CORPORATE POLICY XIX. DELEGATION OF INVESTMENT AUTHORITY POLICY

he Board of Directors is currently considering the following addition to the SCA's Corporate Policy:

XIX. Delegation of Investment Authority Policy

The Board shall ensure that fiduciary responsibilities concerning the proper management of SCA, Inc.'s institutional funds are fulfilled through appropriate investment structure, internal and external management, and portfolio performance consistent with all policies and procedures. Based on the advice and recommendations of the Treasurer and its external fund manager(s), the Board shall approve investment policies and objectives that reflect the long-term investment-risk orientation appropriate to the organization. The Board may, at its sole discretion, create or eliminate committee(s) to advise the Board in furthering its duties and may select, appoint, and remove members thereto.

The Board hereby delegates supervisory responsibility for the management of its invested funds to the Corporate Treasurer, subject to the financial limitations specified in Corpora, as noted below:

- determine that institutional funds are prudently and effectively managed with the assistance of management and any necessary investment consultants and/or other outside professionals, if any. • recommend the retention and/or dismissal of investment consultants and/or other outside professionals.
- receive and review reports from management, investment consultants and/or

other outside professionals, if any.

- periodically meet with management, investment consultants and/or other outside professionals management, investment consultants and/or other outside professionals.
- report to the Board (as needed) whether this policy, investment activities, risk management controls and processes continue to be consistent with meeting the goals and objectives set for the management of institutional funds.
- execute such investment transactions as are necessary to ensure that SCA, Inc.'s investment portfolio reflects the asset allocation, investment-risk orientation, or other direction regarding the investment portfolio as has been established by the Board.



ometimes, not very often, but sometimes, we are lucky enough to have a re-print of a classic food history book. This month "Eat This Book" explores one of these reprints. "Anglo-Saxon Food and Drink" By Ms. Ann Hagen (2010) published by Anglo Saxon Books. This book is a reprint of Ms. Hagen's 1994 "A Handbook of Anglo-Saxon Food: Processing and Consumption" and the 1995 edition of "A Second Handbook of Anglo-Saxon Food and Drink: Distribution and Consumption" in one volume. For many years these books were the only ones which addressed this time period in food history. "Hagen", as both are collectively known as, were the go-to books for any food after the Roman time period and before the 1100's. Since then a few books have come out addressing this era, but Ms. Hagen still has much to say, for us to learn from and many of the new books build on her shoulders.

"Anglo-Saxon Food and Drink" is not a cookbook, there are no cookbooks, at least as we think of them, from this time period and only few recipes scattered in letters, medical texts and other esoteric writings. In her



processes". Archeological evidence is also used and "is very valuable to supplement the evi-

dence from the literature", although Hagen says that before the 1980's "planet remains were rarely recorded unless they were in the form of

wood or nuts/stones/or charred/carbonized grains". Archeological food stuff is now also being analyzed chemically and fragile plant and food remains are now considered part of the record. Hagen also uses the remains of animals to support her study and human remains show much about diet. Hagen also uses secondary sources and the introduction goes into details regarding these sources. Both Primary and Secondary sources are cataloged in the extensive bibliography of twelve pages. "Anglo-Saxon Food and Drink" has a few illustrations scattered throughout the book, but sources are not noted and are generally unrelated to the discussion at hand.

In the 33 chapters in "Anglo-Saxon Food and Drink" Hagen focuses on specific crops, and food products such as: cereal crops, vegetables, herbs and fungi, fruits and nuts, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, poultry and eggs, wild animals and birds, honey, fish and mollusks. The book continues on and addresses: imported foods, ta-

booed food, provisions of a water supply and fermented drinks including beer, ale, wine and mead. Hagen's chapters on processing food includes discussions on: drying and milling grains, bread making, both leavened and unleavened, dairying, including fresh dairy products, butter, cheese, and dairy products uses as payment for rents and as remedies. Butchering, preservation and storage, including drying, smoking, pickling, and salting are also discussed. Chapter twenty dives head long into the "methods of cooking" including over fire and the different fuels used, fire making, the direct and indirect application of fire, as well as ovens. In this chapter Hagen also discuss kitchens, cooks, preparation, cooking methods, including cauldrons, pots, both soapstone and earthenware, and cooking in leather vessels. And we are treated to boiling and stewing techniques, broths, pottages, baking, desserts, cakes, biscuits and sauces.

Part three of "Anglo-Saxon Food and Drink" is entirely focused on the "distribution" of food with chapters on administration, measures, theft, monastic and religious households, town and home supplies as well as hospitality and charity. The final section, before the conclusion, is all about consumption. The first section is on meals and discusses times, composition, regional and seasonal variation, courses and

short introduction of only 5 pages Ms. Hagen says, "the intention of this synthesizing study is to bring together for the first time information from various primary and secondary sources in order to build up a composite picture of the production, processing, distribution and consumption of the food during the Anglo-Saxon period." And she does just that! We are given a detailed picture of the food stuff from the 5th to 11th centuries. How food was grown, processed, stored, consumed, cooked, etc. The introduction goes on to discuss the primary source materials she uses to fill out this study, "documentary and archaeological". Some of these sources are pure literary works from Anglo-Saxon literature. Others come from religious writings and laws and guild statues. This documentary evidence "is heavily weighted to the end of the Anglo-Saxon period". Other documentary evidence used are illustrations such as the Bayeux Tapestry and late Anglo-Saxon manuscripts "valuable for showing animals, equipment and agricultural

I've been drawing and painting since I was a child and doing calligraphy since I was a teenager. I suppose I first truly became a scribe in the SCA when I found the Barony of Madrone in 2013.

how did you become a scribe?

