PATRON MEMBERSHIP - CORPORA COMMENTARY REQUEST

As part of the upcoming addition of a Patron membership, we invite you to provide commentary on the language changes in Corpora that this update will require. This commentary will assist the Board in forming further decisions relevant to its consideration of this matter.

What is the Patron Membership?

It is a membership tier that offers the option of a greater financial contribution to the organisation. Many non-profit organisations offer tiers of membership.

What is the proposed cost of a patron mem-

The proposed cost of the patron membership is \$150 a year.

Is it linked to titles or in game recognition? No. Some Kingdoms require paid annual memberships rather than an event membership (non member rate) for awards but this is not a Society wide requirement.

Is it mandatory?

No.

Who asked for it?

The Corporate Office has received feedback from members at times that this is an option people would like available.

What are the benefits of a Patron membership? The main benefit is knowing that you are contributing to the ongoing administrative functioning of the Society in a way that you prefer. The organisation is providing a small range of options as a gesture of its appreciation for your

Commentary regarding this proposed Corpora change must be received by the Board no later than May 3, 2024.

Add #6 to Corporate Policies below. In bold. Corporate Policies, I.B, 1-4—Membership Types-Non-Statutory Members:

B. Non-Statutory Members

The Board of Directors has designated the following categories of advisory membership. Such advisory members are not members within the meaning of Section 5056 of the California Corporations Code. California law supports the SCA's use of the terms "member" and "membership" in the common English

meaning, referring to persons who have paid to be associated with the organization.

- 1. Sustaining Membership conveys eligibility to hold office in the SCA, a subscription to a Kingdom newsletter, the option to subscribe to other Corporate publications, and any other privileges designated by the SCA or its subdivisions as accruing to members of the SCA. This type of membership is considered a subscribing membership.
- 2. International Membership conveys the privileges of Section I.B.1. This membership type is available only in locations outside the United States which are part of the SCA, Inc., and not subject to an affiliate corporation. This type of membership is considered a subscribing membership.
- 3. Associate Membership conveys eligibility to hold office in the SCA, except where other membership categories are required Governing Documents. Associate membership also entitles the holder to any privileges designated by the SCA or its subdivisions as accruing to members of the SCA, except where another membership type is specifically required by the organization defining the privilege. This type of membership is not considered a subscribing membership.
- 4. Family Membership extends the privileges of Section I.B.1 to one additional adult and any children aged 21 or younger who live at the same physical address as a member defined in paragraphs B.1 - B.2 of this Article. This type of membership is not considered a subscribing membership.
- 5. Institutional Membership allows a library or school to subscribe to Tournaments Illuminated and The Compleat Anachronist without acquiring the regional newsletter, and without any of the other privileges of membership. The Board reserves the right to determine whether or not a given organization qualifies for this membership type
- 6. Patron Membership conveys all privileges of 1.B.1. along with additional privileges as designated by the SCA.

BOARD ANNOUNCEMENTS ~ OMNIBUS PROPOSAL

Currently approximately 8000 people around the Knowne World actively participate in target archery, combat archery, siege weapons, thrown weapons and equestrian martial activities. While no ultimate decision has yet been made the Board believes that a proposal of a path to peerage for these individuals is worthy of deep consideration.

Having received advice from the Peerage Committee, Directors have discussed the matter and following some minor amendments to language which align the proposed draft of Corpora wording to the existing patent orders, the Board feels that the proposal has matured to the point where commentary on the proposed Corpora wording from members is requested. This commentary will assist the Board in forming further decisions relevant to its consideration of this matter.

The draft Corpora language approved for commentary is:

VIII.A.4:

e. The Order of <Name>

(i) Members of the Order of <Name> may choose to swear fealty but are not required to do so. The candidate must have attained the standard of excellence in skill and/or knowledge equal to that of their prospective peers in a pre-17th century martial pursuit as practiced in the SCA, including, and limited to, target archery, combat archery, thrown weapons, equestrian activities, and siege engineers. The candidate must have applied this skill and/or knowledge for the instruction of members and service to the kingdom to an

extent above and beyond that normally expected of members of the Society.

