CORPORATE POLICY XIX. DELEGATION OF INVESTMENT AUTHORITY POLICY

he Board of Directors is currently considering the following addition to the SCA's Corporate Policy:

XIX. Delegation of Investment Authority Policy

The Board shall ensure that fiduciary responsibilities concerning the proper management of SCA, Inc.'s institutional funds are fulfilled through appropriate investment structure, internal and external management, and portfolio performance consistent with all policies and procedures. Based on the advice and recommendations of the Treasurer and its external fund manager(s), the Board shall approve investment policies and objectives that reflect the long-term investment-risk orientation appropriate to the organization. The Board may, at its sole discretion, create or eliminate committee(s) to advise the Board in furthering its duties and may select, appoint, and remove members thereto.

The Board hereby delegates supervisory responsibility for the management of its invested funds to the Corporate Treasurer, subject to the financial limitations specified in Corpora, as noted below:

- determine that institutional funds are prudently and effectively managed with the assistance of management and any necessary investment consultants and/or other outside professionals, if any. • recommend the retention and/or dismissal of investment consultants and/or other outside professionals.
- receive and review reports from management, investment consultants and/or other outside professionals, if any.
- periodically meet with management, investment consultants and/or other outside professionals management, investment consultants and/or other outside professionals.

- report to the Board (as needed) whether this policy, investment activities, risk management controls and processes continue to be consistent with meeting the goals and objectives set for the management of institutional funds.
- execute such investment transactions as are necessary to ensure that SCA, Inc.'s investment portfolio reflects the asset allocation, investment-risk orientation, or other direction regarding the investment portfolio as has been established by the Board.

Position Available – Marshal of the Society (Society Marshal)

he Marshal of the Society's area of authority is all martial and related activities practiced in the Society, both those described by the handbooks approved for the office and proposed as additions to those handbooks (experimental activities). The Marshal will work to encourage the participation of all in the Society's martial activities, and strive to expand and improve those activities for the benefit of the Society and its members.

The duties of the office include:

- Directing the Earl Marshals of the Kingdoms in matters concerning the supervision of martial and related activities at Society events
- Overseeing the manner and conduct of duties of all marshals throughout the Society
- Working to promote and improve the safety of the Society's martial activities
- Working with the Minister of Arts and Sciences to encourage research in armor, weapons, and the practice of historical martial arts
- Day-to-day work of the position entails administering the marshallate activities of the Society and coordinating the activities of the Kingdom Earl Marshals, and of all Deputy Society Marshals for the individual disciplines. Reports are required to be filed quarterly to the Board summarizing the martial activities of the Society. The Society Marshal is also responsible for maintaining communications with the Kingdom Earl Marshals. These activities specifically include:
- Warranting (with the Crown) Earl Marshals for twenty kingdoms
- Warranting (with the Board) Deputy Society Marshals for Armored, Rapier, and Youth Combat, Combat Archery, Siege Weapons, Equestrian, Rebated Steel, and Target Archery and Thrown Weapons, and other deputies as needed
- Supporting the Earl Marshals when they have questions, and advising them as necessary
- Resolving disputes among marshals, and between marshals and the Crown
- Serving as the point of appeal for sanctions applied by the Earl Marshals
- Encouraging the expansion of martial activities in the Society by the wise revision of the marshallate's documents and by conducting experiments with new materials and activities

The successful candidate must be well versed in administrative techniques, problem solving, and interpersonal communications. The successful candidate will possess:

Knowledge of marshallate policy, rules,

and procedures

- Knowledge of the traditions of the Society
- Extensive negotiation skills and experience in resolving differences
- The ability to set aside all preferences and biases for the betterment of all
- Patience in the face of emotion, advocacy and provocation
- Expertise in the use of modern communications media, messaging, e-mail and telephone
- The ability and availability to travel as necessary


Other than the basic duties described in our manuals, what do you see as this officer's role or what would you like to do in this role during your term if you are selected?

On May 11, 2023, Their Majesties, Hans and Ciar of the Kingdom of the West and Their Majesties Athanasios and Alianora of the Kingdom of AnTir have issued the sanction of Exile against Randolfo Pozos-Brewer, also known in the Society as Constantinus Puteolanus Germanicus. Exile from the Kingdom precludes engaging in any SCA activity in the Kingdom. This includes a ban on participation in officially recognized SCA social media sites, officially recognized SCA electronic email lists, and offi-

cially recognized SCA webpages. This sanction does not preclude participation in activities in other Kingdoms.

ne of the most prolific and wellrespected authors in the food history arena is Dr. Terence Scully. This month in Eat This Book we will explore his book, authored and illustrated with his wife

and son, "Early French Cookery: Sources, history, Original Recipes and Modern Adaptations" By Terence Scully, D. Eleanor Scully with illuminations by J. David Scully published by The University of Michigan Press, originally publish in 1995, second edition published by the University of Toronto Press in 2002.

