
Courtesan Guild of Ealdormere

Ealdormere Academy of Defence

The Ealdormere Academy is an organization of fencers, authorized by charter by the hand of their serene highnesses Edward and Rylyn, Prince and Princess of the Principality of Ealdormere in Sept AS 32. This autumn of AS 58, the charter marks its 25th anniversary.

As an organization it provides a structure for fencers to meet and share the joy of combat together: to test and improve their fencing skills, challenge themselves and each other, and to recognize their shared achievements. It's modelled on the historic schools of defense of 16th c London, where students were judged against criteria to achieve ranks in the fencing schools.

In Ealdormere the academy has 2 officers to keep it running: the Praeceptor (admin person) and the Proctor (research examiner). They're supported by all the current members who participate at challenges in the kingdom. Each Ealdormerian rank (Cadet, Scholar, Free Scholar, Provost, and Dean) has a series of requirements for weapons authorization and contributions to the fencing community.

To join or advance in rank, candidates must meet other members of the academy on the field for a fixed number of bouts, then hold the field against all comers for a minimum of 15 minutes.

Some ranks include a research component, whereby a candidate presents some research about the arts of defense to the academy Proctor. You can present research about any aspect of fencing: technique and skills, learning about historic weapons, about making clothing, protective kit, weapons or accessories. The presentation format is pretty open: written, blogged, a video or class, or other way of sharing what you've learned with the fencers of Ealdormere.

This summer we held the first challenges in several years at Fruits of our Labours, Murder Melee, and War of the Trilliums and celebrated 9 new Cadets and 1 new Dean joining our ranks. At Trillium war, we also held a symposium to discuss the current charter, and how we could revise it to better meet the needs of the fencing community in our kingdom today. We're especially interested in meeting the stated Society goals for diversity, equality and inclusion in the fencing community.



Trillium Exchange

For over ten years (with a two-year break during the plague years), Trillium Exchange has been matching up the artisans of Ealdormere to create surprise gifts for each other. Participants usually say they get so wrapped up in the plotting and planning that they almost forget they'll be receiving a surprise gift as well! It works a little like a Secret Santa exchange. Swaps take place one or two times a year. Each swap is run by a volunteer admin, who determines the theme (if any) and timelines, makes the matches, and manages the progress check-ins. The admin(s) are the only people who know who the matches are.

Participants fill out a Google form regarding themselves and their likes/dislikes, as well as what kinds of things they are willing to create and a commitment to deliver a gift by a set deadline (usually 4-6 months). The admins then match each recipient up with an artisan and provides them with the information submitted by their recipient (as well as being a go-between in case further information is needed). The matches are usually not reciprocal, so the person you make for and who makes for you will be different. Generally speaking, there is a limit of \$25 to buy new supplies, but artisans are permitted to use stash. The admins also often recruit extra artisans to be on standby in case someone needs to drop out. Artisans at all skill/experience levels are encouraged to join, but they should feel confident enough in their own abilities to gift one of their works to another artisan. The gifts should be substantially the work of the artisan (rather, than, for instance, a chance to clear out your SCA jewellery box or purchasing a gift from a merchant.)

We have a Facebook group (Trillium Exchange - https://www.facebook.com/groups/142642069270903) where announcements about upcoming swaps are usually made and photos shared of projects. You do not have to join one of the exchanges to join the group -- if you just want to observe the amazing projects people make, you're new and want to see how things work, or you're too busy or otherwise engaged, you are welcome to join the page to find out more. If enabling others is your thing, you might sign up as an admin and be the only person who knows who's got whose name. You do not need to be on Facebook to participate. Information about upcoming swaps will also be posted to the Ealdormere Discord server.

White Wolf Fian

Members of the Fian challenge themselves with projects that will expand their skills and deepen their knowledge of medieval crafts by creating "period" objects using historically-appropriate tools and techniques. Each challenge must be of at least intermediate difficulty, and members have up to a year to complete their work. If successful, they will represent the Order for three years, after which they must complete another challenge.

Membership in the Order carries no rank, and bears no badge, so that members of the Fian can focus on the development of their art and abilities without regard for social precedence.
