*Astrið Suðreying. Badge. Per pale Or and azure, a bee counterchanged.

*Birna Bisadottir. Name and device. Or, a phoenix facing to sinister gules and on a chief vert a bear couchant contourny argent.

*Clifford Ascheburner. Badge. (Fieldless) A talbot sejant gules charged on the shoulder with an ibis's head coupé contourny argent.

*Edda Oddadottir. Name and device. Per pale Or and vert, a brown bull's head cabossed proper armed argent.

*Erlendr Tryggvason. Badge. Per fess azure and vert, a talbot sejant erect and in chief three loaves of bread Or.

*Isabella Milia de Fiori. Name and device. Per bend sinister Or and purple, a butterfly and a cherry blossom counterchanged.

*Ralph Ermin. Name and device. Argent, a stoat rampant to sinister purple. Nice cant!

*Ysabeau Chanteuse and Diccon Short Hand. Joint badge. (Fieldless) Within and conjoined to a stringless harp an owl's head erased affronty vert.

Management and delegation of award scroll production.

Creation and supply of AoA promissory writs for the Crown.

Management of the scribal database, scribal handbook, Provost handbook and College of Scribes website (a work in progress).