"Early French Cookery" consists of an extensive Introduction, Ten Chapters, full of translated original recipes with the Scully's redactions, a section on Menu suggestions and meals, as well as an appendix and an index. The authors have not included a bibliography, but most of their other works include extensive ones and although this is often one of my go/no-go decisions on a book the lack of bibliography in this compendium should not create any hesitation. The work is based on extensive historical research. The great news is that as a cook of any skill level you can pick up this book and cook from it immediately. The many black and white illustrations in the book, drawn by J. David Scully, are done in a Medieval manuscript illumination style and add a bit of whimsy to this information dense, and delicious book.

The first 50 pages of "Early French Cookery" are made up of the very comprehensive Introduction which includes eight separate sections. The first section of the introduction is titled "Early French Cookery" and it speaks to the culinary traditions from Apicius and Anthimus through the Middle Ages. Section two details the three sources the work is based on. The Viandier of Taillevent, The Menagier de Paris and Chiquart's Du Fait De Cuisine – On cookery, are three of the most important early cookery books. The third section goes into Medieval Foods and Cookery – food stuffs and foods peculiar to Medieval France (Spices, colorants, sweeteners, fats and grease, grape products, etc.). The fourth section of the introduction, simply titled "Cookery", includes discussions on chopping and grinding, binding agents and cooking techniques, as well as food supply and preservation in Medieval France. In the fourth section we are treated to an examination of beverages, including wines beers and ciders. The fifth section, Kitchens and their physical features, along with the utensils you will find in them is an interesting view into Medieval cookery. Next, in the sixth section, the Scully's discuss the hall were foods were served and the banquets served in them. The seventh section outlines the roll of the cook and their assistants in the time period, and in the different social classes. And to complete out the Introduction we have a few pages on "Advice to the Newly Medieval Cook". This section outlines things to take into consideration, authenticity and adaptations to mention two, when you are starting down the road of medieval culinary exploration.

The bulk of the book, almost 250 pages consisting of 10 chapters, are filled with recipes for you to cook. These 10 chapters are organized in an accessible and modern manner for ease of use.

In Chapter One, titled, Standard Preparations, you will find spice powders, almond milk, breads etc. that you will use in the many of the other recipes. Chapter Two consists of Appetizers; Chapter Three,

is titled Sops and Soups. Chapter Four is completely dedicated to Sauces, a most important component to serve along-side the ubiquitous roast joint or roast poultry. Chapter five, six, seven, eight and nine are your modern style mains of meat, poultry, fish, egg and vegetable dishes. And to end the recipe chapters we have chapter ten, desserts. The totality of the book, with almost 100 recipes, not including variations, it is hard to choose one or two to highlight here. Instead of me recommending a recipe to try write me and let me know which ones you make. The final two parts of the book consist of a fairly comprehensive section on Menu Suggestions and Meals and an Appendix titled "A Day in the Life of Master Chiquart Amicz, Chef to the Duke of Savoy (1416 A.D.)" Both of these sections will widen your knowledge of Medieval French Cuisine.

Dr. Scully received his undergraduate degree in French from Oxford University. He received his Ph.D in French literature from Harvard.

His focus on French Medieval and Renaissance Food can be further explored in his first book "The Art of Cookery in the Middle Ages" and further investigated in "The Viandier of Taillevent" which is an academic, yet readable, comparison of all the existing manuscripts of Taillevent. He has also contributed to many academic journals, as well as being a guest speaker at numerous food and history conferences. Now retired from teaching Dr. Scully continues to research and write. Dr. D. Eleanor Scully is an art historian and scholar with a focus on Medieval and Renaissance Italian art of the 14th and 15th centuries. She holds a Ph.D from New York University in art history. I. David Scully is an artist who studied painting and illustration at the Rhode Island School

some point...and have been Royal Scribe several times. There really was no such thing as Royal Scribe prior to the Charter System. It became necessary to have someone deal with that aspect of a reign once it took root. Royal Scribe can be hands on or hands off...mainly what is needed is an administrator who is capable of organizing artists (which can occasionally seem like herding catz) for charter and scroll creations, distributing charters and collecting them for finishing (if needed) and preparing them for delivery to the Crown. None of that means one must be a scribe to fulfill the position.

It is preferable for a scribe/painter/ calligrapher who wishes to sign their work to do so either on an attached bit of paper or along the edge of the charter/scroll. NOT behind the art or calligraphy.