- (ii) The duties of the members of the order are as follows:
- (a) To set an example of courtesy and chival-rous conduct on and off the field of honor.
- (b) To respect the Crown of the kingdom; to support and uphold the laws of the kingdom and Corpora.
- (c) If in fealty, to support and uphold the Crown of their kingdom.
- (d) To enrich the kingdom by sharing their knowledge and skills.
- (e) To enhance the renown and defend the honor of the peer's Lady or Lord.
- (f) To advise the Crown on the advancement of candidates for the Order of <Name>.

(other sections re-numbered as needed)
Knowing exactly what the people who work, study, and play in the Society want a potential new peerage to achieve and do will be key to moving forward in this discussion. The Board welcomes any additional context that people feel may be of use to the discussion.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEMBERSHIP PRICE INCREASE

The Society for Creative Anachronism, Inc. (SCA, Inc.) is announcing an increase in membership fees and non-member registration fees for events.

This decision comes after careful consideration and extensive discussion among the Board of Directors, office staff, and Corporate officers. The effects of inflation across all sectors of operation, as well as other factors impacting the organization's operational costs, including insurance premiums, legal expenses, and general business expenses, necessitated a comprehensive review of membership rates.

Annual membership fees have not been adjusted in over a dozen years, and non-member registration fees have not increased in over 15 years.

In response to the evolving financial environment, the organization streamlined operations during the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic and significantly reduced corporate expenditures. The relocation of the office to San Jose, CA resulted in an annual savings of over \$35,000, and upgrades to software and CRM systems have netted a further savings of over \$100,000 annually. While membership numbers have rebounded post-pandemic, operational costs continue to rise.

SCA, Inc. Corporate is solely funded by membership fees, including the Non-Member Registration fee, and does not currently seek operational funds from its Kingdoms or subsidiary organizations, including those overseeing Pennsic and Gulf Wars.

At the January 2024 meeting of the Board of Directors, the Board approved the following changes, effective February 15, 2024: Raise the Sustaining membership price from \$45 a year to \$55 a year (This represents an \$0.83 cents per-month increase over the previous monthly rate.)

Raise the Associate membership price from \$30 to \$40 a year. (This represents an \$0.83 cents per-month increase over the previous monthly rate.)

Raise the Family membership price from \$10 a year to \$15 a year, per person. (This represents an \$0.42 cents per-month increase over the previous monthly rate.)

No changes to Canadian or International memberships have been announced at this time.

Note: this change will take effect for all renewal transactions processed on or after February 15, 2024. Renewal transactions prior to that date will be processed at the previous rate,

regardless of membership expiration date. The Board also approved the following changes to Non-Member Registration fees, effective April 1, 2024:

Raise the Non-Member Registration Fee from \$5 to \$10 per event. As always, this only applies whenever there is an actual event fee charged.

Both Sustaining and International Membership allow subscriptions to printed publications, as well as the ability to add Family memberships. It should be noted that these increases remain less than the cumulative U.S. inflation increase of 36.5% which has occurred since 2011. (Data calculated using the US Inflation Calculator)

SCA, Inc. emphasizes its commitment to transparency and sustaining a vibrant community. These fee adjustments aim to ensure the organization's fiscal health, support ambitious initiatives in 2024 and beyond, and keep the Knowne World thriving and dreaming for years to come.



What is your SCA name?

Duvessa of Movilla

From long have you been a scribe?

As long as I have been in the SCA so close to 26 years

And someone gets a special something that is theirs.

have you ever held an office position as a Scribe?

Yes, couple of times. I was an officer whose job was to get charters and scrolls all over the kingdom. In doing so I had my husband, Ulf the Wanderer, make special wooden scribal boxes for transport. It made it easier to just pack them in there and hand them off without worrying about damages. They just needed to make it back eventually. I didn't specify make it back to ME, just make it back to be filled by kingdom principality or baronial scribes. This was about 7 years ago we started doing this. This past Egils the Kingdom court coordinator was using one of the boxes, I recognized it because it had my red wolf on it. It gave me a warm fuzzy.

