




This deputy would ideally be able to communicate well, know & recognise many people across the NZ groups, and know how social media works.

Greetings Lochac,

This is a periodic reminder to all the following gentles:

- Crown and Landed Baronages
- Kingdom officers and group Seneschals
- Other group officers, especially those with deputies or downlines, i.e. people who report to them
- Certain officials of SCA Ltd or SCANZ

Thanks to The Regnumator, you all have Special powers! That's because, when you log in to your country's Registry (registry.sca.org.au or registry.sca.org.nz), you'll find "Officer functions" and "Reports" menus, which give you useful admin powers and very helpful information.

When you select either menu, you'll see still more options. The precise details will depend on what role (s) you're holding at present. For example, when selecting Officer functions, everyone sees "My own warrants", which allows you to manage how you are listed in Regnum entries, and how you may be contacted.

Seneschals and certain other officers will see a lot more, including: Search Members, Search Officers, Manage Warrants - and even a link to the Appointmentor, which will save you oodles of time when you need to advertise for a successor.

So: if you hold one of the roles or offices noted above, please make a point of logging into Registry and having a little explore. It should be a rewarding experience.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusivity Spotlight

June 18th is the International Day for Countering Hate Speech.

While only its second year of observance by the UN, it is particularly relevant as technology and new methods of communication amplify and spread hate speech and misinformation. Avoiding misinformation and critical thought are essential parts of both digital literacy and historical research and recreation, and therefore have relevance in both the SCA and mundane world.

Countering hate speech is a year-round issue, but it's also pertinent that the USA - where the SCA was founded and the majority of its member base is - celebrates Pride Month in June. The Human Rights Campaign, has, in this same month, declared a state of emergency for LGBTQIA+ people in the US.