When I first discovered the SCA in Madrone, I saw that they had a monthly scribal night. I've always enjoyed painting and did calligraphy on and off for years. Scribal nights were the first social activity I joined in the SCA.

What do you enjoy most about being a scribe?

I enjoy the beauty of a fully completed charter or scroll. I love seeing people's reactions to receiving awards themselves or seeing others receive awards. I enjoy being able to give people awards that were created, at least in part, by someone they know.

have you ever held an office position as a Scribe?

I've been the Baronial Scribe for my local branch, Madrone. My job as a Baronial scribe was to ensure the Baron and Baroness had charters for their tenure (including designs, words, and calligraphy) as well as coordinating painting nights and custom scrolls. There's also some outreach and teaching involved because newcomers often come to Scribal nights. I've also been the Royal Scribe for three different reigns. The Royal Scribe is appointed by the Crown each reign to coordinate the

availability, preparation, and delivery of charters and original scrolls as planned by the Crown and Their Court Coordinator. It's a large job. The Royal Scribe's job duties are almost exactly the same as the Baronial Scribe's except on a Kingdom-level scale. Kingdom-level scale means that there is a higher volume of awards with more components to track for the different charters, and a shorter amount of time to deliver them. Their Majesties travel throughout the Kingdom (and maybe even outside the Kingdom) and recognize Their populace. Having exceptional communication between the Royal Court Coordinator, the Royal Scribe, and Their Majesties is absolutely essential to delivering the right awards to the right events.

What is your scribal pet peeve?

I don't like it when scribes don't take care of their supplies and tools. Clean your brushes gently and thoroughly, reshape the tips while they're wet, and lay them flat or stand them upright to dry where the tips aren't touching anything (in a cup or jar). Don't ever leave

your brushes sitting in • the water cup. Invest in your tools and even inexpensive ones will last much longer. Oh, spread clarity on the terms "charter" and

"scroll". A charter is a preprinted design. One person's artwork, plus one person's calligraphy combines to create a charter design that can be copied onto thick paper, distributed, and then painted in a multitude of ways by many people. Scrolls are 100% original - each one is hand-crafted and unique. They can be created by one person or by a team of people but they aren't meant to be reproduced.

Was there anyone that helped you along your scribal journey that you would like to acknowledge? If so, how did they influence you on this jour-


So many people have helped me, it would be impossible to name them all! Sarra the Brave taught me how to paint charters. Matilda Stoyle taught me to put care and thought into my color choices based on the time and place of the piece I'm working on and is THE living repository of detailed whitework patterns. Most recently, Gracia Abranel taught me how to use the Procreate app on my iPad to create charter and scroll designs charters, and do calligraphy. Learning this allowed me to significantly speed up the charter creation pro-

Do you have any special tips, tricks, or techniques that you use or have learned through your scribal journey?

I often use a lightbox or light table to avoid needing to draw guidelines on my paper. Recently, I've been using my tablet to practice calligraphy. If anyone has figured out a way to organize all the extra paper I seem to have lying around all the time, please let me know!

have you ever done an original award? If so, what did you learn though the process? Do

you have any advice you would pass on to someone new to original work?

I have done many originals over the years and I enjoy them! It's always an honor to be asked to do an original scroll and the projects are always fun because you can customize them much more than charters. The best advice I can pass along is to take detailed notes about the requirements. Check with the recipient about what they want, what they have in mind, look at inspiration together, ask them to approve the design if necessary, make sure you know when it's due, how it will get to the event, who needs to sign it (just the Crown? Black Lion?), talk to a herald sooner rather than later if you're planning to use heraldry or if the recipient wants a name that isn't exactly as it is in their OP entry. I think we wrote a list somewhere on the An Tir Scribes - Custom Scrolls Facebook Group.

What is your favorite Kingdom Award that you have painted, calligraphed, or designed?

It's so hard to choose just one! I've painted, calligraphed, and designed many awards. For the reign of Athos and Alianora, we had a charter design that I just loved painting. I rare-

ly paint a charter more than once (because I like variety), but I painted several Alimentum Vitae charters for that reign.

What is the best or most impactful piece of advice you have ever received through your scribal journey?

At the end of the project, only you will know if you made a mistake or not. Turn your mistakes into part of the artwork and most people will never know it wasn't meant to be that way. Some of the most beautiful things have come from what started as a "mistake".

Is there anything else that you would like to say or add as an An Tir Spotlight Scribe?

It's easy to get involved with scribal work at multiple levels and many people to meet who also enjoy these arts. There's a thriving community in An Tir and across the Known World. I encourage anyone who is interested, regardless of age or ability, to become part of the community!

drinks. The second section focuses on a critical part of any study on food and drink in Chris-

tian Europe, fasting. This section speaks to the reasons for fasting, the periods of fasts, the Lenten fast, and fasting by laymen, monastics, saints, for penance and the ritual of the fast. After fasting the section turns to feasting including the function and calendar of feasts, guild feasts, and a list of feasting activities to long to go into here, but which includes drunkenness, gluttony and entertainment. Hagen finishes this section with chapters on special regimens, shortages and diseases, and adulteration. In her conclusion Hagen speaks to the change of the (time) period, the role of women, and reviews the importance of many of the pervious sections and chapters. Please do not discount the extensive index the publisher has provided. It is a very detailed 33

Some reviews have said Ms. Hagen's writing is too academic and "smacks of a doctoral dissertation" and while that may be the case the writing, lay out and most importantly the content is extremely easy to engage with and these concerns should be ignored.