What is your scribal pet peeve?

When someone turns something in and it's put away as "not good enough". One of My favorite scrolls that I have hanging up in my house is my husband's AOA that was made by someone who it was their very first attempt. It's not perfect but it's still this big glorious

they don't know. Sure it may not be perfect. Guess what I have actual medieval manuscripts, some of them are hecka ugly.

Flow did you become a scribe?

I was in Midrealm where all scrolls are originals and we had a need to fill a chest full of scrolls. They could be simple with just a fancy A for an AOA or anything. So our shire did scribal night assembly line and worked with someone who worked in a museum doing preservation and she taught us the how-to of scroll making and desig

What do you enjoy most about being a scribe?

It's an art form that is completely free form. There is absolutely no set in stone design elements. You can have a rabbit riding a snail, a burning tower, tiny roses or giant palm leaves. You can use any medium stone, plaster even cake. Mistakes can be covered up and become part of the design and no one will ever know.

Was there anyone what helped you along your scribal journey that you would like to acknowledge?

Wow so many many people. If I wrote out a list it would be the size of a dictionary. Fortune helped me with getting the mixture right for paint on charters because the paper is different. Gwyneth with paper size. Alicia with calligraphy. Tallisin with how to make ink. And many others of nibs pens colors.

Do you have any special tips, tricks, or techniques that you

use or have learned through your scribal journey?


Always draft everything on onion paper first then lay it on a light box on top of the paper you're going to be using. Then reverse it and use a 2.0 pencil. Use the white erasers. Gold and silver guiding can be faked with mica powder and gum Arabic in small spots. Don't be afraid of color. And if you mess up, cat paws are a great cover up. And nothing beats real sheep vellum to work on.

have you ever done an original award? If so, what did you learn though the process? Do you have any advice you would pass on to someone new to original work?

Yes. The veterans awards that were created during the reign of Astrid and Vic. Not just an original design but a whole brand new thing. I had to contact the military department for Canada and the US to get approved heraldry and colors. There were specific things that were allowed to be used and absolutely could not be used. The colors had to be done a specific way and absolutely not waiver. When we sent the charters out we had to tell other scribes do not be creative with these at all.

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hen thoughts of Byzantium come to mind perhaps you think of the Emperor Constantine the Great, his conversion to Christianity and the start of the Orthodox church. Or maybe images of dazzling and detailed jeweled mosaics of Justinian and Theodora flickering in the candle light are the images you see. Or do you think of Byzantium's place at the cross roads of the silk road trading in aromatic spices, elegant fabrics and so many special products coming and going from the far east. But what about the food? What did the Royals of this great Empire eat? Where did their food traditions come from? In "Tastes of Byzantium: The Cuisine of a Legendary Empire", Tauris Parke, 2010, Andrew Dalby answers these and many other questions we have around the food and food ways of this important Empire and culture. Many scholars consider the Byzantine Empire the eastern continuation of the Roman Empire. Byzantium continued the Roman legal and institutional traditions, as well as the cultural and scientific structures. Andrew Dalby makes the case that the food and food ways of Byzantium also mirrors the ancient world as it mixes "the spices of the Romans, with seafood and simple local foods of the Aegean and Greek world."

