies Act 2022. These requirements have meant that we have had to work with the Kingdom Seneschals to develop a new Issues Resolution Policy, which is currently in progress.

We have also had to make some changes on what information we collect from members e.g. we are no longer require occupation details. We were required to move our AGM date to the middle of the year so it was closer to the end of the financial year.

We will also introduce a wind up clause to our constitution so that if, in the unlikely circumstance the SCA Inc that in New Zealand closes, we have a designed recipient for our assets.

The committee has also updated their Financial Policy and introduced a policy around Live Streaming at events. We welcomed Jacqui Macgregor-Pahl on board as a Committee member in the middle of 2023 and farewelled Liz Brodie. 2024 will involve a more of the work to ensure we fulfil the requirements of the new Act.

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS IS CURRENTLY CONSIDERING CHANGES TO CORPORA.

IT INVITES COMMENTARY FROM THE MEMBERSHIP AND PARTICIPANTS.

These changes aim to enhance recruitment and member retention in the SCA. They also aim to further support these goals. They elevate the Society Chatelaine to a greater Society Officer. They align local and regional chatelaines to this same structure. It is a strategic move, aiming to support the implementation of comprehensive recruitment and retention strategies. It also aims to align the office to a clear vision.

The Board also approved proposed wording. It supports the creation of a Society Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging (DEIB) Officer. They also approved aligning local and regional DEIB officers into one structure. Like the proposed Chatelaine changes, it aims to support an aligned Society vision. It also aims to support the implementation of strategy in this space.

Finally, the Board approved changing the name and scope of the Corporate Diversity Equity Inclusion and Belonging Office. It is now the Office of Inclusive Programs. This office will handle the implementation of large scale, heavy-lift projects. This work will move inclusivity in the SCA forward. It will also transition leadership and management of game-facing DEIB work to the newly created Society DEIB Officer. This office will support all corporate and society officers. It will also serve as a primary DEIB advisor to the Board.

Recruiting and Retention structural changes for member commentary and verbiage change to Corpora.

Add:

I. Chatelaine:

The Chatelaine is responsible for promoting and supporting recruitment initiatives and guiding retention practices.

J. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging Officer:

The Society DEIB Officer is responsible for overseeing the development, implementation, and maintenance of game-facing DEIB initiatives and education.




