50 AT 50 - PENNSIC INFO Pennsic Decision Planning Q&A with Arwyn, Avacal Pennsic Coordinator

So, for those thinking or dreaming about attending Pennsic 50, I'm going to do a short series of articles (this issue, May and June) to get you into the spirit and decide if you want to go. We would love to have 50 Avacalians for Pennsic 50! This article will focus on the general planning questions to help you decide to come to the largest Known World War. So let's get going.

Q: How long is Pennsic? What is Peace Week? What is War Week?

A: Pennsic is a two week long event. Some people only come for peace week, some only for war week, some for just the weekends. Peace Week goes from the first Friday (Jul 28) to Thursday before the middle weekend (Aug 3). War Week goes from the Friday of the middle weekend until the end (Aug 4 to Aug 13). Peace week means war has not been declared which happens at opening ceremonies on the middle Saturday at around 6pm (Aug 5). Then the battles start on Sunday of the middle weekend (Aug 6) and go until closing ceremonies on Friday (Aug 9) after the last battle.

Q: When should I go? One week or two? What if I have limited time?

A: I usually go for two weeks. Partially because a majority of my friends from Ealdormere, East and Northshield go for that long. I also go to ensure that the "Kingdom of Avacal" and now the "Populace of Avacal" encampments are set up and coordinated for those coming later. I also go early so my body gets a chance to get used to the humidity which really works. However, prior to coming to Avacal, I only went once for two weeks and most of the time for one week. For new people to Pennsic, one week is probably enough "pennsic" which can become overwhelming. Arriving on Friday (Aug 4) gives you the biggest bang for your \$US buck (see fees answer below)

Q: What if I can only go for the first week (Peace)? What happens then?

A: Peace week still has martial activities (some rapier tournaments and lots of pickups for armoured combat and rapier). The range is open for archery practice as is thrown weapons. Most merchants are open at least restricted hours. University is running at about 60-70% of its full capacity. Most parties start around Wednesday or Thursday. It's generally quieter, less busy and can still be fun.

Q: How do I get there? Can I drive it?

A: Well, some people drive it. Li Xia is usually looking for a passenger to take and normally goes for two weeks. Sometimes people drive all night with four drivers (Hrogn, Astrid, Gunther and Eoyddi did it once). To Pennsic from Alberta, Borealis/Montengarde is about a 30-32 hour drive (without the border). From Saskatchewan, Mygran Wood and Sigelhundas are around 24 hours. It tends to save on issues if you want to bring more gear beyond your garb, activity stuff (armor, bow, etc) and some people like the trek. I know a few University Profs and teachers who do the trips from Washington state or California because they have time. Post on the "Avacal goes to Pennsic 50" Facegroup if you have space and/or if you want a ride.

Q: Ok, I don't have that much time to drive. Can I fly? Where to? How do I get to Coopers Lake then? A: Well, I fly to Ontario to visit and deal with family issues and sometimes deal with work and so, for me, it could be Hamilton, Kitchener-Waterloo or Toronto. Then I rent a car for a week or two and I'm lucky to have access to a good corporate rate. Swoop and Flair are cheap flights with extra costs for luggage. Westjet and Air Canada

also fly there. However, what I like about these is that I can normally get a direct flight or can wait if they lose my luggage. Airport shuttles exist from Pittsburgh airport to Pennsic Gate (around \$150US/person/way or there are some good prices for ubers). Johanna was able to get a SCA person who knew pennsic as her Uber driver and was willing to wait for security to escort them down to our camp. This is useful because Kingdom of Avacal and Populace of Avacal encampments are about 1 mile (yes I did say a mile) from Gate/Troll.

Q: A tent? A sleeping bag? How do I get that there?

A: We may have someone driving from here to Pennsic and looking to take some people's gear. However, there's other ways. We have a few tent rental companies that will put them up and take them down for you.

