

There are so many things happening at the moment. By the time you read this we have a new Crown, Flametree Ball will have been held in Adora, BordesCros will have run their Myths, Legends, and Tales event, and Aneala will be starting their Western Raids.

SCA Inc (US) has recently made changes to their list of greater officers. There will now be a Society level position of Chatelaine as a greater officer. This means that the Kingdom Hospitaller will now also become one of the greater offices. Changes to Kingdom Law to reflect this will be put out to commentary shortly.

There will also be a Society level greater officer for DEIB (Inclusivity). Once this officer is appointed

then Lochac will request applicants for a Kingdom DEIB officer. This will also be a greater officer, but without the requirement for any group officers.

There is one other thing I need to address. Recently, I was advised of a perception that some members of the SCA can be unsupportive to people who do not drink alcohol.

We treat all people who attend our events with the courtesy and chivalry required by our Code of Conduct. When offering drinks to people who do not drink alcohol, please remember that the reason someone chooses not to drink is private to them and varies from person to person. Their reasons are none of our business.



The Chronicler 's task is to record and archive all



SCANZ needs YOU!

As The SCANZ Committee is in the process of getting the AGM agenda organized. The AGM will be in the middle of July.

A key part of the AGM is finding a new SCANZ Inc Committee member

The current committee consists of Jacqui MacGregor-Pahl (Lady Yolande), Richard Goodwin (Master Richard d'Alllier), and Josie Welch (THL Joana de Bairros). The new committee member will be replacing Richard Goodwin.

Committee members typically serve for 3 years, with the first year as Secretary, then a year as Chair, then the final year as vice-chair. The committee is responsible for the overall governance of the SCA in NZ, including:

- Ensuring our policies and procedures comply with New Zealand legislation and regulations
- Providing the required administrative infrastructure underpinning the SCA branches in NZ is in place and functioning
- Providing support and systems to the SCA branches in NZ as required.
- Liasing with Kingdom Officers, primarily the Kingdom Seneschal, on matters that require Committee-level input, such as ratifying changes to officer handbooks and combat rules.
- Being the point of final appeal for sanctions
- Liasing with SCA Australia Ltd Board of Directors and SCA Inc (US) Board of Directors as needed on items of mutual interest

The actual workload varies from month to month, however an average month would involve

between 1-2 hours for the monthly committee meeting, and 2-4 hours of other time working individually or jointly on committee tasks and projects.

To be eligible to be nominated as a committee me mber you must:

- Be qualified to be an officer of an incorporated society in New Zealand, which includes o Being at least 16 years of age
- o Not an undischarged bankrupt or disqualified from being an officer in various Acts
- o Not convicted of various offices typically involving dishonesty
- Be a current member of SCANZ Inc.

If there is only one nomination, that nominee will be automatically appointed and notification will be made at the AGM. If there are multiple nominees then a vote will be called as part of the AGM and the nominee with the most votes shall be appointed.

If you would like to nominate yourself for the committee, please send your nomination to committee@sca.org.nz. Please include some information about yourself and any information you would like to have published as part of the AGM agenda should a vote be required.

Nominations will be therefore close at 5:00pm on Saturday 29th June.


All adult SCA members should have received an email today (24 May 2024). Poll responses are anonymous, but access to the poll is