Unfortunately, as Dalby says in the preface to the book, "No single source can serve as our guide. There is no recipe book like the Latin Apicius" which the Ancient Roman's brought down through the centuries. However, Dalby relies on multiple sources to bring the mosaic

of Byzantine food into focus. He consults "literary works (e.g. history, poetry, letters) and technical texts (e.g. pharmacology, dietetics)", as well as newly discovered sources on monastic food, a dietary calendar, ancient writers on food, such as Cato, Archestratus, etc. and other sources from throughout the region and time period. In "Tastes of Byzantium" Andrew Dalby illuminates for us the who, what, where, when, why and how the people of the Byzantine Empire feasted. The book is divided into eight chapters. The first chapter, "An Introduction to Byzantium", sets the context the food exists in. We are regaled by the history of the Empire. He includes an excellent chronological chart of the Emperors and Empresses of Byzantium. Dalby also writes about the "Peoples, Languages and 'ethnic foods' of Constantinople" and the influence of the "Greeks and others" who were both brought their food traditions into and Byzantium and were influenced by it. The next chapter, "Tastes and Smells of the City", weaves a delicious and sensuous tapestry of the most important city in the empire. The spices, the seafood, the calendar and how it impacts the food, and most critically, the humoral theories, which impacted all aspects of life in the middle ages. Being at the apex of the silk road the

complete without Constantinople". "Tastes of Byzantium" continues with chap-

book would be in-

ters four and five titled "Water and Wine, Monks and Travelers" and "Rulers of the World". Chapter 6 is a very important chapter that outlines "The Texts" from the time period used in the book. These four texts, "The Eight Flavors", the "Categories of Foods", the "Humoral and Dietary Qualities of Foods" and "A dietary Calendar" are "short handbooks" intended for physicians, the wealthy and the those preparing food. Translated into English these books are filled with important information about the food in the Byzantine period. Chapter seven, "Instructions and Recipes", is a short chapter which includes a "few recipes (that) have been selected because they are clearly linked to Byzantine Constantinople". The simple recipe for a sauce combining "two parts honey to one-part vinegar" which you dip the meat of suckling pig in sounds delicious. Smoked sausages, called "Loukanika" in

Byzantium can be found in Apicius under the

recipe for "Lucanica" sausages. These sausag-

es, which the recipe tells us to "stuff into intestines and hang in the smoke" are spiced with "crushed pepper, cumin, savory, rue, parsley, mixed herbs, bay berries, (and) fish sauce". Also included are "five recipes for table olives". I think I have a project for the next time olives are ready to harvest! There are also recipes for bread, 12 spiced wines, an egg dish and one for making "Garos" or fish sauce. The final chapter, "A Phrase-Book of Byzantine Foods and Aromas" is not only an exceptional piece of research, but will be a valuable resource for other food historians to use in their own research. It will help to further the field in many ways. The phrase book is organized in alphabetical order starting with the word "Agelada, cow, Bos Taurus" and then cites the sources the word is found in. There are hundreds of entries all following the word and citation standard. Bravo Andrew Dalby! As in all of Andrew Dalby's books he includes an extensive bibliography for those who would like to explore the topic further. This bibliog~ raphy has two different sections. The first section includes all the works used to create the phrase book both in Greek and then in other languages. This section is followed by a 10-

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chapter three, the "Foods and Markets of Eat This Book Constantinople"

Canada has to be red maple leaf with gold veins and white and red knotwork. US has to have the shield be exactly this order of red and white with true blue with red and white knotwork. The wording was crafted with what Her Majesty wanted with additional input from the military department of veteran affairs. So my advice would be, depending on what it is, get as much info as you can so that you can make sure that anyone receiving an award can display it with honor. Anyone outside the SCA can recognize it's done properly if it's touching any official things beyond us. And always be respectful. Take your time and don't just do the Eat This Book thing to get it done.

What is your favorite Kingdom Award that you have painted. calligraphed, or designed? Why is that your favorite?

All of the children's awards. Because it's going to be the first artwork a kid gets. It's theirs. I get to add things to it like hidden items like a where's Waldo that I can't do with some of the other things. You know that no matter what happens in that kids life, that piece of paper they will hold onto because this group of grownups said you are important to all of us. Not because of grades, or sports but because you make our game better for us by being here with us and you are one of us.

What is the best or most impactful piece of advice you have ever received through your scribal journey?

Pay attention to which cup is the water cup and don't drink it.

Is there anything that you would say to your younger scribal self just starting out on this path?

Don't buy ALL the things. You just need black white red and blue and yellow.