Yes, period style tents are cool but lots and lots of people camp with regular camping gear. Last year, Johanna preordered a tent and sleeping bag at a local Walmart (her uber actually took her there) and used it for the two weeks. She donated them to the paladin cupboard who then takes tents, sleeping bags, cots, etc for the homeless of the area. If you have a failure, Coopers store often has some basic things that can help you.

Q: How about RV Camping? We could rent one right?

A: At this point, RV Camping is restricted and normally is completely booked by mid January. Please do not think you can get away with this. At this point, plan to be on site with a tent or in a hotel offsite.

Q: What does pre-registration mean? How does it work for Avacal?

A: Avacal has a standard allotment for Pennsic at 7000 SFT as the "Kingdom of Avacal" which is enough for 15 people and kingdom/common space that is needed for royal activities. Once we get to 15 people, the camp will close at that size. We have also registered the "Populace of Avacal" with the first preference to be in the same block as "Kingdom of Avacal". Space is allocated by the number of people who pre-reg and you get 250 sq ft per person. Based on the size of the camp, Pennsic land will assign the "Populace of Avacal" encampment using the best "tetris fit" technique. Our second, third and fourth choices are also really close.

Pre-reg closes on Jun 11 for online registration (easiest). However, I would prefer if you could decide if you are going by Victoria Day weekend so we can get some preliminary numbers. You don't have pre-reg for the full two weeks if you're not sure if you are going for that long. I usually pre-reg for 1 week so my camp gets the 250 sq ft and pay the difference at Gate/Troll.

Q: How much does Pennsic cost? Gate Fees?

A: Pennsic itself is not terribly expensive. Pre-registration deposit is \$175US for one week and \$215US for two weeks. The rate starts when you arrive and not for how long you are there. So, if you arrive anywhere between July 28 to August 3, then you need to pay the two week fee even if you go home after one week. Check out the cool calculator on the Cooper's website at https://www.cooperslake.com/prereg/account/gatefees.php to see how your pre-registration deposit can be applied and how your membership can save you money.

Society Officer Opening - Marshall

The Marshal of the Society's area of authority is all martial and related activities practiced in the Society, both those described by the handbooks approved for the office and proposed as additions to those handbooks (experimental activities). The Marshal will work to encourage the participation of all in the Society's martial activities, and strive to expand and improve those activities for the benefit of the Society and its members.

The duties of the office include:

• Directing the Earl Marshals of the Kingdoms in matters concerning the supervision of martial and related activities at Society events

• Overseeing the manner and conduct of duties of all marshals throughout the Society

• Working to promote and improve the safety of the Society's martial activities

Working with the Minister of Arts and Sciences to encourage research in armor, weapons, and the practice of historical martial arts

Day-to-day work of the position entails administering the marshallate activities of the Society and coordinating the activities of the Kingdom Earl Marshals, and of all Deputy Society Marshals for the individual disciplines. Reports are required to be filed quarterly to the Board summarizing the martial activities of the Society. The Society Marshal is also responsible for maintaining communications with the Kingdom Earl Marshals. These activities specifically include:

· Warranting (with the Crown) Earl Marshals for twenty kingdoms

· Warranting (with the Board) Deputy Society Marshals for Armored, Rapier, and Youth Combat, Combat Archery, Siege Weapons, Equestrian, Rebated Steel, and Target Archery and Thrown Weapons, and other deputies as needed

• Supporting the Earl Marshals when they have questions, and advising them as necessary

• Resolving disputes among marshals, and between marshals and the Crown

 \cdot Serving as the point of appeal for sanctions applied by the Earl Marshals

• Encouraging the expansion of martial activities in the Society by the wise revision of the marshallate's documents and by conducting experiments with new materials and activities

The successful candidate must be well versed in administrative techniques, prob-

lem solving, and interpersonal communications. The successful candidate will possess:

Knowledge of marshallate policy, rules, and procedures

Knowledge of the traditions of the Society Extensive negotiation skills and experience in resolving differences

The ability to set aside all preferences and biases for the betterment of all

Patience in the face of emotion, advocacy and provocation

Expertise in the use of modern communications media, messaging, e-mail and telephone

The ability and availability to travel as necessary
